Mayor Davis called the meeting to order at 7:28 P.M., and City Clerk Skaggs called the roll.

Present: Council Members Kalinowski, Harper, Rocha, Agopian and Mayor Davis

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pro Tem Harper led the Council and audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Attorney Nerland reported the City Council had been in Closed Session and gave the following report: **#1 CONFERENCE WITH LEGAL COUNSEL – EXISTING LITIGATION**, City of Antioch is prepared to act on a settlement agreement after the City of Pittsburg approves it and by a unanimous vote, the City Attorney was directed to report out of Closed Session.

PROCLAMATION

Driftwood Yacht Club Day and Make-A-Wish Day, October 6, 2012.

On motion by Councilmember Rocha, seconded by Councilmember Harper, the Council unanimously approved the Proclamation.

Councilmember Harper presented the proclamation to Commodore Michael Herrick and Diane Ivanicki representing *Driftwood Yacht Club Day and Make-a-Wish*, who thanked the City for their support and provided contact information.

ANNOUNCEMENTS OF CIVIC AND COMMUNITY EVENTS

Walter Ruehlig, representing the Knights of Columbus, thanked Mayor Davis, Councilmember Rocha, and Noel Pinto for attending the International Day of Peace Festival. He invited the community to attend a Blue Mass to honor Contra Costa County's first responders, at 10:30 A.M. on October 2, 2012 at St. Ignatius Church. He noted a luncheon following the event would be hosted by the Knights of Columbus. Contact information was provided.



Brittney Gougeon, representing Take Back Antioch, announced a fundraiser to repair and rebuild City Park would be held on September 29 and 30, 2012 at Uno Chicago Grill. She reported over \$1,500.00 in community donations had already been received.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Greg Enholm, Bay Point resident, provided a brief summary of his candidacy on the Contra Costa College Board. He requested the City invite the College District to make a presentation at a future Council meeting. Contact information was provided.

Alisea Burks, representing Learning Care Group and La Petite Academy, announced an Annual Harvest Festival to benefit the Make-A-Wish Foundation would be held from 1:00 P.M. – 4:00 P.M. on October 27, 2012 at 1350 E. Tregallas Road in Antioch. She noted donations for the event would be accepted.

Tom Trost, Bethel Island resident, reported he had been denied support from Antioch Historians regarding the historical significance of the Hickmont Canary property. He reviewed the historical findings and requested the Council's support and guidance to garner support from the Contra Costa Landmark Committee.

In response to Councilmember Agopian, Mr. Trost indicated he would forward him a copy of the denial letter from the Historical Society.

Councilmember Kalinowski stated that if Mr. Trost was willing to remove his house off of the moorings in the river, he would consider his request.

Pam Gabrielli, Antioch resident, reported on her attendance at the Jazz Festival, Coffee with the Cops, and Mayor's Debate. She spoke in support of diversifying the Antioch School District and planned business developments near future eBart stations.

Beverly Knight, Antioch resident, presented the Council with photos and spoke to recent vandalism that had occurred at City Park. She suggested the City implement an Adopt-A-Park Program, install "Do Not Litter" signage, and service the garbage cans on the weekends. She expressed concern regarding broken glass in the roadway and urged City Staff to address the situation.

Councilmember Kalinowski responded that the garbage issue would be addressed.

Councilmember Agopian suggested staff look into "Do Not Litter" signage.

Mayor Davis requested the Adopt-A-Park issue be placed on the next meeting agenda.

Chris Valenta, Antioch resident, reported his son had successfully graduated from the Special Education program. He suggested the City adopt an ordinance prohibiting the feeding of feral

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cats and utilize the large stack at the glass company as a camera location. He urged the City to stop construction of the eBART station and hold out for a BART facility at the Hillcrest location. He requested the City consider building a dog park.

Pastor Nicholas Alexander thanked Mayor Davis for attending the *Stop the Violence* rally and candlelight vigil for Maurice Wagner. He expressed concern for illegal activity occurring at "L" Street, Sycamore Drive, and Country Hills Park. He spoke to the need for more police presence in those areas. He requested the City's support for more youth programs and activities in Antioch.

Mayor Davis stated he would be working with Pastor Alexander to help address these problems with the property owners in the area.

Ken Lee spoke to the importance of emergency preparedness and provided a brief history of the City of Antioch as documented in a recently published book.

Sean Wright, Antioch Chamber of Commerce, announced an Economic Summit would be held from 8:30 A.M. – 1:30 P.M. on September 27, 2012 at the Antioch Prewett Park Community Center. Contact information was provided.

Shelia White reported she had worked with staff and the issue of the trash on Fulton Shipyard Road had successfully been addressed.

COUNCIL SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilmember Agopian stated he was encouraged by the outpouring of support from the community to rebuild City Park. He encouraged the fundraising efforts to include discussion for the installation of a security light/camera for the area.

Councilmember Rocha reported on her attendance at the *International Day of Peace* and the *Educational Foundation*. She noted Barbara Herendeen had been honored with a scholarship.

