Mayor Thorpe explained that this meeting was to review baseline and budget projections. He noted Council would then determine their priorities.

A 04-25-23 Finance Director Merchant presented the staff report dated March 28, 2023, recommending the City Council provide feedback and direction regarding the budget development information provided for the Fiscal Year 2023-25 Budget.

Finance Director Merchant explained the Budget Stabilization Fund was for years when needed to balance the budget and Council could set a goal for the utilization of those funds.

Mayor Thorpe requested a discussion for utilization of the Budget Stabilization Fund be brought back to the next Council meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Andrew Becker requested the City provide stronger support, services, and resources for the community.

Ralph Hernandez, Antioch resident, clarified that comments he had made at a previous Council meeting were not racial and encouraged anyone questioning his comments ask for clarification. He spoke in support of the Antioch Police Department.

Gary Welch requested the City provide traffic control measures along West 10th Street. He asked his District Councilmember to reach out to him regarding this request.

Leslie May spoke to previous public comment, Robert's Rules of Order, and the Brown Act. She urged Council to form a committee to discuss reparations. She wished her daughter a Happy Birthday.

Frank Sterling requested the Council consider bringing back the zoom option for Council meetings. He referenced an article in a local newspaper regarding the Antioch Police Department and the release of information under SB1421.

Stacey Wright, Antioch resident, requested traffic control measures along Canada Valley Road.

Kathryn Wade requested the Antioch Police Department release reports and dispatch calls involving her son.

Patricia Granados, Antioch resident, requested the City levy fines against a resident for attempting to remove a tree without a tree removal permit. She suggested the City conduct an investigation of the AUSD.

Councilmember Wilson reported on her attendance at Delta Diablo and Tri Delta Transit meetings.

Councilmember Torres-Walker announced meetings for the CDBG Standing Committee, Cannabis Standing Committee and Human Rights and Racial Equity Committee would be scheduled soon. She reported on her attendance at a meeting with staff regarding violence prevention efforts. She announced she would also be meeting with staff to discuss "L" Street improvements and other traffic concerns in District 1. She discussed her ongoing efforts to advocate for street improvements in District 1.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Mayor Thorpe reported on his attendance at Tri Delta and CCTA meetings. He reported there had been a soft launch of some programs including the Community Crisis Response Team. He announced the City would be receiving the Certificate of Occupancy for the Executive Inn project very soon. He discussed the decommissioning of the Antioch Amtrak station in favor of the Oakley Station and expressed concern that information was withheld from elected officials in Antioch as well as other local dignitaries regarding that action. In response to public comment, he stated the City could look at Canada Valley Road for traffic calming measures and clarified that the Council did not oversee AUSD. Additionally, he commented that City Attorney Smith would be looking into claims made in a local newspaper. He discussed his father's illness and noted that he would be starting the process of changing his name to include his father's last name. He added that due to his father's illness he may be absent from future meetings, and he asked the public to respect his privacy.

COUNCIL REGULAR AGENDA

4. SALES TAX CITIZENS' OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS FOR THE VACANCIES EXPIRING MARCH 2026

City Clerk Householder announced that Mayor Thorpe nominated Seanzell Lewis as a member of the Sales Tax Citizens' Oversight Committee for a vacancy expiring March 2026.

City Clerk Householder read Seanzell Lewis's biography.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023/51

On motion by Councilmember Ogorchock, seconded by Councilmember Barbanica, the City Council unanimously appointed Seanzell Lewis by resolution as a member of the Sales Tax Citizens' Oversight Committee for a vacancy expiring March 2026.

Seanzell Lewis thanked the City Council for the opportunity to serve.

City Clerk Householder administered the Oath of Office to Mr. Lewis.

Mayor Thorpe called on Andrew Becker to make his public comment on Consent Calendar Item 3-G.

3. CONSENT CALENDAR for City/City Council Members acting as Housing Successor to the Antioch Development Agency – Continued

<u>ITEM G</u> - Andrew Becker expressed concern that he had submitted a speaker card for this item, and he was not allowed to speak prior to Council taking action. He also expressed concern that the timeline had changed within the progress report.

4. SALES TAX CITIZENS' OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS FOR THE VACANCIES EXPIRING MARCH 2026 – Continued

City Clerk Householder announced that Mayor Thorpe nominated Erika Raulston as a member of the Sales Tax Citizens' Oversight Committee for a vacancy expiring March 2026.

City Clerk Householder read Erika Raulston's biography.

[RESOLUTION NO. 2023/51]

On motion by Councilmember Ogorchock, seconded by Councilmember Barbanica, the City Council unanimously appointed Erika Raulston by resolution as a member of the Sales Tax Citizens' Oversight Committee for a vacancy expiring March 2026.

City Clerk Householder administered the Oath of Office to Erika Raulston.

5. TOBACCO ORDINANCE DISCUSSION

Acting City Manager Ebbs presented the staff report dated March 28, 2023, recommending the City Council receive and file this report and offer any questions or direction to staff.

Ralph Hernandez, Antioch resident, spoke in support of allowing tobacco retailers to transfer their investments and requested Council remove restrictions on products these businesses were allowed to sell.

Amaya Wooding, LGBTQ Minus Tobacco, Jimmy Ancira, Contra Costa Tobacco Prevention Coalition and LGBTQ Minus Tobacco, Brian Davis LGBTQ Minus Tobacco and Contra Costa County Tobacco Prevention Coalition and Isabelle Kirske, Contra Costa County Tobacco Prevention Project, spoke in support of Antioch's current policies related to the sale of tobacco products.

Gurtej Singh, Tobacco Retail Business Owner, Kathryn Wade, Ralph Hernandez on behalf of Baldev Singh, Vipin Khanna, Jasbir Sooch, Nisha Toor, Shlok Soosh, Kaya Toor and Monica

Castaneda discussed the negative effect the tobacco ordinance had on tobacco retailers and spoke in support of removing restrictions on products these businesses were allowed to sell.

Mayor Thorpe read written comment submitted by the following individuals in support of removing restrictions on products tobacco retailers were allowed to sell: Jaspreet and Ajit Sooch, Antioch residents.

Sam Sohota discussed the negative effect the tobacco ordinance had on tobacco retailers and spoke in support of removing restrictions on products these businesses were allowed to sell. He also asked for the removal of the restriction preventing tobacco retailers from transferring or selling their businesses.

Leslie May encouraged tobacco retailers to expand their businesses to sell other products.

Public comment submitted in writing was entered into the record from the following individual: Amaya Wooding, Project Coordinator, LGBTQ Minus Tobacco.

Councilmember Ogorchock gave a history of the tobacco ordinance and explained that after YTAPP reached out to discuss other restrictions, Council made changes without the retailers informing the City on the negative impacts those changes would have on their businesses. She noted tobacco retailers were now asking for reconsideration of the ordinance as it related to the local restrictions and allowing them to transfer their businesses.

Mayor Thorpe and Councilmember Wilson stated their position on the ordinance remained the same and they did not support any revisions at this time.

Councilmembers Barbanica, Torres-Walker and Ogorchock felt the ordinance was overly restrictive and placed an undue burden on tobacco retailers and their families. They felt the City should follow state law making restrictions equal to all other jurisdictions within the State.

Following discussion, Council consensus supported rescinding local restrictions #4-6. They also supported allowing people owning a qualifying Tobacco Retailer to sell or transfer the business to another party.

Mayor Thorpe stated he would work with staff to bring this item back to Council. He reminded retailers to continue to follow the ordinance as it remained in effect.

6. RENTAL INSPECTION PROGRAM INFORMATION

Acting City Manager Ebbs presented the staff report dated March 28, 2023, recommending the City Council receive and file this report and offer any questions or direction to staff.

Leslie May and Devin Williams spoke in support of reestablishing the Rental Inspection Program. Mr. Williams expressed concern that inspections could be used to intimidate tenants and questioned who would monitor the required improvements.

Councilmember Torres-Walker spoke in support of amending the Municipal Code and directing the focus on multifamily rental units and corporate landlords.

Councilmember Wilson agreed with Councilmember Torres-Walker and discussed the importance of having a fair program that would not be used to retaliate against tenants.

Acting City Manager Ebbs stated there would be scheduled annual inspections relieving the tenant from having to file a complaint risking retaliation. He noted the intent of the inspection was not to intimidate or harass the tenant and was only to assess the physical condition of the property. He further noted if there were violations of the housing or building code, it was the obligation of the property owner to correct. He commented that the program would create incentive to maintain properties. He stated he would be happy to bring something back to Council reflecting their direction.

Mayor Thorpe reported tenant complaints he received were regarding large complexes in Antioch.

Councilmember Ogorchock explained when an individual rented a home, an inspection of property was completed, and a form was signed by the owner, renter and agent. She suggested if this item came back, those forms be utilized to certify the condition of properties. She requested staff look at local jurisdictions to determine how they were addressing this issue. She suggested four Code Enforcement Officers be HUD certified, to serve as the inspection team under the Public Safety and Community Resources Department.

Acting City Manager Ebbs stated the inspection team could be fluid with specialized certification. He stated he felt this team would be better housed in Code Enforcement because they already had experience.

Councilmember Barbanica cautioned that if a house was documented in good condition when the tenant moved in, and Code Enforcement found substantial damage, it could spark evictions. He stated he supported a Rental Inspection Program.

Councilmember Torres-Walker stated renters should be educated on how to document the condition of the property prior to signing a lease. She commented that if a property was documented in good condition and an annual rental inspection found the property damaged, she would support an eviction.

Councilmember Barbanica clarified that as a society, blame was typically placed on the landlord and there were some tenant responsibilities. He noted the reality was that there was going to be accountability on both sides.

Following discussion, the City Council unanimously supported the following:

- > Reinstating the rental inspection program
- > The current Code Enforcement structure would run the program

- Code Enforcement Officers would be required to have HUD certification
- The focus was on Multifamily (Councilmember Barbanica abstained from the discussion on this item due to conflict of interest)

In response to Councilmember Torres-Walker, Acting City Manager Ebbs stated he could provide Council with data regarding how many owners/corporations owned more than five single family residences.

