

What is a Housing Element?

- The State Housing Element Law (1969) requires California jurisdictions to accommodate their 'fair share' of projected housing needs by planning for and removing constraints to growth.
- Requires review and certification by the State.
- Updated every 8 years.
- The City of Antioch does not build housing. The City identifies sites suitable for development.



Housing Element Components

- Housing Needs Assessment
- Evaluation of Past Performance
- Housing Sites Inventory
- Constraints Analysis
- Policies and Programs
- Community Outreach & Engagement



Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA)


- **Data.** State looks at data (e.g., population projections, occupied units) and assigns a number for the Bay Area.
- Fair Share. Association of Bay Area Governments allocates each jurisdiction their "fair share" based on factors like land availability, sewer and water capacity, transportation infrastructure, existing and projected jobs.
- Affordability Levels.
 - Very Low Income, Low Income, Moderate, Above Moderate
 - For housing to be affordable, it must cost no more than 30% of a household's income.


Income Category	RHNA 2015-2023	RHNA 2023-2031
Very Low Income (<50% of Area Median Income)	349 (24%)	792 (26%)
Low Income (50%-80% of AMI)	205 (14%)	456 (15%)
Moderate Income (80%-120% of AMI)	214 (15%)	493 (17%)
Above Moderate Income (>120% of AMI)	680 (47%)	1,275 (42%)
Total	1,448 (2015-2023)	3,016 (2023-2031)


Population Growth




Population by Race




Housing Types


What is Environmental Justice?

The fair treatment and meaningful involvement of people of all races, cultures, incomes, and national origins with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.


Why is the City Adopting New Environmental Justice Policies?

- **Senate Bill 1000 (2016).** This legislation required environmental justice as a new **mandatory** topic in the General Plan. This applies to all cities and counties in California with "disadvantaged communities."
- Environmental Justice Neighborhood.
 - 1. An area identified by the California Environmental Protection Agency (CalEPA) pursuant to Section 39711 of the Health and Safety Code.
 - 2. An area that is **low-income and disproportionately affected by environmental pollution and other hazards** that can lead to negative health effects, exposure, or environmental degradation.


How are Antioch's Environmental Justice Neighborhoods Identified?












Census tracts with greater exposure to environmental hazards (pink shading)

Antioch's Environmental Justice Neighborhoods




- Antioch has five census tracts identified as Environmental Justice neighborhoods.
- These areas are **disproportionately affected** by pollution, health, and socioeconomic factors.
- Additional areas can be identified through the community engagement process.

Pollution Burden

 Represents potential exposure to pollutants (e.g., diesel emissions) and adverse environmental conditions (e. g., hazardous waste).

Antioch's EJ Neighborhoods

- High diesel particulate matter
- High hazardous waste
- High asthma rate




Housing Burden

 Households that are both low income and spending more than half of their income on housing

Antioch's EJ Neighborhoods


• 39% of households are housing burdened.









Pollution exposure













Exposure to unique or compounding health risks (i.e., climate change)


Based on the EJ topics presented, what is the most critical issue in Antioch?