Councilmember Harper thanked Ms. Knight for her suggestion to implement an Adopt-A-Park program. He announced he would be attending the Economic Summit and encouraged everyone to attend. He reported on his attendance at the Falls Prevention Presentation at Dallas Ranch Commons.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Mayor Davis reported on his attendance at the *Blues Festival* and *Coastal Cleanup*. He encouraged all candidates to follow City Ordinances related to the placement of campaign signage.

Councilmember Harper announced there was a *Prescription Drug Take Back Event* at the Antioch Police Department from 10:00 A.M. – 2:00 P.M. on September 29, 2012.

On motion by Councilmember Harper, seconded by Councilmember Rocha, the City Council unanimously approved the Council Consent Calendar.

COUNCIL REGULAR AGENDA

2. EBART SYSTEM

Consultant for the City of Antioch, Victor Carniglia presented the staff report dated September 19, 2012 recommending the City Council motion to receive the presentation by BART staff on the next segment station opportunities for the eBART system, and that Council provide feedback to BART in relation to the City's concerns over the prospective Laurel Road Station site and the Lone Tree Way Station site as summarized in the staff report, as well as other comments/concerns from City Council. BART would also like some feedback from City Council members on possible official names for the "Hillcrest eBART Station".

Ellen Smith representing BART gave a brief overhead presentation of the phase 1 construction and next segment station opportunities for the BART System.

Discussion ensued regarding the station location and renaming with Councilmember Rocha supporting the Sand Creek Station location, Councilmembers Kalinowski, Harper, and Agopian supporting the Mokelumne Station location and Mayor Davis supporting a station located at either Sand Creek Road or Mokelumne. The Council unanimously supported renaming the "Hillcrest Avenue Station" as the "Antioch – Hillcrest Station".

Ms. Smith announced the Groundbreaking for Phase 3A and eBART would be held at 10:00 A.M. on October 5, 2012.

On motion by Councilmember Rocha, seconded by Councilmember Agopian, the Council unanimously received the presentation

3. UPDATE AND DISCUSSION OF THE STATUS OF ANTIOCH FERRY TERMINAL AND DISCUSSION AND DIRECTION ON "SHORT RANGE TRANSIT PLAN FOR FY2012 TO FY2021" PREPARED BY THE WATER EMERGENCY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (WETA)

Consultant for the City of Antioch, Victor Carniglia presented the staff report dated September 19, 2012 recommending the City Council motion to receive the presentation from City staff and discuss and provide staff direction on the status of the Antioch Ferry Terminal and the "Short Range Transit Plan for Fiscal Year 2012 to Fiscal Year 2021" prepared by the Water Emergency Transportation Authority (WETA).

City Manager Jakel discussed the process to date and recommended the City send a letter to the WETA Board, attend their meeting, and engage the Metropolitan Transportation Commission representatives and elected officials at the state level to advocate for a future Antioch terminal.

Councilmember Rocha voiced her support for engaging MTC Commissioners, Federal Glover, and Amy Worth to advocate on behalf of the City. She suggested a portion of the funding be set aside for a future project in Antioch.

Councilmember Agopian expressed concern for the process used to allocate funding and suggested the City send a letter to WETA, requesting that they retain an unallocated fund amount of approximately ten (10) percent, which would allow the City to work regionally for operational funding, to make the Antioch terminal a viable project.

Councilmember Harper stated an Antioch terminal was an opportunity to bring economic development to downtown. He questioned the appropriateness of considering legal action against the WETA Board.

In response to Councilmember Harper, Consultant for the City of Antioch, Victor Carniglia, stated he would attend the WETA Board meeting to advocate for additional time and unallocated funding and he would also be actively participating with MTC and working with Senator DeSaulnier's office. He felt those actions should take place, prior to the Council considering legal action.

City Attorney Nerland agreed there may be administrative and political avenues that may need to be considered for a more expedient way to reach a resolution. However, if the Council would like to place an item on a Closed Session agenda for further discussion, they could direct her to do so.

Sandra Kelly, representing the "C" Street Neighborhood Watch group and North Antioch Neighborhood Alliance, voiced their support for a ferry terminal in Antioch.

Kerry and Joy Motts, representing the Rivertown Preservation Society, voiced their support for whatever means necessary to delay or change the action by WETA and suggested the establishment of a committee to work on the issues presented in the Short Range Transit Plan.

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Dylan Howell, Antioch resident, encouraged the City to send a strongly worded letter and pursue all means necessary, to secure a ferry terminal for Antioch.

Sean Wright, Antioch Chamber of Commerce, reported there was regional support for a ferry terminal in Antioch.

Following discussion, Council consensus directed staff to send letters to the transportation agencies discussing the consequences of the short range transportation plan and advocating for a set-aside of unallocated funds for a Ferry Terminal in Antioch. Additionally, they noted a discussion in Closed Session regarding legal action, may become necessary.

Councilmember Kalinowski stated he felt it was important to stress the importance of a ferry terminal for providing supplies, services, and access to medical aid; in the event of an emergency.

City Manager Jakel stated communication with Contra Costa Transportation Authority, WETA, and MTC highlighting the consequences of the Short Range Transit Plan was critical. He recognized City Consultant Mike Bernick for his work on this issue and stated he would request his assistance in this matter. He noted any legal action would be the City's last resort.