Councilmember Barbanica requested staff investigate whether there were landlords not pulling business licenses.

7. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND COMMUNITY RESOURCES (P.W. 289-15)

Acting Director of Public Works/City Engineer Buenting and Bruce Playle, Indigo / Hammond & Playle Architects, LLP, presented the staff report dated March 28, 2023, recommending the City Council provide direction for the design approval and funding of the Department of Public Safety and Community Resources.

Julianne Davis, Gary Welsh and Leslie May expressed concern regarding parking and traffic in the area of the proposed project and requested the City address traffic calming measures prior to adding more traffic to the area.

Councilmember Torres-Walker and Wilson stated this place of service was needed and it would uplift the community. They noted the intent was to address traffic safety prior to it being opened to the public. They urged Council to support the request.

In response to Councilmember Torres-Walker, Director of Public Safety and Community Resources Johnson stated staff hoped to seek funding from other sources and they were confident that they would find some funding.

Councilmember Barbanica stated he wanted to discuss the City's budget prior to committing funding for this project.

Councilmember Ogorchock spoke in support of the building design. She stated she wanted the Council to consider the budget and funding needed for "L" Street improvements, prior to moving forward with this project.

In response to Councilmember Torres-Walker, Acting Director of Public Works/City Engineer Buenting stated staff was looking for feedback regarding the project design. He noted construction was unfunded and moving forward they needed some commitment to the funds. He further noted he understood the hesitancy at a time when Council was considering the budget. He reported preliminary traffic calming plans had been drawn up and they were looking for a grant for the improvements, and they were also waiting to consult with the Antioch Police Department to make sure they were in agreement.

Mayor Thorpe added that as soon as those items were completed, Acting Director of Public Works/City Engineer would provide Council with an update on traffic calming measures.

Acting City Manager Ebbs stated if Council supported the project design, he would request they allow staff to explore financing options.

City Attorney Smith added that this item was not prepared for a full commitment of funds.

Mayor Thorpe commented that there may be an opportunity to work with the County regarding incorporating a new library facility into this building. He cautioned that historically cost projections increased and the City needed to budget accordingly. He spoke in support of the project, noting that this area of the City had historically been under resourced.

Councilmembers Barbanica and Ogorchock stated they could not support the project until a funding source was identified. Councilmember Ogorchock suggested that the library site on 18th Street may be a viable location for the Public Safety and Community Resources department.

Following discussion, Council consensus supported the Department of Public Safety and Community Resources project.

8. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION REVIEW OF PAST PURPOSE AND FUTURE VALUE

Director of Economic Development Reed presented the staff report dated March 28, 2023, recommending the City Council discuss the future relevance of the Economic Development Commission.

Lemuel del Castillo, Tim McCall and Kelly Kalfsbeek, Economic Development Commissioners, spoke to the value of their work on the Economic Development Commission (EDC) and requested Council support continuing with the EDC.

Ralph Hernandez expressed concern about the number of businesses that had closed in Antioch and the value of getting assistance from the EDC to retain and attract business.

Public comment submitted in writing was entered into the record from the following individual: Tim McCall.

Councilmember Torres-Walker stated she supported reinstating the EDC with strategic planning and in partnership with the Chamber of Commerce.

Director of Economic Development Reed commented that the EDC was underutilized; however, there had been distractions when it came to presenting to Council. He noted former members discussed the EDC becoming a committee not subject to the Brown Act and there may be value in making the EDC an advisory committee to give them freedom for site visits. He noted the

Chamber CEO had expressed interest in being appointed to the Commission. He spoke in support of reforming the EDC as an advisory committee.

Councilmember Wilson suggested looking at Economic Development regionally.

City Attorney Smith explained that if the EDC became a committee in the policy advisory process, they were still required to follow the Brown Act.

Mayor Thorpe suggested reducing the membership of the Committee/Commission to five and developing a workgroup to determine the role of the EDC moving forward.

Councilmembers Torres-Walker and Wilson offered to work with current EDC members and the Chamber of Commerce to define the role of the Commission/Committee.

Following discussion, Council consensus directed staff to bring back the formation of an Economic Development Ad Hoc Committee to determine the role of the EDC.

Director of Economic Development Reed responded that he would work with City Attorney Smith on the formation of an Ad Hoc Committee.

PUBLIC COMMENT - None

STAFF COMMUNICATIONS

Acting City Manager Ebbs thanked Council for allowing him to serve as Acting City Manager.

Mayor Thorpe thanked Acting City Manager Ebbs for serving as Acting City Manager.

COUNCIL COMMUNICATIONS AND FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Councilmember Ogorchock requested staff investigate the lack of parking spaces at the marina as well as the flooding issues. She also requested restrictions on donation flyers be revisited since she had witnessed them showing up in neighborhoods.

Councilmember Wilson requested staff revisit the restriction on donation bins since she had witnessed them returning.

Councilmember Torres-Walker thanked the public for their attendance and comments this evening. She requested Council reconsider allowing Zoom meetings for the public.

Councilmember Barbanica requested an update of his request for the City to consider a sole source provider that had offered to tow abandoned motorhomes and pick up debris from roadways, free of charge.

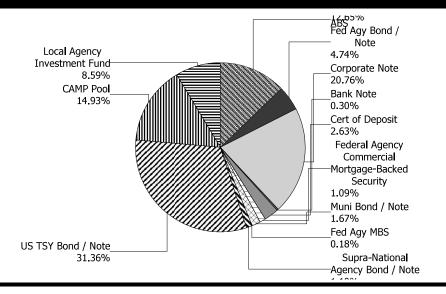

fiscal sponsor Safe Passages.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the resolution authorizing the Acting City Manager or designee to enter into an agreement with Advanced Peace for technical assistance, support, training, and development for four hundred and thirty-five thousand dollars (\$435,000) funded by CalVIP grant funds.

FISCAL IMPACT

The cost of the service provider will be paid for in its entirety by the grant.

DISCUSSION

In February 2022, the City of Antioch applied for a three-year CalVIP grant from the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) to improve public health and safety by supporting effective violence reduction initiatives in Antioch, which is disproportionately impacted by violence, particularly group-member-involved homicides, shootings, and aggravated assaults (Penal Code Sec. 14131(b)). The City of Antioch was awarded the CalVIP grant agreement from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2025, for a maximum amount of \$1,794,116.00. Funds will be used to support, expand, and replicate evidence-based violence reduction initiatives that seek to interrupt cycles of violence.

The proposal included a provision that technical assistance/support, training and development to the selected community-based organizations will be provided by Advance Peace. Advance Peace will also assist with identifying, assessing, selecting, engaging, and enrolling the clients, also known as Peacemaker Fellows. Advance Peace will sulpport program buildout, including street outreach, branding, risk mitigation, infrastructure, and strategic communications. The attached resolution

approves allocating \$435,000 from CalVIP grant funds to contract with Advance Peace to support violence reduction initiatives.

WHEREAS, Advance Peace has represented that it has the expertise, background, and qualifications to help the City achieve these goals by providing technical assistance, support, training, and development aimed at expanding and replicating evidence-based violence reduction initiatives that seek to interrupt cycles of violence in the City of Antioch in 2023-25;

WHEREAS, Advance Peace will be involved in stakeholder engagement assessment, personnel management support, operations management support, program development and implementation; and learning and evaluation;

WHEREAS, the Public Safety and Community Resources Department recommends Council approval of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered approving and authorizing the expenditure of four hundred and thirty-five thousand dollars (\$435,000) from the BSCC CalVIP grant funds to support, expand, and replicate evidence-based violence reduction initiatives that seek to interrupt cycles of violence in the City of Antioch in 2023-25.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Antioch hereby authorizes the Acting City Manager or designee to enter into an agreement with Advanced Peace for technical assistance, support, training, and development for four hundred and thirty-five thousand dollars (\$435,000) in a form approved by the City Attorney.

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this 1st day of May, 2023 ("Effective Date") by and between the City of Antioch, a municipal Corporation with its principle place of business at 200 H Street, Antioch, CA 94509 ("City") and Advance Peace with its principle place of business at 561 11th Street Suite 6306 Oakland, CA ("Consultant"), through its fiscal sponsor Safe Passages a 501c3 Non-Profit Corporation acting as a Fiscal Sponsor with its principle place of business at 1017 Clay Street Oakland, CA 94607 ("Fiscal Sponsor"). City, Consultant, and Fiscal Sponsor individually are sometimes referred to herein as "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

- **SECTION 1. SERVICES**. Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, Consultant shall furnish all technical and professional services including labor, material, equipment, transportation, supervision and expertise to provide to City the services described in the Scope of Work attached as Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein at the time and place and in the manner specified therein ("**Services**"). In the event of a conflict in or inconsistency between the terms of this Agreement and Exhibit A, the Agreement shall prevail.
- 1.1 <u>Term of Services.</u> The term of this Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date and shall end on December 31, 2025 the date of completion specified in <u>Exhibit A</u>, and Consultant shall complete the Services described in <u>Exhibit A</u> prior to that date, unless the term of the Agreement is otherwise terminated or extended, as provided for in Section 8. The time provided to Consultant to complete the Services required by this Agreement shall not affect the City's right to terminate the Agreement, under Section 8.
- 1.2 <u>Standard of Performance.</u> Consultant represents that it is experienced in providing these services to public clients and is familiar with the plans and needs of City. Consultant shall perform all Services required pursuant to this Agreement in the manner and according to the standards observed by a competent practitioner of the profession in which Consultant is engaged in the geographical area in which Consultant practices its profession.
- 1.3 <u>Assignment of Personnel.</u> Consultant shall assign only competent personnel to perform Services pursuant to this Agreement. In the event that City, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this Agreement, desires the reassignment of any such persons, Consultant shall, immediately upon receiving notice from City of such desire of City, reassign such person or persons.
- **1.4** <u>Time.</u> Consultant shall devote such time to the performance of Services pursuant to this Agreement as may be reasonably necessary to meet the standard of performance provided in Section 1.1 above and to satisfy Consultant's obligations hereunder.

SECTION 2. COMPENSATION.

