

## **Assembly Bill No. 783**

Effective January 1, 2024, Assembly Bill 783 requires all **single-user toilet facilities** in any business establishment, place of public accommodation or state or local government agency to be identified as **all-gender toilet facilities** by signage that complies with Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations and designated for use by no more than one occupant at a time or for family or assisted use.



AB783 is related to AB1732 (Ting) from 2016, which enacted a restroom policy requiring all single-occupancy restrooms in businesses, government buildings, and places of public accommodation be available to everyone. AB 1732 authorized health inspection officials to check for compliance during health inspections.

AB783 is designed to boost compliance with AB 1732 by ensuring businesses are aware of the requirements.

Assembly Bill 1732, enacted as Health and Safety Code section 118600, requires the following: "All single-user toilet facilities in any business establishment, place of public accommodation, or state or local government agency shall be identified as all-gender toilet facilities by signage that complies with Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations, and designated for use by no more than one occupant at a time or for family or assisted use." For the purposes of section 118600, "single-user toilet facility" means a toilet facility with no more than one water closet (or flush toilet) and one urinal with a locking mechanism controlled by the user.