On motion by Councilmember Kalinowski, seconded by Councilmember Harper, the Council unanimously received and filed the report.

4. APPROPRIATION OF EXPENDITURES FOR ENCUMBRANCES AND PROJECT BUDGETS OUTSTANDING AS OF JUNE 30, 2012 TO THE 2012/13 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET AND OTHER BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Finance Director Merchant presented the staff report dated September 17, 2012 recommending the City Council motion to adopt the resolution.

Councilmember Kalinowski requested staff agendize the budget amendment for the Wilbur Avenue sewer lines for the next Council meeting. He noted he would support a tentative approval based on the report given at that meeting.

Following discussion, the Council consensus supported hiring up to six (6) Community Service Officers, one (1) Code Enforcement Officer, and a Recreation Specialist position was authorized to be encumbered in the event the City is successful with grant funding. Additionally, they agreed the fiscal implications of a Lead Dispatch versus Dispatcher position should be discussed in further detail.

City Manager Jakel clarified the Code Enforcement Officer was a contract position therefore the added position would be in terms of a dollar amount allocated for additional services. In addition, he noted authorizing up to six (6) CSO positions would allow the flexibility for staff to report back to Council every 45 days with a recommendation; should budget projections change.

Councilmember Kalinowski discussed the importance of increasing revenue through a future tax measure.

Councilmember Agopian stated he also felt it was important to discuss ways to improve the City's revenues.

Councilmember Harper suggested the City turn the responsibility of paying utility bills over to landlords to provide the City with the ability to collect on defaulting bills and therefore increasing revenue. He suggested the City look at new technology and procedures to keep police officers out on the street.

RESOLUTION NO. 2012/61

On motion by Councilmember Kalinowski, seconded by Councilmember Harper, the Council unanimously approved the resolution with 1) The budget amendments as outlined in attachment C (with the exception of the sewer fund adjustment of \$600.000 which is tentative pending the upcoming report to Council), and 2) Funding one Code Enforcement Officer under the same contract model, 3) Authorize up to 6 Community Service Officers, 4) Authorize the City to look for grants that provide in-kind for a Recreation Specialist, 5) Police Department come back to Council with regards to the Dispatch position versus Supervisor.

5. UPDATE ON FULTON SHIPYARD BOAT RAMP

City Manager Jakel reported this item would be on the agenda for the Parks and Recreation Commission in October for a formal recommendation.

Mayor Davis and Councilmember Rocha reported they had met with the stakeholders who had suggested the City consider utilizing a yearly parking permit and installing a locked gate and security camera.

Councilmember Kalinowski stated he felt the stakeholders should be responsible for managing the parking lot and permitting process.

Mayor Davis clarified the intent was to have stakeholders managing the property.

Councilmember Agopian voiced his support for an annual pass scenario with the ability to automate the system in the future.

City Manager Jakel stated the private sector may be interested in investing in a card key entry system with security cameras.

Shelia White reported there had been no interest from the stakeholders to manage the facility however many people were willing to volunteer to help maintain the property. She stated to prevent criminal activity in the area, they suggested the City install a gate that could be opened during the day and locked at dusk. She noted there was wall on the property that could be used for advertising to generate funds for operations and maintenance. She suggested the City manage unlimited use permits for both boat ramp facilities.

Noel Pinto, Antioch resident, stated he supported keeping the Fulton Shipyard boat ramp open and expressed concern the Commission had discussed the issue for a year without making a recommendation to Council. He suggested promoting the waterfront to generate revenue. He offered to assist the Commission and form an oversight committee to resolve the issue.

Jim Boccio, Antioch resident, suggested the City consider monthly or annual passes in the form of a sticker be made available for purchase from the City for launching at either boat ramp. He noted loitering would be resolved with the installation of a gate and fence.

Mayor Davis requested this item return to Council in November.

6. CITY OF ANTIOCH AS SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE ANTIOCH DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

A. APPROVAL OF SUCCESSOR AGENCY WARRANTS

On motion by Councilmember Harper, seconded by Councilmember Agopian, the Council unanimously approved the warrants

PUBLIC COMMENTS – None

Ken Lee spoke in support for increased staffing in the Antioch Police Department and spoke to the importance of citizen involvement in deterring criminal activity.

STAFF COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Jakel reminded the community the Economic Summit would be held from 8:30 A.M. – 1:30 P.M. on September 27, 2012 at the Community Center and the Prescription Drug Take Back Event would be held at the Antioch Police Department from 10:00 A.M. – 2:00 P.M. on September 29, 2012. He reported a permanent box for the disposal of drugs for the lobby of the Antioch Police Department would be presented to the City at the event.

COUNCIL COMMUNICATIONS

Councilmember Agopian suggested the City invite the College District to make a presentation on their future expansion plans.

Mayor Davis reminded the community there would be a fundraiser for the rebuilding of City Park on September 29 and 30 2012 at Uno Chicago Grill He thanked Beverly Knight for adopting City Park and stated he had offered \$250.00 in reward money for information leading to the arrest of

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the persons responsible for the damage. He encouraged the community to donate to the reward fund and noted if that money was not awarded, he would be contributing it to the rebuilding efforts.