2.1 Consultant shall receive compensation, including authorized reimbursements, for all Services rendered under this Agreement, as more particularly described in Exhibit A. Payments for the

Services and reimbursement of costs will not exceed Four Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$435,000) over the term of this Agreement notwithstanding any contrary indications that may be contained in Consultant's proposal, for Services to be performed and reimbursable costs incurred under this Agreement. In addition to the foregoing, payments for the Services and reimbursement of costs will not exceed One Hundred Forty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$145,000) annually unless approved in advance by the Contract Administrator.

- **2.2** In the event of a conflict between this Agreement and Consultant's proposal, attached as Exhibit A, regarding the amount of compensation, the Agreement shall prevail. City shall pay Consultant for Services rendered pursuant to this Agreement at the time and in the manner set forth below. The payments specified below shall be the only payments from City to Consultant for Services rendered and costs incurred pursuant to this Agreement. Except as specifically authorized by City, Consultant shall not bill City for duplicate services performed by more than one person.
- 2.3 Consultant and City acknowledge and agree that compensation paid by City to Consultant under this Agreement is based upon Consultant's estimated costs of providing the Services required hereunder, including salaries and benefits of employees and subcontractors of Consultant. Consequently, the Parties further agree that compensation hereunder is intended to include the costs of contributions to any pensions and/or annuities to which Consultant and its employees, agents, and subcontractors may be eligible. City therefore has no responsibility for such contributions beyond compensation required under this Agreement.
- **2.4** Reports. Consultant shall submit reports, not more often than once a month during the term of this Agreement, describing the Services performed and costs incurred.
- **2.5** Payment of Taxes. Consultant is solely responsible for the payment of employment taxes incurred under this Agreement and any similar federal or state taxes.
- **2.6** <u>Authorization to Perform Services.</u> The Consultant is not authorized to perform any Services or incur any costs whatsoever under the terms of this Agreement until Consultant receives authorization to proceed from the Contract Administrator.
- **SECTION 3. FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT.** Except as set forth herein, Consultant shall, at its sole cost and expense, provide all facilities and equipment that may be necessary to perform the Services required by this Agreement. City shall make available to Consultant only the facilities and equipment listed in this section, and only under the terms and conditions set forth herein.

City shall furnish physical facilities such as desks, filing cabinets, and conference space, as may be reasonably necessary for Consultant's use while consulting with City employees and reviewing records and the information in possession of the City. The location, quantity, and time of furnishing those facilities shall be in the sole discretion of City. In no event shall City be obligated to furnish any facility that may involve incurring any direct expense, including but not limited to computer, long-distance telephone or other communication charges, vehicles, and reproduction facilities.

SECTION 4. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS. Before beginning any work under this Agreement, Consultant, at its own cost and expense, shall procure insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property that may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work by the Consultant and its agents, representatives, employees, and subcontractors. Consultant shall provide proof

satisfactory to City of such insurance that meets the requirements of this section and under forms of insurance satisfactory in all respects to the City. Consultant shall maintain the insurance policies required by this section throughout the term of this Agreement. The cost of such insurance shall be included in the Consultant's proposal. Consultant shall not allow any subcontractor to commence work on any subcontract until Consultant has obtained all insurance required herein for the subcontractor(s) and provided evidence thereof to City. Verification of the required insurance shall be submitted and made part of this Agreement prior to execution. Insurers shall have an AM Best rating of no less than A:VII unless otherwise accepted by the City in writing:

- 4.1 <u>Commercial General Liability (CGL).</u> Insurance Services Office Form CG 00 01 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products and completed operations, property damage, bodily injury and personal & advertising injury with limits no less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit. If Consultant's services include work within 50 feet of a railroad right of way, the Consultant shall have removed any exclusion on their liability policy limiting coverage for work near a railroad, or shall provide a Railroad Protective Liability policy in favor of the City. Limits for such coverage shall be no less than \$5,000,000.
- **4.2** Automobile Liability Insurance. ISO Form Number CA 00 01 covering any auto (Code 1), or if Consultant has no owned autos, hired, (Code 8) and non-owned autos (Code 9), with limit no less than **\$1,000,000** per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
- **4.3** Workers' Compensation Insurance. Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the State of California, with Statutory Limits, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limit of no less than **\$1,000,000** per accident for bodily injury or disease.
- **4.4** Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions). Insurance appropriate to the Consultant's profession, with limit no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence or claim, \$2,000,000 aggregate.
- **4.5** Other Insurance Provisions. Unless otherwise specified below, all insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:
- **4.5.1** Additional Insured Status. The City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Consultant including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. CGL coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Consultant's insurance (at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or if not available, through the addition of both CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 if a later edition is used). This requirement shall only apply to the CGL and Automobile Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.2** *Primary Coverage.* For any claims related to this contract, the Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it. This requirement shall only apply to the CGL and Automobile Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.3** *Notice of Cancellation.* Each insurance policy required above shall provide that coverage shall not be canceled, except with notice to the City.

- **4.5.4** Waiver of Subrogation. Consultant hereby grants to City a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of said Consultant may acquire against the City by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Consultant agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the City has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer. This requirement shall only apply to the CGL, Automobile Liability and Workers' Compensation/Employer's Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.5** Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the City. The City may require the Consultant to purchase coverage with a lower deductible or retention or provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses within the retention.
- **4.5.6** Claims made policies. If any of the required policies provide claims-made coverage:
- **4.5.6.1** The Retroactive Date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work.
- 4.5.6.2 Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract of work.
- **4.5.6.3** If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a Retroactive Date prior to the contract effective date, the Consultant must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of contract work.
- 4.6 <u>Certificate of Insurance and Endorsements.</u> Consultant shall furnish the City with original certificates and amendatory endorsements or copies of the applicable policy language effecting coverage required by this clause. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the City before work commences. However, failure to obtain the required documents prior to the work beginning shall not waive the Consultant's obligation to provide them. The City reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by these specifications, at any time.
- **4.7 Subcontractors.** Consultant shall include all subcontractors as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated in this Agreement, including but not limited to naming additional insureds.
- **4.8** <u>Higher Limits.</u> If the Consultant maintains higher limits than the minimums shown above, the City requires and shall be entitled to coverage for the higher limits maintained by the Consultant. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the City.
- **4.9** <u>Special Risks or Circumstances.</u> City reserves the right to modify these requirements, including limits, based on the nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage or other special circumstances.

- **4.10** Remedies. In addition to any other remedies City may have if Consultant fails to provide or maintain any insurance policies or policy endorsements to the extent and within the time herein required, City may, at its sole option exercise, any of the following remedies, which are alternatives to other remedies City may have and are not the exclusive remedy for Consultant's breach:
 - Obtain such insurance and deduct and retain the amount of the premiums for such insurance from any sums due to Consultant under the Agreement;
 - Order Consultant to stop work under this Agreement or withhold any payment that becomes due to Consultant hereunder, or both stop work and withhold any payment, until Consultant demonstrates compliance with the requirements hereof; and/or,
 - Terminate this Agreement.

SECTION 5. INDEMNIFICATION AND CONSULTANT'S RESPONSIBILITIES.

- **5.1** To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall defend (with counsel reasonably acceptable to City), indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees, volunteers, and agents free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, costs, expenses, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, in law or equity, to property or persons, including wrongful death, in any manner arising out of, pertaining to, or incident to any acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Consultant, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, consultants or agents in connection with the performance of the Consultant's services or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all damages, expert witness fees and attorney's fees and other related costs and expenses. Consultant's obligation to indemnify shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by Consultant, the City, its officials, officers, employees, agents, or volunteers.
- **5.1.1** Acceptance by City of insurance certificates and endorsements required under this Agreement does not relieve Consultant from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. This indemnification and hold harmless clause shall apply to any damages or claims for damages whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to apply.
- **5.2** By execution of this Agreement, Consultant acknowledges and agrees to the provisions of this Section and that it is a material element of consideration, and that these provisions survive the termination of this Agreement.

SECTION 6. STATUS OF CONSULTANT.

6.1 Independent Contractor. At all times during the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall be an independent contractor and shall not be an employee of City. City shall have the right to control Consultant only insofar as the results of Consultant's services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and assignment of personnel pursuant to Section 1.3; however, otherwise City shall not have the right to control the manner or means by which Consultant accomplishes services rendered pursuant to this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other City, state, or federal policy, rule, regulation, law, or ordinance to the contrary, Consultant and any of its employees, agents, and subcontractors providing services under this Agreement shall not qualify for or become entitled to, and hereby agree to waive any and all claims to, any compensation, benefit, or any incident of employment by City, including, but not limited to, eligibility to enroll in the California Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) as an employee of City and

entitlement to any contribution to be paid by City for employer contributions and/or employee contributions for PERS benefits.

6.2 Consultant Not Agent. Except as City may specify in writing, Consultant shall have no authority, express or implied, to act on behalf of City in any capacity whatsoever as an agent. Consultant shall have no authority, express or implied, pursuant to this Agreement to bind City to any obligation whatsoever.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> <u>LEGAL REQUIREMENTS.</u>

- **7.1 Governing Law.** The laws of the State of California shall govern this Agreement.
- **7.2** Compliance with Applicable Laws. Consultant and any subcontractors shall comply with all laws applicable to the performance of the Services.
- 7.3 Other Governmental Regulations. To the extent that this Agreement may be funded by fiscal assistance from another governmental entity, Consultant and any subcontractors shall comply with all applicable rules and regulations to which City is bound by the terms of such fiscal assistance program.
- 7.4 <u>Licenses and Permits.</u> Consultant represents and warrants to City that Consultant and its employees, agents, and any subcontractors have all licenses, permits, qualifications, and approvals of whatsoever nature that are legally required to practice their respective professions. Consultant represents and warrants to City that Consultant and its employees, agents, any subcontractors shall, at their sole cost and expense, keep in effect at all times during the term of this Agreement any licenses, permits, and approvals that are legally required to practice their respective professions. In addition to the foregoing, Consultant and any subcontractors shall obtain and maintain during the term of this Agreement valid business licenses from City.
- 7.5 <u>Nondiscrimination and Equal Opportunity.</u> Consultant shall not discriminate, on the basis of a person's race, religion, color, national origin, age, physical or mental handicap or disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, sexual orientation or any other legally protected status, against any employee, applicant for employment, subcontractor, bidder for a subcontract, or participant in, recipient of, or applicant for any services or programs provided by Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, policies, rules, and requirements related to equal opportunity and nondiscrimination in employment, contracting, and the provision of any Services that are the subject of this Agreement, including but not limited to the satisfaction of any positive obligations required of Consultant thereby.