ADJOURNMENT

With no further business, Mayor Davis adjourned the meeting at 10:35 P.M. to the next regular Council meeting on October 9, 2012.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached resolution and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement or a substantially similar version between Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District and the City of Antioch pertaining to the West Antioch Creek Channel Improvement Project.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In 1993, the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) constructed channel improvements for West Antioch Creek that improved flood capacity, north of Eighth Street, to a 25-year level of protection. Limited resources at the time did not allow the channel improvements to extend south of Eighth Street.

In recent years, flooding of West Antioch Creek between Tenth Street and the San Joaquin River has become more chronic.

Staff is proposing to partner with the District to increase the level of flood protection along West Antioch Creek by undertaking some of the tasks that the District has been unable to complete, such as the environmental review and engaging the necessary consultants and contractors. This project will consist of constructing a new culvert and earthen channel system between Eighth Street and Tenth Street and desilting the existing earthen channel downstream to 200 feet north of the AT&SF railroad crossing. The project will provide a 25-year level of flood protection within this section of the creek. This is the maximum protection achievable without expanding the AT&SF railroad crossing. If additional funds can be secured, additional openings in the railroad trestles could be constructed to allow more flow under the railroad tracks.

The District is insisting that the City accept ownership and maintenance of the completed flood control improvements and indemnify the District from any claims, which the City has typically not done if the improvements are built to less than a 100-year level of flood protection. However, waiting for the District to fund and build such improvements would mean further significant delays in any flood protection improvements to this area.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

This agreement secures \$1,800,000 of Drainage Area 55 Impact Fees to be used for the design and construction of the West Antioch Creek Channel Improvements.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN CONTRA COSTA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT AND CITY OF ANTIOCH FOR DRAINAGE AREA 55, WEST ANTIOCH CREEK AT 10th STREET DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PROJECT NO. 7579-6D8399 CITY OF ANTIOCH P.W. NO. 201-6

This Agreement is entered into on the _____ day of _____, 2012 ("Effective Date"), between the CONTRA COSTA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, a flood control district organized under the laws of the State of California ("DISTRICT"), and the CITY OF ANTIOCH, a municipal corporation ("CITY").

Pursuant to the Contra Costa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Act, section 5, and the applicable provisions of the California Constitution and California Government Code, the parties to this Agreement mutually agree and promise as follows:

- 1. <u>Purpose and Scope of Work:</u> The DISTRICT adopted Drainage Area 55 in 1988 to provide needed drainage improvements within the CITY. In the past, DISTRICT and CITY have jointly and separately implemented portions of the Drainage Area 55 plan. The parties now wish to jointly improve the drainage located between approximately 10th Street and 200 feet downstream of the BNSF Railway. The purpose of this Agreement is to provide the following improvements to that portion of Drainage Area 55: box culvert improvements, open channel improvements, and sediment removal from the downstream channel constructed in 1993, depending on funding (the "PROJECT"). The City's involvement in the PROJECT shall not constitute precedence for CITY to accept other DISTRICT projects, in particular the City accepting ownership and maintenance of projects that are not designed to provide 100-year flood protection.
- 2. <u>Responsibilities of DISTRICT and CITY:</u>
 - A. DISTRICT shall perform the following activities for the PROJECT:
 - 1) Prepare preliminary engineering analyses, as needed, to allow CITY to select the configuration of the final design.
 - 2) Prepare the hydraulic analysis for the design report.
 - 3) Present the PROJECT and provide updates, upon request, to CITY Council.
 - 4) Conduct necessary studies in support of the East Contra Costa County Habitat Conservation Program ("HCP").
 - 5) Apply for take coverage through the HCP permit process and conduct any necessary negotiations with HCP.
 - 6) Secure an HCP permit(s).
 - 7) Coordinate closely with CITY's environmental consultant to minimize overlap in studies and efforts between CITY and DISTRICT.
 - 8) Review 35%, 65%, and 95% construction documents and provide feedback within three weeks of receipt of those documents.
 - 9) Acquire on behalf of CITY the necessary land rights, including any necessary temporary access rights, for the PROJECT. DISTRICT will provide these services after CITY obtains California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") clearance for the PROJECT, and determines what land rights are needed for the PROJECT. Prior to CEQA completion, DISTRICT will provide CITY with right of way consultation services.
 - 10) Transfer to CITY any newly- and previously-acquired right of way needed for the PROJECT.

- 11) Approve the 100% bid documents and provide written confirmation of same to CITY.
- 12) Support utility coordination and relocation efforts.
- 13) Support CITY's efforts to satisfy any requirements of CITY's Proposition 1E grant.
- 14) Perform surveying, materials testing, and construction inspection in conjunction with CITY. This task may be assumed by either party by mutual agreement.
- B. CITY shall perform the following activities for the PROJECT:
 - 1) Provide overall project management for delivery of the PROJECT.
 - 2) Review the analysis for the design report and provide feedback within three weeks of receipt.
 - 3) Provide community outreach for the PROJECT.
 - 4) Provide written confirmation to the DISTRICT as to the preferred configuration of culvert and open channel that will constitute the PROJECT.
 - 5) Conduct all necessary studies in support of CEQA and regulatory permits, including studies for the HCP permit if any studies are necessary. Submit draft CEQA document to District for review.
 - 6) Act as lead agency for the PROJECT, and obtain all permits, approvals, and entitlements necessary for the PROJECT (except for the HCP permit), and prepare and obtain CEQA clearance for the PROJECT.
 - 7) Provide final design and engineering plans, final contract plans, and final specifications for the PROJECT.
 - 8) Hire, manage, and oversee consultant to prepare plans, specifications, and estimates, and provide 35%, 65%, and 95% review sets to DISTRICT for comment.
 - 9) Prepare, send out, and implement all utility relocation notices and relocation agreements
 - 10) Designate a material disposal site for the PROJECT and obtain any necessary approvals or permits for that site.
 - 11) Support DISTRICT's real property acquisition effort.
 - 12) Accept ownership of parcels purchased by DISTRICT on behalf of the PROJECT.
 - 13) Maintain and desilt the open channel constructed downstream in 1993 to prepare for construction at the PROJECT limits.
 - 14) Initiate and manage efforts to establish sufficient funding sources to address any funding shortfalls for the PROJECT.
 - 15) Satisfy any requirements of the CITY's Proposition 1E grant.
 - 16) Advertise the PROJECT for public bid, and award a contract for construction.
 - 17) Administer the construction contract for the PROJECT.
 - 18) Consult with DISTRICT regarding any contract change orders for the PROJECT and provide DISTRICT with copies of contract change orders upon DISTRICT's request.
 - 19) Perform surveying, materials testing, and construction inspection in conjunction with DISTRICT. This task may be assumed by either party by mutual agreement.
 - 20) Accept the PROJECT work, after DISTRICT has determined that the work has been completed to DISTRICT's satisfaction.
 - 21) Provide reproducible, as-built drawings to DISTRICT upon PROJECT completion.

- 22) Act as a liaison with the public on behalf of DISTRICT and CITY, including but not limited to organizing any groundbreaking or ribbon cutting ceremonies and coordinating with Contra Costa County Fairgrounds and State of California regarding real property interests that may be necessary for the PROJECT.
- 23) Perform any mitigation monitoring work required for the PROJECT.
- 24) Own, operate, and maintain the resulting PROJECT infrastructure in perpetuity.

3. <u>Financial Responsibility:</u>

- A. The DISTRICT's financial contribution shall be limited to a maximum of \$1,800,000 of Drainage Area 55 ("DA 55") funds (Org 7579) and shall consist of, at the DISTRICT's sole discretion, any combination of in-house staff charges, outside consultant fees, costs to acquire property, HCP costs, or a cash contribution toward the PROJECT contract cost.
- B. Additionally, prior to CITY advertising the PROJECT and soliciting PROJECT design and construction bids, DISTRICT shall convey, and CITY shall accept, fee title to certain real property having Assessor's Parcel No. 074-130-050, which DISTRICT previously purchased for the PROJECT, the value of which shall not be deducted from the total in item 3.A, above.
- C. On a quarterly basis, DISTRICT shall report to CITY an accounting of expenditures to date against the balance of the committed DA 55 Funds.
- D. DISTRICT shall begin tracking and reporting the accounting of expenditures beginning on January 1, 2012, regardless of the date of execution of this Agreement.
- E. Once the PROJECT is ready to advertise for public bidding, DISTRICT will advise the CITY of the remaining DA 55 Funds balance that can be applied to the construction of the PROJECT.
- F. CITY has been awarded Proposition 1E grant funds from the State of California, and has additional local funds available for the PROJECT. CITY shall fund any and all PROJECT costs not otherwise paid for by DISTRICT with DA 55 Funds as described above.
- G. The parties shall provide strict accountability of any and all funds and shall report to each other all receipts and disbursements related to this Agreement upon request of the other party.

4. <u>Mutual Coordination:</u>

CITY and DISTRICT shall meet periodically to coordinate efforts and ensure PROJECT delivery success. At a minimum, the parties will meet:

- A. On or about the date that any offer(s) to purchase real property required for the PROJECT are made;
- B. On or about the PROJECT advertisement date; and
- C. On or about bid opening;

to determine and confirm the mutual interest in proceeding with PROJECT. If either CITY or DISTRICT does not wish to proceed with the PROJECT, the parties will follow the "Agreement Termination" procedure set forth in Section 8.

- 5. Insurance and Indemnification:
 - A. Types and Amounts of Insurance:

1. Design and Construction. For each contract for PROJECT-related design or construction work, CITY and DISTRICT shall require that each contractor and consultant, and its assigns, keep and maintain the following insurance policies that meet the following requirements: (1) workers' compensation insurance pursuant to state law; (2) commercial general liability insurance, including contractual liability (or blanket

contractual) coverage, owners' and contractors' protective coverage, and broad form property damage coverage, with a minimum single-limit coverage of \$2 million per occurrence; (3) builders' risk insurance in an amount equal to the construction contract amount, with a waiver of subrogation for CITY and DISTRICT, and naming CITY and DISTRICT as loss payees (applies to contractors only); (4) vehicle liability insurance with a minimum combined single-limit coverage of \$1,000,000 per occurrence; (5) professional liability (or errors and omissions) insurance, with policy limits of at least \$2,000,000 and a maximum deductible of \$25,000 (applies to consultants only) and (6) certificates of insurance, copies of policies, or endorsements evidencing the above insurance coverage.