Consultant shall include the provisions of this Section in any subcontract approved by the Contract Administrator or this Agreement.

7.6 California Labor Code Requirements. Consultant is aware of the requirements of California Labor Code Sections 1720 et seq. and 1770 et seq., which require the payment of prevailing wage rates and the performance of other requirements on certain "public works" and "maintenance" projects ("Prevailing Wage Laws"). If the services are being performed as part of an applicable "public works" or "maintenance" project, as defined by the Prevailing Wage Laws, and if the total compensation is \$1,000 or more, Consultant agrees to fully comply with such Prevailing Wage Laws. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees and agents free and harmless from

any claims, liabilities, costs, penalties or interest arising out of any failure or alleged failure to comply with the Prevailing Wage Laws. It shall be mandatory upon the Consultant and all subconsultants to comply with all California Labor Code provisions, which include but are not limited to prevailing wages (Labor Code Sections 1771, 1774 and 1775), employment of apprentices (Labor Code Section 1777.5), certified payroll records (Labor Code Sections 1771.4 and 1776), hours of labor (Labor Code Sections 1813 and 1815) and debarment of contractors and subcontractors (Labor Code Section 1777.1). The requirement to submit certified payroll records directly to the Labor Commissioner under Labor Code section 1771.4 shall not apply to work performed on a public works project that is exempt pursuant to the small project exemption specified in Labor Code Section 1771.4.

If the services are being performed as part of an applicable "public works" or "maintenance" project, then pursuant to Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1, the Consultant and all subconsultants performing such services must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations. Consultant shall maintain registration for the full term of this Agreement and require the same of any subconsultants, as applicable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the contractor registration requirements mandated by Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1 shall not apply to work performed on a public works project that is exempt pursuant to the small project exemption specified in Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1.

This Agreement may also be subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations. It shall be Consultant's sole responsibility to comply with all applicable registration and labor compliance requirements. Any stop orders issued by the Department of Industrial Relations against Consultant or any subcontractor that affect Consultant's performance of services, including any delay, shall be Consultant's sole responsibility. Any delay arising out of or resulting from such stop orders shall be considered Consultant caused delay and shall not be compensable by the City. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees and agents free and harmless from any claim or liability arising out of stop orders issued by the Department of Industrial Relations against Consultant or any subcontractor.

SECTION 8. TERMINATION AND MODIFICATION.

8.1 <u>Termination.</u> City may cancel this Agreement at any time and without cause upon written notification to Consultant.

Consultant may cancel this Agreement only for cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to City and shall include in such notice the reasons for cancellation.

In the event of termination, Consultant shall be entitled to compensation for Services performed satisfactorily to the effective date of termination; City, however, may condition payment of such compensation upon Consultant delivering to City any or all documents, photographs, computer software, video and audio tapes, and other materials provided to Consultant or prepared by or for Consultant or the City in connection with this Agreement.

8.2 Extension. City may, in their sole and exclusive discretion, extend the end date of the term of this Agreement beyond that provided for in Section 1.1. Any such extension shall require a written amendment to this Agreement, as provided for herein. Consultant understands and agrees that, if City grants such an extension, City shall have no obligation to provide Consultant with compensation beyond the maximum amount provided for in this Agreement. Similarly, unless authorized by the Contract

Administrator, City shall have no obligation to reimburse Consultant for any otherwise reimbursable expenses incurred during the extension period.

- **8.3** Amendments. The parties may amend this Agreement only by a writing signed by all the Parties.
- 8.4 <u>Assignment and Subcontracting.</u> City and Consultant recognize and agree that this Agreement contemplates personal performance by Consultant and is based upon a determination of Consultant's unique personal competence, experience, and specialized personal knowledge. Moreover, a substantial inducement to City for entering into this Agreement was and is the professional reputation and competence of Consultant. Consultant may not assign this Agreement or any interest therein without the prior written approval of the Contract Administrator. Consultant shall not subcontract any portion of the performance contemplated and provided for herein, other than to the subcontractors noted in the proposal, without prior written approval of the Contract Administrator.
- **8.5 Survival.** All obligations arising prior to the termination of this Agreement and all provisions of this Agreement allocating liability between City and Consultant shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- **8.6** Options upon Breach by Consultant. If Consultant materially breaches any of the terms of this Agreement, City's remedies shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - **8.6.1** Immediately terminate the Agreement;
- **8.6.2** Retain the plans, specifications, drawings, reports, design documents, and any other work product prepared by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement; and/or
- **8.6.3** Retain a different consultant to complete the work described in Exhibit A not finished by Consultant in which case the City may charge Consultant the difference between the cost to have a different consultant complete the work described in Exhibit A that is unfinished at the time of breach and the amount that City would have paid Consultant pursuant to Section 2 if Consultant had completed the work.

SECTION 9. KEEPING AND STATUS OF RECORDS.

- **9.1** Records Created as Part of Consultant's Performance. All reports, data, maps, models, charts, studies, surveys, photographs, memoranda, plans, studies, specifications, drawings, records, files, or any other documents or materials, in electronic or any other form, that Consultant prepares or obtains pursuant to this Agreement and that relate to the matters covered hereunder shall be the property of the City. Consultant hereby agrees to deliver those documents to the City upon termination of the Agreement. It is understood and agreed that the documents and other materials, including but not limited to those described above, prepared pursuant to this Agreement are prepared specifically for the City and are not necessarily suitable for any future or other use.
- **9.2** Confidentiality. All reports, data, maps, models, charts, studies, surveys, photographs, memoranda, plans, studies, specifications, records, files, or any other documents or materials, in electronic or any other form, that Consultant prepares or obtains pursuant to this Agreement and that relate to the matters covered hereunder shall be kept confidential by Consultant. Such materials shall not, without the

prior written permission of City, be used by Consultant for any purpose other than the performance of this Agreement nor shall such materials be disclosed publicly. Nothing furnished to Consultant which is generally known, shall be deemed confidential. Consultant shall not use the City's name or logo or photographs pertaining to the Services under this Agreement in any publication without the prior written consent of the City.

- 9.3 <u>Consultant's Books and Records.</u> Consultant shall maintain any and all ledgers, books of account, invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other records or documents evidencing or relating to charges for Services or expenditures and disbursements charged to the City under this Agreement for a minimum of three (3) years, or for any longer period required by law, from the date of final payment to the Consultant.
- 9.4 <u>Inspection and Audit of Records.</u> Any records or documents that Section 9.2 of this Agreement requires Consultant to maintain shall be made available for inspection, audit, and/or copying at any time during regular business hours, upon oral or written request of the City. Under California Government Code Section 8546.7, if the amount of public funds expended under this Agreement exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), the Agreement shall be subject to the examination and audit of the State Auditor, at the request of City or as part of any audit of City, for a period of three (3) years after final payment under the Agreement.
- 9.5 Intellectual Property. The City shall have and retain all right, title and interest, including copyright, patent, trade secret or other proprietary rights in all plans, specifications, studies, drawings, estimates, materials, data, computer programs or software and source code, enhancements, documents and any other works of authorship fixed in any tangible medium or expression, including but not limited to physical drawings or other data magnetically or otherwise recorded on computer media ("Intellectual Property") prepared or developed by or on behalf of Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant further grants to City a non-exclusive and perpetual license to copy, use, modify or sub-license any and all Intellectual Property otherwise owned by Consultant which is the basis or foundation for any derivative, collective, insurrectional or supplemental work created under this Agreement.
- SECTION 10. CALVIP ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS. Consultant acknowledges that this Agreement, the Services and payments thereunder are funded through the California Violence Intervention Program ("CalVIP") administered by the State of California Board of State and Community Corrections ("BSCC") and are subject to the requirements, restrictions, and limitations of CalVIP and BSCC grant funding. By executing this Agreement, Consultant hereby agrees to comply with all terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, which include by reference all guidance, regulations and requirements of BSCC that are applicable to a recipient of a CalVIP grant and the additional terms and conditions attached as Exhibit C and incorporated herein. Consultant further agrees to cooperate with the City by timely providing information and documentation required by the Agreement or requested by the City in furtherance of its obligations as a CalVIP grantee.

SECTION 11. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

11.1 <u>Venue.</u> In the event either party brings any action against the other under this Agreement, the Parties agree that trial of such action shall be vested exclusively in the state courts of California in the County of Contra Costa or in the United States District Court for the Northern District of California.

- 11.2 <u>Severability.</u> If a court of competent jurisdiction finds or rules that any provision of this Agreement is invalid, void, or unenforceable, the provisions of this Agreement not so adjudged shall remain in full force and effect. The invalidity in whole or in part of any provision of this Agreement shall not void or affect the validity of any other provision of this Agreement.
- 11.3 <u>No Implied Waiver of Breach.</u> The waiver of any breach of a specific provision of this Agreement does not constitute a waiver of any other breach of that term or any other term of this Agreement.
- **11.4 Successors and Assigns.** The provisions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall apply to and bind the successors and assigns of the Parties.
- 11.5 <u>Use of Recycled Products.</u> Consultant shall prepare and submit all reports, written studies and other printed material on recycled paper to the extent it is available at equal or less cost than virgin paper.
- **11.6** Conflict of Interest. Consultant may serve other clients, but none whose activities within the corporate limits of City or whose business, regardless of location, would place Consultant in a "conflict of interest," as that term is defined in the Political Reform Act, codified at California Government Code Section 81000 *et seq.*

Consultant shall not employ any official of City in the work performed pursuant to this Agreement. No officer or employee of City shall have any financial interest in this Agreement that would violate California Government Code Section 1090 *et seq.*

Consultant hereby warrants that it is not now, nor has it been in the previous twelve (12) months, an employee, agent, appointee, or official of the City. If Consultant was an employee, agent, appointee, or official of City in the previous twelve months, Consultant warrants that it did not participate in any manner in the forming of this Agreement. Consultant understands that, if this Agreement is made in violation of Government Code § 1090 et. seq., the entire Agreement is void and Consultant will not be entitled to any compensation for Services performed pursuant to this Agreement, including reimbursement of expenses, and Consultant will be required to reimburse the City for any sums paid to the Consultant. Consultant understands that, in addition to the foregoing, it may be subject to criminal prosecution for a violation of Government Code Section 1090 and, if applicable, will be disqualified from holding public office in the State of California.

- 11.7 <u>Inconsistent Terms.</u> If the terms or provisions of this Agreement conflict with or are inconsistent with any term or provision of any Exhibit attached hereto, then the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall prevail.
- **11.8 Solicitation.** Consultant agrees not to solicit business at any meeting, focus group, or interview related to this Agreement, either orally or through any written materials.
- **11.9** <u>Contract Administration.</u> This Agreement shall be administered by Monserrat Cabral ("Contract Administrator"). All correspondence shall be directed to or through the Contract Administrator or his or her designee.

- Participation in bi-annual "Community of Practice" retreats with UCB Evaluator and State/National partners.
- Quarterly coaching sessions with AP Antioch team.
- Meetings with City staff and program partners, as needed.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT & IMPLEMENTATION Support

- Assist with the identification, assessment, selection, engagement and enrollment of Peacemaker Fellows.
- Support program buildout including street outreach, branding, risk mitigation, infrastructure, and strategic communications.

- Provide on-going guidance, tools and resources needed for the effective implementation of the Peacemaker Fellowship.
- Cultivate capacity of local service providers and public systems to better serve target population.
- Develop protocols for law enforcement and staff interactions.
- Provide support in the development of new policies and procedures responsive to local needs and dynamics.
- Help educate and inform public systems, philanthropy, clergy, media and community about the rationale and mechanics of gun violence reduction.
- Help the City build on its existing infrastructure of gun violence reduction activity and explore integration of the Advance Peace strategy into its long-term strategic plan.
- Support additional fund development to solidify and promote program sustainability.

LEARNING and EVALUATION Support (Revised)

All Advance Peace Antioch evaluation activities will be performed by the UC Berkeley, Center for Global Healthy Cities, through a subaward with Advance Peace. Thus, the evaluation contract should be issued to Advance Peace. The Advance Peace evaluation activities will consist of:

- Updating the Human Subject, Institutional Review Board (IRB) protocols through the UC Berkeley, Committee for Protection of Human Subjects, to ensure all outreach data collection remains confidential:
- Update all informed consent forms, scripts and data confidentiality agreements for the Peacemaker Fellowship, including all outreach workers and participants, called Fellows;
- Draft a Local Evaluation Plan (LEP) consistent with CalVIP requirements; reviewed and approved by City of Antioch, Department of Community Resources & Public Safety;
- Create specific informed consent forms, scripts and data confidentiality protections for Antioch data collection;
- Draft Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with City of Antioch Police Department, to obtain at least 5 years of gun crime data (187a & 245a2) and associated demographic and spatial information, for baseline crime analyses. MOU will specify that UC Berkely will receive monthly gun crime data from City of Antioch PD for the duration of the grant/project and at least 6 months after date of completion, in order to complete analyses of any changes in gun crime;
- Analyze historic/baseline data of city firearm homicide and assault data, along with additional citylevel data as needed for analyses (i.e., US census demographics, police beat, council district shape files, etc.);
- Create secure, encrypted, electronic data sharing protocol using cloud storage (i.e., Dropbox) for local Police Department to share crime data;
- Use descriptive statistics, time-series analyses, & spatial mapping to analyze any change in the number & rate of gun violence over project period;
- Update AP data collection portal/software (apdata.org) for use in Antioch & used by all outreach workers, & create Advance Peace Antioch NCA and Administrative user permissions;
- Update and manage cloud database storage of all outreach worker and Peacemaker Fellowship participant data;
- Deliver two trainings per year to Advance Peace Antioch staff on data collection methods and use of apdata.org system;

- Conduct one interview and one focus group with Advance Peace Antioch Advance Peace outreach worker staff to understand program fidelity and contribute to process evaluation data gathering;
- Generate a six-month and annual data report (once outreach work commences) for the Advance Peace Antioch program, and share these reports with Antioch program leadership;
- Support quarterly CalVIP reporting by City of Antioch program leaders by offering participant/client data:
- Generate one report at the conclusion of the Advance Peace Peacemaker Fellowship in Antioch, satisfying the CalVIP Local Evaluation Plan.

Cost: \$240,000 - Advance Peace

\$120,000 – UC Berkeley Evaluation Services as stated above

\$75,000 – Licensing of UCB Data Collection Portal

Compensation

City will provide compensation to Consultant in the amount of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) on an annual basis. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in Consultant's Proposal, Consultant will submit to City an invoice for 100% of Consultant's compensation amount for the first year this Agreement upon execution of the Agreement. Consultant will submit invoices each anniversary thereof for the compensation amount applicable to the following year or portion of the year remaining in the term of the Agreement, as applicable_

The Contract Administrator, in its sole discretion, may authorize in advance and in writing the reallocation of funds described in this Payment Schedule, except in no case shall any authorization increase the amount authorized for by Section 2 of the Agreement for the term of the Agreement or conflict with the City's obligations under the CalVIP program.

EXHIBIT B CALVIP ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

To the extent the terms and conditions below conflict with any other term of the Agreement, the terms and conditions below shall prevail.

General Terms and Conditions

- 1. AUDIT: Consultant agrees that the City, BSCC, the Department of General Services, the Bureau of State Audits, or their designated representative shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this Agreement. Consultant agrees to maintain such records for possible audit for a minimum of three (3) years after final payment, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated. Consultant agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, Consultant agrees to include a similar right of the State to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to performance of this Agreement. (Gov. Code §8546.7, Pub. Contract Code §10115 et seq., CCR Title 2, Section 1896).
- 2. **DISPUTES:** Consultant shall continue with the responsibilities under this Agreement during any dispute.
- 3. TERMINATION FOR CAUSE: The City may terminate this Agreement and be relieved of any payments should the Consultant fail to perform the requirements of this Agreement at the time and in the manner herein provided. In the event of such termination the City may proceed with the work in any manner deemed proper by the City. All costs to the City shall be deducted from any sum due the Consultant under this Agreement and the balance, if any, shall be paid to the Consultant upon demand.
- 4. RECYCLING CERTIFICATION: Upon request by the City, Consultant shall certify in writing under penalty of perjury, the minimum, if not exact, percentage of post-consumer material as defined in the Public Contract Code Section 12200, in products, materials, goods, or supplies offered or sold to the State regardless of whether the product meets the requirements of Public Contract Code Section 12209. With respect to printer or duplication cartridges that comply with the requirements of Section 12156(e), the certification required by this subdivision shall specify that the cartridges so comply (Pub. Contract Code §12205).
- 5. NON-DISCRIMINATION CLAUSE: During the performance of this Agreement, Consultant and its subcontractors shall not deny the contract's benefits to any person on the basis of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status, nor shall they discriminate unlawfully against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status. Consultant shall insure that the evaluation and treatment of employees and applicants for employment are free of such

discrimination. Consultant and subcontractors shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Gov. Code §12900 et seq.), the regulations promulgated thereunder (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, §11000 et seq.), the provisions of Article 9.5, Chapter 1, Part 1, Division 3, Title 2 of the Government Code (Gov. Code §§11135-11139.5), and the regulations or standards adopted by the awarding state agency to implement such article. Consultant shall permit access by representatives of the Department of Fair Employment and Housing and the awarding state agency upon reasonable notice at any time during the normal business hours, but in no case less than 24 hours' notice, to such of its books, records, accounts, and all other sources of information and its facilities as said Department or Agency shall require to ascertain compliance with this clause. Consultant and its subcontractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other agreement. (See Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, §11105.)

Consultant shall include the nondiscrimination and compliance provisions of this clause in all subcontracts to perform work under the Agreement.

LOSS LEADER:** If this contract involves the furnishing of equipment, materials, or supplies then the following statement is incorporated: It is unlawful for any person engaged in business within this state to sell or use any article or product as a "loss leader" as defined in Section 17030 of the Business and Professions Code. (PCC 10344(e).)

Special Terms and Conditions

1. DEBARMENT, FRAUD, THEFT OR EMBEZZLEMENT

Consultant must have on file with the BSCC a completed and signed Certification of Compliance with BSCC Policies on Debarment, Fraud, Theft and Embezzlement.

2. UNION ACTIVITIES

Consultant acknowledges that applicability of Government Code §§16654 through 16649 to this Agreement and agrees to the following:

- A. No State funds received under the Agreement will be used to assist, promote or deter union organizing.
- B. Consultant will not, for any business conducted under the Agreement, use any State property to hold meetings with employees or supervisors, if the purpose of such meetings is to assist, promote or deter union organizing, unless the State property is equally available to the general public for holding meetings.
- C. If Consultant incurs costs or makes expenditures to assist, promote or deter union organizing, Consultant will maintain records sufficient to show that no reimbursement from State funds has been sought for these costs, and that Subgrantee shall provide those records to the Attorney General upon request.

3. WAIVER

The parties hereto may waive any of their rights under this Agreement unless such waiver is contrary to law, provided that any such waiver shall be in writing and signed by the party making such waiver.

SUBJECT: Extension of Banking Services Contract with Bank of the West for

Five Years

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt a resolution approving an extension of the banking services contract with Bank of the West for five years.

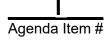
FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated cost of banking services is already included in the fiscal year 2023 budget and draft fiscal year 2023-25 budget. The five-year cost of this contract has the potential to cost \$588,804; however, the earnings credit rate (ECR) of .75% provided to the City by Bank of the West will be used to offset fees incurred. Since our initial contract term began in August 2010, the City has had all banking depository fees, other than quarterly custodial/safekeeping services, offset by the ECR.