2. Other Contractors and Consultants. For each contract for PROJECT-related work other than design and construction work, CITY and DISTRICT shall require that each contractor and consultant, and its assigns, keep and maintain the following insurance policies that meet the following requirements: (1) workers' compensation insurance coverage pursuant to state law; (2) commercial general liability policy with a combined single limit coverage of at least \$1,000,000, for all damages, including consequential damages, due to bodily injury, sickness or disease, or death of any person or damage to or destruction of any property, including loss thereof, arising from each occurrence; (3) vehicle liability insurance with a minimum combined single-limit coverage of \$1,000,000; (4) professional liability (or errors and omissions) insurance, with a policy limit of at least \$1,000,000; and (5) certificates of insurance, copies of policies, or endorsements evidencing the above insurance coverage. The policy limit for each commercial general liability policy and each professional liability policy must be approved by each party's Risk Manager, who may require the limit to exceed the above-stated minimum limits of coverage for those policies.

3. Contractors' Policies Primary. The commercial general liability insurance and vehicle liability insurance shall include endorsements naming CITY and DISTRICT, and their governing bodies, officers, agents, and employees, as additional insureds. Each aforementioned insurance policy shall contain a provision that the insurance afforded thereby to the additional insureds shall be primary insurance to the full limits of that policy and that, if any of the additional insureds has other insurance or self-insurance against a loss covered by such policy, such insurance or self-insurance shall be excess insurance only.

4. Certificates of Insurance. CITY and DISTRICT shall require each contractor and consultant on PROJECT, and its assigns, to promptly furnish to CITY and DISTRICT certificates of insurance evidencing the coverage required herein. Additionally, CITY and DISTRICT shall include in each contractor and consultant contract a requirement that, no later than five days after contractor's, consultant's, or assign's receipt of (i) a notice of cancellation or a notice of an intention to cancel any of consultant/contractor/assigns insurance coverage required by this Agreement, or (ii) a notice of a material change to consultant/contractor/assigns insurance coverage required by this Agreement, consultant, contractor, or assign will provide CITY and DISTRICT a copy of such notice of cancellation, or notice of intention to cancel, or notice of material change. CITY or DISTRICT'S failure to include such a requirement in each contract with a consultant or contractor will constitute a default under this Agreement. CITY and DISTRICT shall further include in all consultant and contractor contracts a requirement that, if the consultant or contractor, or its assigns, renews any of the insurance policies, or acquires any new insurance policy, or amends the coverage through an endorsement to any policy, at any time during the term of the contract, then the consultant or contractor, or its assigns, shall provide a current certificate of insurance to CITY and DISTRICT.

B. Indemnification: CITY and DISTRICT shall ensure that all PROJECT-related design and construction contracts include provisions requiring the contractor, subcontractors, consultants, and subconsultants to provide indemnity, warranties, and bonds in the amounts and manner set forth below:

1. Indemnity. CITY and DISTRICT shall require each Contractor and subcontractor, and their agents and assigns, to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless DISTRICT and CITY, and their governing bodies, officers, agents, and employees, from and against any and all liability, claims, actions, causes of action, or demands whatsoever against any of them, including related attorneys' fees, arising out of or connected with any injury or death of any person or damage to the property or other liability of any nature arising out of or in any way connected with the PROJECT. Except as provided by Civil Code section 2782 et seq., the contractor's and subcontractors' obligations under this section shall exist regardless of the existence or degree of fault of DISTRICT or CITY or any indemnitee.

2. Warranties. In addition to all warranties existing at law, the contractor shall be required to provide an express warranty for the benefit of DISTRICT and CITY, for a one-year time period (hereinafter "Contractor's Warranty"), containing, at a minimum, the contractor's guarantee that the work has been performed in accordance with the plans and specifications, and the Contractors' agreement to repair or replace all work that fails to conform to the plan and specifications or proves to be defective in workmanship or materials during the stated time period.

3. Bonds. Contractor shall be required to present two good and sufficient surety bonds, one for payment, and one for performance, each in an amount equal to 100 percent of the contract price, issued by a surety admitted in the State of California in a form satisfactory to the DISTRICT and CITY, naming DISTRICT and CITY as obligees on the bonds.

- C. CITY shall ensure that the contract documents for the PROJECT include provisions requiring the contractor and subcontractors to pay prevailing wages for the PROJECT work, as required by state law.
- D. Neither the CITY, nor any officer or employee thereof, shall be responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by the DISTRICT in connection with any of DISTRICT's obligations under this Agreement, and to the extent not covered by the insurance or indemnification described in this section 5, the DISTRICT shall defend, indemnify, save and hold harmless the CITY, its officers and employees against the same, except as otherwise provided in section 6.B.

Neither the DISTRICT, nor any officer or employee thereof, shall be responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by the CITY in connection with any of CITY's obligations under this Agreement, and to the extent not covered by the insurance or indemnification described in this section 5, the CITY shall defend, indemnify, save and hold harmless the DISTRICT, its officers and employees against the same.

E. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to affect the legal liability of either party to third parties by imposing any standard of care different from that normally imposed by law.

6. Acceptance and Maintenance:

- A. Upon completion of the PROJECT, DISTRICT and the CITY shall jointly conduct the final inspection. After CITY and DISTRICT have determined that the work performed has been completed to CITY's and DISTRICT's satisfaction, CITY shall accept the PROJECT improvements as complete and shall promptly record a notice of completion.
- B. Following acceptance, CITY shall own and be responsible for maintaining all improvements relating to the PROJECT, subject to the provision of the Contractor's Warranty, described in Section 5.B.2, above, and shall defend, indemnify, save, and hold harmless DISTRICT, its governing bodies, officers, agents, and employees against all claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses, or liability arising after acceptance, whether relating to design, construction, use, operation, or maintenance of the improvements.

7. <u>Agreement Modification:</u> This Agreement shall be subject to modification only with the written consent of the legislative bodies of both parties. Neither party shall unreasonably withhold its consent to modification for the implementation and accomplishment of the overall purpose for which the Agreement is made.

8. <u>Agreement Termination</u>: This Agreement shall terminate upon the completion of the tasks described in Sections 2.A and 2.B, above. This Agreement may be terminated immediately by mutual, written consent of the parties. However, the obligations contained in Sections 2.B.12, 2.B.23, 2.B.24, and 6 shall survive any termination of this Agreement as long as the PROJECT is completed. Further, the obligations contain in Section 5, shall survive any termination of this Agreement, whether or not the PROJECT is completed.

9. <u>Assignment</u>: The rights, duties, and responsibilities under this Agreement may not be assigned by either party.

10. <u>Notices:</u> All notices given under this License Agreement shall be served by enclosing the notice in a sealed envelope addressed to the other party, certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

Either party may designate, by written notice to the other, a different agent for service or address for notice. Notice is effective two (2) business days from the date of mailing.

11. <u>Entire Agreement:</u> This Agreement contains the entire understanding of CITY and DISTRICT relating to the subject matter of this Agreement.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached resolution authorizing the City Manager to accept an offer of dedication for a storm drain easement through former Parachini property for the proposed East Contra Costa BART Extension Project parking lot and maintenance facility at Hillcrest Avenue and to execute documents for additional transfers for the proposed East Contra Costa BART Extension Project which are deemed by the City Manager, City Attorney and City Engineer to be of a minor or insignificant nature.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Olga Perez, Contract Manager for the proposed \$463 million East Contra Costa BART Extension Project, requests that the City formally accept an offer of dedication from the County for a storm drain easement through former Parachini property (APN 052-030-017), located north of Highway 4 and east of Hillcrest Avenue, for the proposed BART station parking lot. A Vicinity Map is included as Attachment "A".

In 1980, the County recorded an "offer of dedication for drainage purposes" (Attachment "B") for the subject easement area without recording a certificate of acceptance; consequently the easement area was never accepted by the County. The property was later annexed into the City and the easement area is now within the city limits of the City of Antioch. The proposed BART project will replace/relocate an existing 60" storm drain system within the easement area.

The attached resolution also includes authorization for the City Manager to execute documents for any additional transfers related to the East Contra Costa BART Extension Project parking lot and maintenance facility which are deemed by the City Manager, City Attorney and City Engineer to be of a minor or insignificant nature

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Upon acceptance, the City will be obligated to maintain the storm drain facilities within the easement.

OPTIONS

None considered given that storm drain facilities are needed for the project.