DISCUSSION

In 2010 the City entered into a banking services contract with Bank of the West. The contract expired in August 2016 and was extended an additional five years via Resolution 2016/71 and has been maintained on a month-to-month basis since the formal contract expiration in 2021 due to the City obtaining a line of credit/installment sales agreement ("LOC") from the bank for the Brackish Water Project which has now been paid off. Since the LOC has now been formally paid off, the City is in need of negotiating a new contract for banking services. City staff is recommending extending this contract for an additional five years for the following reasons:

- Bank of the West has agreed to honor the existing pricing structure and increase the ECR from .70% to .75% for an additional five years, which means more credit earned to offset fees and additional services with no additional financial impact beyond what the City has been budgeting for.
- The City has not paid any banking services fees to Bank of the West since 2010, other than custodial/safekeeping services, due to the ECR provided to the City by Bank of the West. With Bank of the West increasing the ECR for the next five



years, it is likely the fees will continue to be entirely offset or significantly covered by the ECR.

- With this contract extension, custodial/safekeeping services can now be covered with ECR on the account, resulting in \$5,500 a year savings to the City.
- City Finance staff are extremely impressed and happy with the customer service provided since 2010. Bank of the West is very responsive to our needs and keeps in regular contact with staff about any new services they may assist the City with.
- It is an extremely arduous task for the City to change banking providers due to the volume of transactions processed and ACH and wire information the City has set up with the State and various vendors.
- Due to increased regulatory requirements for government banking, the field has significantly narrowed for those banks that provide banking services to government entities and Bank of the West has committed to continue serving government clients.

Below is a summary that outlines the potential monthly fees for Bank of the West that the City could be charged for (based on current volumes and will fluctuate) that is expected to be fully offset with account earnings:

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt a resolution accepting the third amendment to the East County Water Management Association Agreement.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact.

DISCUSSION

In 1997, the East County Water Management Association (ECWMA) Agreement established an organized group to discuss and decide important matters concerning water management. Antioch, Brentwood, Pittsburg, and the associated sanitation and water districts, as well as the unincorporated areas in the region are parties to the agreement. The City of Antioch has participated in regular semiannual meetings since the formation of the ECWMA.

On October 28, 2010, the City Council approved the first amendment to this agreement which added the Habitat Conservancy as a participating entity, as well as updated the names of participating organizations. The first amendment also expanded the purpose of the ECWMA to include providing guidance for the East Contra Costa County Functionality Equivalent Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Plan in order to authorize approval of the addition of projects to the IRWM Plan.

On January 12, 2021, the City Council approved a second amendment to the ECWMA Agreement to create a process for the ECWMA to add member agencies in the future without having to amend the agreement. This reduced the delay in new members being added and the burden of reviewing further agreement amendments due to these additions.

This third amendment to the ECWMA Agreement adds the Bethel Island Municipal Improvement District as a party to the ECWMA Agreement; changes the name of the existing party Contra Costa County to Contra Costa County Water Agency; provides a procedure for adding new members; and authorizes each member agency to designate its Manager to act as an alternate of the Governing Board Representative who may vote on behalf of the member agency in the absence of the Governing Board Representative.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO THE EAST COUNTY WATER MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION AGREEMENT

This is Amendment No. 2 to the East County Water Management Association Agreement ("ECWMA Agreement") dated March 20, 1997, by and among the Cities of Brentwood, Antioch, and Pittsburg, Contra Costa County Water Agency, Byron-Bethany Irrigation District, Delta Diablo Sanitation District, Diablo Water District, East Contra Costa Irrigation District, Ironhouse Sanitation District, Town of Discovery Bay Community Services District, Contra Costa Water District, and East Contra Costa County Habitat Conservancy (collectively, "parties" or "member agencies"). Amendment No. 1 was entered into by the parties on October 28, 2010. All of the parties to the ECWMA Agreement and Amendment No. 1 are also parties to this Amendment No. 2.

RECITALS

A. The purpose of this Amendment No. 2 is to: 1) add the Bethel Island Municipal Improvement District as a party to the ECWMA Agreement; 2) to change the name of the existing party Contra Costa County in Amendment No. 1 back to Contra Costa County Water Agency; 3) to amend ECWMA's administrative procedures; 4) provide a procedure for adding new members; and 5) authorize each member agency to designate its Manager to act as an alternate of the Governing Board Representative who may vote on behalf of the member agency in the absence of the Governing Board Representative.

AGREEMENT

- 1. <u>Effective Date</u>. The Effective Date of this Amendment No. 2 is May 1, 2023.
- 2. <u>Parties as of Effective Date</u>. As of the Effective Date of this Amendment No. 2, the parties to the ECWMA Agreement are the Cities of Brentwood, Antioch, and Pittsburg, Contra Costa County Water Agency, Byron-Bethany Irrigation District, Delta Diablo Sanitation District, Diablo Water District, East Contra Costa Irrigation District, Ironhouse Sanitation District, Town



of Discovery Bay Community Services District, Contra Costa Water District, East Contra Costa County Habitat Conservancy, and Bethel Island Municipal Improvement District.

- 3. Section 3 of the ECWMA Agreement, "Governing Board Representatives (GBR)" is amended to incorporate the following *italicized* additions:
 - 3. Governing Board Representatives (GBR). The ECWMA shall be governed and operated by the GBR which shall be comprised of one elected official representative from each member agency. The governing body of each member agency shall designate, and may replace, one of its members as its representative, on the GBR. No individual shall serve as the representative of more than two member agencies. Each agency shall have one vote on the GBR. All actions of the GBR shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of its members, except for the addition of new members, which requires unanimous approval. Each member agency may designate its Manager to act as an alternate in place of the member agency's GBR. If a GBR for a member agency is not present at a meeting, the designated Manager may vote on behalf of the agency.

The GBR shall provide policy guidance in the implementation of the purposes of the ECWMA and authorize disbursement of funds in accordance with this Agreement.

The GBR shall choose a regular meeting date and shall meet at least semiannually.

The GBR shall appoint one of its members as the Chair and one as Vice-Chair. The Chair or any three members of the GBR may call a special meeting. A Secretary shall also be appointed by the GBR. The term of office for the Chair, Vice-chair and Secretary shall be for two years.

The GBR shall be authorized to hold a vote to add a new member agency(ies) to the ECWMA at both regular and special meetings. The following conditions must be met for a new member agency to be added to the ECWMA:

AH

- (1) Approval. The addition of a new member agency shall require the unanimous approval of the current member agencies' GBRs and an amendment to the ECWMA.
- (2) Annual Deposit. Within 30 days of receiving the affirmative vote of the GBR members, the new member agency must deposit \$500 with the Treasurer for the ECWMA. Thereafter, the member agency must deposit an additional \$500 by March 1 of each year as outlined in Section 6 of the ECWMA Agreement.
- (3) Commencement of Membership. Within 90 days after the Treasurer for the ECWMA receives the newly approved member agency's initial \$500 deposit, an amendment to this Agreement acknowledging the added membership must be executed by the new member agency and all existing member agencies.

The meetings of the GBR shall be open to the public, noticed, and conducted in accordance with the Brown Act, Government Code Section 54950 et seq.

- 4. Section 5 of the ECWMA Agreement, "Administrative Procedures," is deleted in its entirety and replaced with Section 5 [RESERVED].
- 5. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. In the event of a conflict with the ECWMA Agreement or Amendment No. 1, or this Amendment No. 2, the terms of this Amendment No. 2 shall prevail over anything to the contrary in the ECWMA Agreement or Amendment No. 1. In all other respects the ECWMA Agreement, Amendment No. 1, and this Amendment No. 2 will be the entire agreement among the parties construed together as one and the same agreement.
- 6. <u>Effect</u>. Except for the amendments agreed to herein, the above referenced ECWMA Agreement remains in full force and effect.

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- 7. <u>Counterparts</u>: This Amendment may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 8. <u>Signatures</u>: The following signatures attest each member agency's agreement hereto.

Engineering for On-Call Inspection Services

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the resolution:

- 1. Approving the Consulting Services Agreements with Coastland and Park Engineering to provide on-call inspection services in substantially the form attached as Exhibits "1" and "2", respectively to the Resolution (Attachment "A");
- 2. Allocating \$400,000 for on-call inspection services for a period of one year; and
- 3. Authorizing the Finance Director to make any necessary changes to the fiscal year 2023 budget.

FISCAL IMPACT

Adoption of this resolution will allocate \$400,000 for on-call inspection services. Funding for this work will be provided from various funding sources corresponding to the projects that inspection services are performed. It is anticipated that this recommendation will have no impact to the General Fund.

DISCUSSION

In February of 2023, staff solicited qualifications from several consulting firms, twenty plan rooms and posted on the City website, for performing on-call construction inspection services to assist the City's three Public Works Inspectors. This work includes overseeing encroachment permit projects; monitoring the construction of improvements within new subdivisions; inspecting installation of underground utility facilities; draft punch lists and perform final inspections.

In March of 2023, eight (8) statements of qualifications were received from Bellecci of Concord, Coastland of Pleasant Hill, Interwest of Elk Grove, MNS Engineers of Antioch, Park Engineering of Orinda, Salaber Associates of Rancho Cordova, Shiels Sowko Consultants of Oakland and Unico Engineering of Concord. Based on the qualifications

submitted, Coastland and Park Engineering are determined to be most qualified to provide the services required by the City.

Construction activities continue to thrive throughout the City. The projected quantity of work will exceed what can be properly monitored by the City's current inspection personnel. In order to continue to provide high level inspection services, Staff is recommending approval of the Consulting Services Agreements with Coastland and Park Engineering, and an allocation of \$400,000 to perform on-call inspection services for a period of one year.