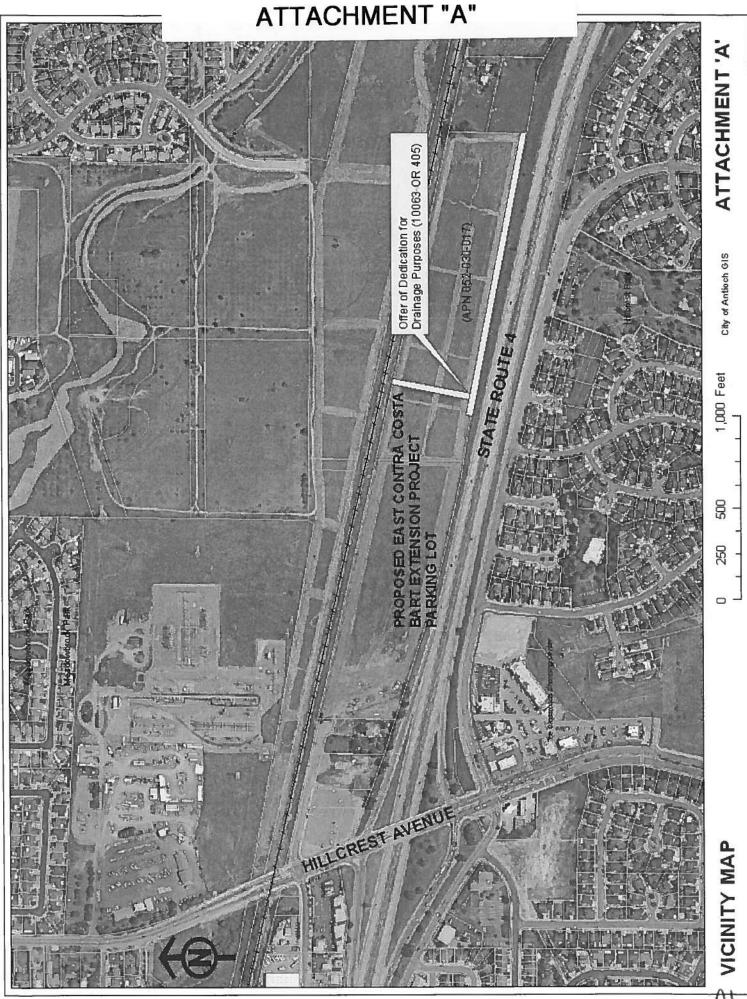

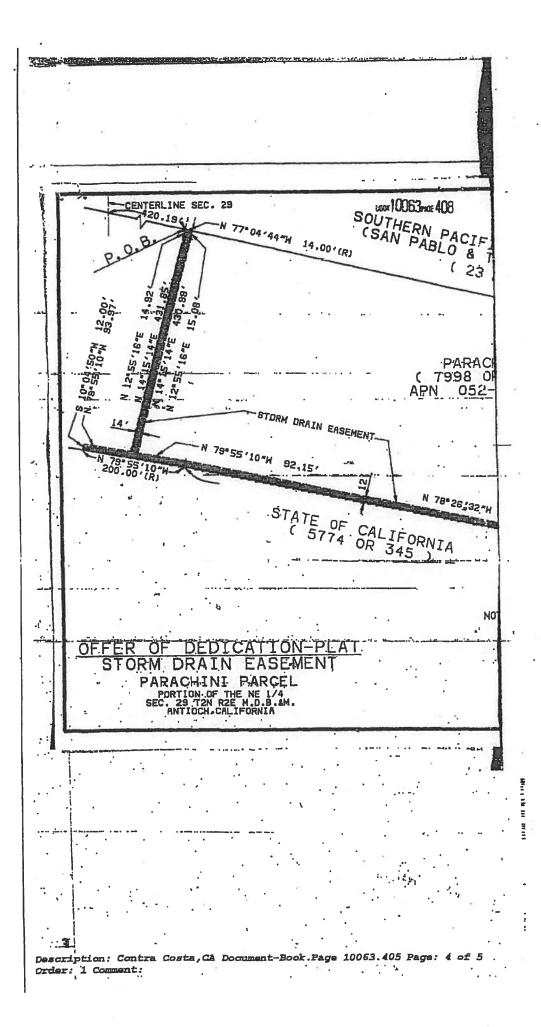

Subject:	Recommend Approval to Amend the Operating Budget to Include \$500,000 in Sewer Fund Expenditures for Wilbur Avenue Sewer

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the Director of Finance to Amend the 2012-2013 Operating Budget to include \$500,000 in Sewer Fund Expenditures to be used for the Installation of a new Sanitary Sewer line in Wilbur Avenue.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

At the September 25, 2012 City Council Meeting, staff was asked to prepare a report on the requested budget amendment for the installation of approximately 1,425 linear feet of sewer trunk line in Wilbur Avenue. GenOn Marsh Landing, LLC ("GenOn") is constructing the 740-MW Marsh Landing Generating Station at 3201 Wilbur Avenue. The City Council approved an Out of Agency Services and Project Agreement ("Agreement") with GenOn by Resolution No. 2011/54 adopted August 9, 2011. The Agreement includes a requirement for GenOn to extend an existing sanitary sewer line from its current location across the project frontage and caps its exposure for costs related to the sewer line at \$700,000. Original cost estimates provided by a City consultant underestimated the project costs.

GenOn's contractor (Kiewit Power Constructors) has provided a contract estimate for 1,425 feet of the project frontage which exceeds GenOn's "cap" by \$1,015,091 resulting in a total project cost of \$1,715,091. In the event the City decides not to construct the sewer line, GenOn would be responsible for a lateral along the same alignment costing \$591,400. Acknowledging the benefit to GenOn, they have agreed to credit this avoided cost against the total project cost. This results in a \$423,691 cost to the City and a savings of \$591,400. Staff believes this is an excellent value for the City and the area to the west that will ultimately connect to this line.

Upon authorization of this budget amendment, a reimbursement agreement will be executed between both parties based on the City's standard template dealing with the mechanics of the reimbursement from the City to GenOn. The tentative agreement provides that costs above \$1,200,000 (GenOn's initial \$700,000 and the City's \$500,000) would be borne by GenOn.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The approval of this amendment to the 2012-2013 Operating Budget will include \$500,000 in Sewer Fund expenditures for the new Wilbur Avenue sewer line. The amended budget amount is being set as the maximum amount that the City would be obligated to pay in the event that reasonably unforeseen conditions resulting in increased costs are encountered during construction. The City Council conditionally approved \$600,000 at its last regularly scheduled meeting while awaiting this additional background information. The present proposal represents a \$100,000 cost savings from the original estimate provided by GenOn.

OPTIONS

Council may choose to not approve the budget amendment. This is not recommended as the cost to construct this segment of sewer line in the future will be significantly higher than the requested amount.