EXHIBIT "1"

CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ANTIOCH AND COASTLAND CIVIL ENGINEERING FOR ON-CALL CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this 25th day of April, 2023 ("Effective Date") by and between the City of Antioch, a municipal Corporation with its principle place of business at 200 H Street, Antioch, CA 94509 ("City") and Coastland Civil Engineering with its principle place of business at 3478 Buskirk Avenue, Suite 1000, Pleasant Hill, CA 94523 ("Consultant"). City and Consultant individually are sometimes referred to herein as "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

- <u>SECTION 1.</u> <u>SERVICES.</u> Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, Consultant shall furnish all technical and professional services including labor, material, equipment, transportation, supervision and expertise to provide to City the services described in the Scope of Work attached as <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto and incorporated herein at the time and place and in the manner specified therein ("Services"). In the event of a conflict in or inconsistency between the terms of this Agreement and <u>Exhibit A</u>, the Agreement shall prevail.
- 1.1 <u>Term of Services.</u> The term of this Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date and shall end on <u>April 25, 2026</u>, the date of completion specified in <u>Exhibit A</u>, and Consultant shall complete the Services described in <u>Exhibit A</u> prior to that date, unless the term of the Agreement is otherwise terminated or extended, as provided for in Section 8. The time provided to Consultant to complete the Services required by this Agreement shall not affect the City's right to terminate the Agreement, under Section 8.
- 1.2 <u>Standard of Performance.</u> Consultant represents that it is experienced in providing these services to public clients and is familiar with the plans and needs of City. Consultant shall perform all Services required pursuant to this Agreement in the manner and according to the standards observed by a competent practitioner of the profession in which Consultant is engaged in the geographical area in which Consultant practices its profession.
- 1.3 <u>Assignment of Personnel.</u> Consultant shall assign only competent personnel to perform Services pursuant to this Agreement. In the event that City, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this Agreement, desires the reassignment of any such persons, Consultant shall, immediately upon receiving notice from City of such desire of City, reassign such person or persons.
- 1.4 <u>Time.</u> Consultant shall devote such time to the performance of Services pursuant to this Agreement as may be reasonably necessary to meet the standard of performance provided in Section 1.1 above and to satisfy Consultant's obligations hereunder.
- <u>For Services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and in the manner set forth below.</u>

 Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) notwithstanding any contrary indications that may be contained in Consultant's proposal, for Services to be performed and reimbursable costs incurred under this Agreement. In the event of a conflict between this Agreement and Consultant's proposal, attached as Exhibit A, regarding the amount of compensation, the Agreement shall prevail. City shall pay Consultant for Services rendered pursuant to this Agreement at the time and in the manner set forth below. The payments specified below shall be the only payments from City to Consultant for Services rendered



pursuant to this Agreement. Except as specifically authorized by City, Consultant shall not bill City for duplicate services performed by more than one person.

Consultant and City acknowledge and agree that compensation paid by City to Consultant under this Agreement is based upon Consultant's estimated costs of providing the Services required hereunder, including salaries and benefits of employees and subcontractors of Consultant. Consequently, the Parties further agree that compensation hereunder is intended to include the costs of contributions to any pensions and/or annuities to which Consultant and its employees, agents, and subcontractors may be eligible. City therefore has no responsibility for such contributions beyond compensation required under this Agreement.

- **2.1** <u>Invoices.</u> Consultant shall submit invoices, not more often than once a month during the term of this Agreement, based on the cost for Services performed and reimbursable costs incurred prior to the invoice date. Invoices shall contain the following information:
 - Serial identifications of progress bills; i.e., Progress Bill No. 1 for the first invoice, etc.:
 - The beginning and ending dates of the billing period;
 - A Task Summary containing the original contract amount, the amount of prior billings, the total due this period, the balance available under the Agreement, and the percentage of completion;
 - At City's option, for each work item in each task, a copy of the applicable time entries or time sheets shall be submitted showing the name of the person doing the work, the hours spent by each person, a brief description of the work, and each reimbursable expense;
 - The total number of hours of work performed under the Agreement by Consultant and each employee, agent, and subcontractor of Consultant performing services; and,
 - The Consultant's signature.

2.2 Payment Schedule.

- **2.2.1** City shall make incremental payments, based on invoices received, for Services satisfactorily performed, in accordance with the requirements of this Agreement, and for authorized reimbursable costs incurred. City shall have thirty (30) days from the receipt of an invoice that complies with all of the requirements of Section 2.1 to pay Consultant.
- 2.3 <u>Total Payment.</u> City shall pay for the Services to be rendered by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement. City shall not pay any additional sum for any expense or cost whatsoever incurred by Consultant in rendering Services pursuant to this Agreement, unless expressly provided for in Section 2.5.

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In no event shall Consultant submit any invoice for an amount in excess of the maximum amount of compensation provided above either for a task or for the entire Agreement, unless the Agreement is modified prior to the submission of such an invoice by a properly executed change order or amendment.

- **2.4 Hourly Fees.** Fees for work performed by Consultant are on an hourly basis.
- **2.5 Reimbursable Expenses.** There are no reimbursable expenses under this Agreement.
- **2.6** Payment of Taxes. Consultant is solely responsible for the payment of employment taxes incurred under this Agreement and any similar federal or state taxes.
- 2.7 <u>Authorization to Perform Services.</u> The Consultant is not authorized to perform any Services or incur any costs whatsoever under the terms of this Agreement until Consultant receives authorization to proceed from the Contract Administrator.
- **SECTION 3. FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT.** Except as set forth herein, Consultant shall, at its sole cost and expense, provide all facilities and equipment that may be necessary to perform the Services required by this Agreement. City shall make available to Consultant only the facilities and equipment listed in this section, and only under the terms and conditions set forth herein.

City shall furnish physical facilities such as desks, filing cabinets, and conference space, as may be reasonably necessary for Consultant's use while consulting with City employees and reviewing records and the information in possession of the City. The location, quantity, and time of furnishing those facilities shall be in the sole discretion of City. In no event shall City be obligated to furnish any facility that may involve incurring any direct expense, including but not limited to computer, long-distance telephone or other communication charges, vehicles, and reproduction facilities.

- SECTION 4. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS. Before beginning any work under this Agreement, Consultant, at its own cost and expense, shall procure insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property that may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work by the Consultant and its agents, representatives, employees, and subcontractors. Consultant shall provide proof satisfactory to City of such insurance that meets the requirements of this section and under forms of insurance satisfactory in all respects to the City. Consultant shall maintain the insurance policies required by this section throughout the term of this Agreement. The cost of such insurance shall be included in the Consultant's proposal. Consultant shall not allow any subcontractor to commence work on any subcontract until Consultant has obtained all insurance required herein for the subcontractor(s) and provided evidence thereof to City. Verification of the required insurance shall be submitted and made part of this Agreement prior to execution. Insurers shall have an AM Best rating of no less than A:VII unless otherwise accepted by the City in writing:
- 4.1 Commercial General Liability (CGL). Insurance Services Office Form CG 00 01 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products and completed operations, property damage, bodily injury and personal & advertising injury with limits no less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit. If Consultant's services include work within 50 feet of a railroad right of way, the Consultant shall have removed any exclusion on their liability policy limiting coverage for work near a railroad, or shall provide a Railroad Protective Liability policy in favor of the City. Limits for such coverage shall be no less than \$5,000,000.

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- 4.2 <u>Automobile Liability Insurance.</u> ISO Form Number CA 00 01 covering any auto (Code 1), or if Consultant has no owned autos, hired, (Code 8) and non-owned autos (Code 9), with limit no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
- 4.3 <u>Workers' Compensation Insurance.</u> Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the State of California, with Statutory Limits, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limit of no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.
- **4.4** Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions). Insurance appropriate to the Consultant's profession, with limit no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence or claim, \$2,000,000 aggregate.
- **4.5** Other Insurance Provisions. Unless otherwise specified below, all insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:
- **4.5.1** Additional Insured Status. The City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Consultant including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. CGL coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Consultant's insurance (at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or if not available, through the addition of both CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 if a later edition is used). This requirement shall only apply to the CGL and Automobile Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.2** *Primary Coverage.* For any claims related to this contract, the Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it. This requirement shall only apply to the CGL and Automobile Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.3** *Notice of Cancellation.* Each insurance policy required above shall provide that coverage shall not be canceled, except with notice to the City.
- **4.5.4** Waiver of Subrogation. Consultant hereby grants to City a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of said Consultant may acquire against the City by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Consultant agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the City has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer. This requirement shall only apply to the CGL, Automobile Liability and Workers' Compensation/Employer's Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.5** Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the City. The City may require the Consultant to purchase coverage with a lower deductible or retention or provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses within the retention.
- **4.5.6** Claims made policies. If any of the required policies provide claims-made coverage:



- **4.5.6.1** The Retroactive Date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work.
- 4.5.6.2 Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract of work.
- **4.5.6.3** If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a Retroactive Date prior to the contract effective date, the Consultant must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of contract work.
- 4.6 Certificate of Insurance and Endorsements. Consultant shall furnish the City with original certificates and amendatory endorsements or copies of the applicable policy language effecting coverage required by this clause. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the City before work commences. However, failure to obtain the required documents prior to the work beginning shall not waive the Consultant's obligation to provide them. The City reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by these specifications, at any time.
- 4.7 <u>Subcontractors.</u> Consultant shall include all subcontractors as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated in this Agreement, including but not limited to naming additional insureds.
- 4.8 <u>Higher Limits.</u> If the Consultant maintains higher limits than the minimums shown above, the City requires and shall be entitled to coverage for the higher limits maintained by the Consultant. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the City.
- 4.9 <u>Special Risks or Circumstances.</u> City reserves the right to modify these requirements, including limits, based on the nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage or other special circumstances.
- **4.10** Remedies. In addition to any other remedies City may have if Consultant fails to provide or maintain any insurance policies or policy endorsements to the extent and within the time herein required, City may, at its sole option exercise, any of the following remedies, which are alternatives to other remedies City may have and are not the exclusive remedy for Consultant's breach:
 - Obtain such insurance and deduct and retain the amount of the premiums for such insurance from any sums due to Consultant under the Agreement;
 - Order Consultant to stop work under this Agreement or withhold any payment that becomes due to Consultant hereunder, or both stop work and withhold any payment, until Consultant demonstrates compliance with the requirements hereof; and/or,
 - Terminate this Agreement.

SECTION 5. INDEMNIFICATION AND CONSULTANT'S RESPONSIBILITIES.

- 5.1 To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall defend (with counsel reasonably acceptable to City), indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees, volunteers, and agents free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, costs, expenses, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, in law or equity, to property or persons, including wrongful death, in any manner arising out of, pertaining to, or incident to any acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Consultant, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, consultants or agents in connection with the performance of the Consultant's services or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all damages, expert witness fees and attorney's fees and other related costs and expenses. Consultant's obligation to indemnify shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by Consultant, the City, its officials, officers, employees, agents, or volunteers.
- **5.1.1** Acceptance by City of insurance certificates and endorsements required under this Agreement does not relieve Consultant from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. This indemnification and hold harmless clause shall apply to any damages or claims for damages whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to apply.
- 5.2 By execution of this Agreement, Consultant acknowledges and agrees to the provisions of this Section and that it is a material element of consideration, and that these provisions survive the termination of this Agreement.

SECTION 6. STATUS OF CONSULTANT.

- 6.1 Independent Contractor. At all times during the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall be an independent contractor and shall not be an employee of City. City shall have the right to control Consultant only insofar as the results of Consultant's services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and assignment of personnel pursuant to Section 1.3; however, otherwise City shall not have the right to control the manner or means by which Consultant accomplishes services rendered pursuant to this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other City, state, or federal policy, rule, regulation, law, or ordinance to the contrary, Consultant and any of its employees, agents, and subcontractors providing services under this Agreement shall not qualify for or become entitled to, and hereby agree to waive any and all claims to, any compensation, benefit, or any incident of employment by City, including, but not limited to, eligibility to enroll in the California Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) as an employee of City and entitlement to any contribution to be paid by City for employer contributions and/or employee contributions for PERS benefits.
- **6.2** Consultant Not Agent. Except as City may specify in writing, Consultant shall have no authority, express or implied, to act on behalf of City in any capacity whatsoever as an agent. Consultant shall have no authority, express or implied, pursuant to this Agreement to bind City to any obligation whatsoever.

SECTION 7. LEGAL REQUIREMENTS.

- 7.1 Governing Law. The laws of the State of California shall govern this Agreement.
- 7.2 <u>Compliance with Applicable Laws.</u> Consultant and any subcontractors shall comply with all laws applicable to the performance of the Services.



- 7.3 Other Governmental Regulations. To the extent that this Agreement may be funded by fiscal assistance from another governmental entity, Consultant and any subcontractors shall comply with all applicable rules and regulations to which City is bound by the terms of such fiscal assistance program.
- 7.4 <u>Licenses and Permits.</u> Consultant represents and warrants to City that Consultant and its employees, agents, and any subcontractors have all licenses, permits, qualifications, and approvals of whatsoever nature that are legally required to practice their respective professions. Consultant represents and warrants to City that Consultant and its employees, agents, any subcontractors shall, at their sole cost and expense, keep in effect at all times during the term of this Agreement any licenses, permits, and approvals that are legally required to practice their respective professions. In addition to the foregoing, Consultant and any subcontractors shall obtain and maintain during the term of this Agreement valid business licenses from City.
- 7.5 <u>Nondiscrimination and Equal Opportunity.</u> Consultant shall not discriminate, on the basis of a person's race, religion, color, national origin, age, physical or mental handicap or disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, sexual orientation or any other legally protected status, against any employee, applicant for employment, subcontractor, bidder for a subcontract, or participant in, recipient of, or applicant for any services or programs provided by Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, policies, rules, and requirements related to equal opportunity and nondiscrimination in employment, contracting, and the provision of any Services that are the subject of this Agreement, including but not limited to the satisfaction of any positive obligations required of Consultant thereby.

Consultant shall include the provisions of this Section in any subcontract approved by the Contract Administrator or this Agreement.

California Labor Code Requirements. Consultant is aware of the requirements of 7.6 California Labor Code Sections 1720 et seg., and 1770 et seg., which require the payment of prevailing wage rates and the performance of other requirements on certain "public works" and "maintenance" projects ("Prevailing Wage Laws"). If the services are being performed as part of an applicable "public works" or "maintenance" project, as defined by the Prevailing Wage Laws, and if the total compensation is \$1,000 or more, Consultant agrees to fully comply with such Prevailing Wage Laws. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees and agents free and harmless from any claims, liabilities, costs, penalties or interest arising out of any failure or alleged failure to comply with the Prevailing Wage Laws. It shall be mandatory upon the Consultant and all subconsultants to comply with all California Labor Code provisions, which include but are not limited to prevailing wages (Labor Code Sections 1771, 1774 and 1775), employment of apprentices (Labor Code Section 1777.5), certified payroll records (Labor Code Sections 1771.4 and 1776), hours of labor (Labor Code Sections 1813 and 1815) and debarment of contractors and subcontractors (Labor Code Section 1777.1). The requirement to submit certified payroll records directly to the Labor Commissioner under Labor Code section 1771.4 shall not apply to work performed on a public works project that is exempt pursuant to the small project exemption specified in Labor Code Section 1771.4.

If the services are being performed as part of an applicable "public works" or "maintenance" project, then pursuant to Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1, the Consultant and all subconsultants performing such services must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations. Consultant shall maintain registration for the full term of this Agreement and require the same of any subconsultants, as applicable.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the contractor registration requirements mandated by Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1 shall not apply to work performed on a public works project that is exempt pursuant to the small project exemption specified in Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1.

This Agreement may also be subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations. It shall be Consultant's sole responsibility to comply with all applicable registration and labor compliance requirements. Any stop orders issued by the Department of Industrial Relations against Consultant or any subcontractor that affect Consultant's performance of services, including any delay, shall be Consultant's sole responsibility. Any delay arising out of or resulting from such stop orders shall be considered Consultant caused delay and shall not be compensable by the City. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees and agents free and harmless from any claim or liability arising out of stop orders issued by the Department of Industrial Relations against Consultant or any subcontractor.

SECTION 8. TERMINATION AND MODIFICATION.

8.1 Termination. City may cancel this Agreement at any time and without cause upon written notification to Consultant.

Consultant may cancel this Agreement only for cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to City and shall include in such notice the reasons for cancellation.

In the event of termination, Consultant shall be entitled to compensation for Services performed satisfactorily to the effective date of termination; City, however, may condition payment of such compensation upon Consultant delivering to City any or all documents, photographs, computer software, video and audio tapes, and other materials provided to Consultant or prepared by or for Consultant or the City in connection with this Agreement.

- 8.2 <u>Extension.</u> City may, in their sole and exclusive discretion, extend the end date of the term of this Agreement beyond that provided for in Section 1.1. Any such extension shall require a written amendment to this Agreement, as provided for herein. Consultant understands and agrees that, if City grants such an extension, City shall have no obligation to provide Consultant with compensation beyond the maximum amount provided for in this Agreement. Similarly, unless authorized by the Contract Administrator, City shall have no obligation to reimburse Consultant for any otherwise reimbursable expenses incurred during the extension period.
- **8.3** Amendments. The parties may amend this Agreement only by a writing signed by all the Parties.
- 8.4 Assignment and Subcontracting. City and Consultant recognize and agree that this Agreement contemplates personal performance by Consultant and is based upon a determination of Consultant's unique personal competence, experience, and specialized personal knowledge. Moreover, a substantial inducement to City for entering into this Agreement was and is the professional reputation and competence of Consultant. Consultant may not assign this Agreement or any interest therein without the prior written approval of the Contract Administrator. Consultant shall not subcontract any portion of the performance contemplated and provided for herein, other than to the subcontractors noted in the proposal, without prior written approval of the Contract Administrator.

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- **8.5** <u>Survival.</u> All obligations arising prior to the termination of this Agreement and all provisions of this Agreement allocating liability between City and Consultant shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 8.6 Options upon Breach by Consultant. If Consultant materially breaches any of the terms of this Agreement, City's remedies shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - **8.6.1** Immediately terminate the Agreement;
- **8.6.2** Retain the plans, specifications, drawings, reports, design documents, and any other work product prepared by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement; and/or
- **8.6.3** Retain a different consultant to complete the work described in <u>Exhibit A</u> not finished by Consultant in which case the City may charge Consultant the difference between the cost to have a different consultant complete the work described in <u>Exhibit A</u> that is unfinished at the time of breach and the amount that City would have paid Consultant pursuant to Section 2 if Consultant had completed the work.

SECTION 9. KEEPING AND STATUS OF RECORDS.

- 9.1 Records Created as Part of Consultant's Performance. All reports, data, maps, models, charts, studies, surveys, photographs, memoranda, plans, studies, specifications, drawings, records, files, or any other documents or materials, in electronic or any other form, that Consultant prepares or obtains pursuant to this Agreement and that relate to the matters covered hereunder shall be the property of the City. Consultant hereby agrees to deliver those documents to the City upon termination of the Agreement. It is understood and agreed that the documents and other materials, including but not limited to those described above, prepared pursuant to this Agreement are prepared specifically for the City and are not necessarily suitable for any future or other use.
- 9.2 <u>Confidentiality.</u> All reports, data, maps, models, charts, studies, surveys, photographs, memoranda, plans, studies, specifications, records, files, or any other documents or materials, in electronic or any other form, that Consultant prepares or obtains pursuant to this Agreement and that relate to the matters covered hereunder shall be kept confidential by Consultant. Such materials shall not, without the prior written permission of City, be used by Consultant for any purpose other than the performance of this Agreement nor shall such materials be disclosed publicly. Nothing furnished to Consultant which is generally known, shall be deemed confidential. Consultant shall not use the City's name or logo or photographs pertaining to the Services under this Agreement in any publication without the prior written consent of the City.
- 9.3 Consultant's Books and Records. Consultant shall maintain any and all ledgers, books of account, invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other records or documents evidencing or relating to charges for Services or expenditures and disbursements charged to the City under this Agreement for a minimum of three (3) years, or for any longer period required by law, from the date of final payment to the Consultant.
- 9.4 <u>Inspection and Audit of Records.</u> Any records or documents that Section 9.2 of this Agreement requires Consultant to maintain shall be made available for inspection, audit, and/or copying at any time during regular business hours, upon oral or written request of the City. Under California

Government Code Section 8546.7, if the amount of public funds expended under this Agreement exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), the Agreement shall be subject to the examination and audit of the State Auditor, at the request of City or as part of any audit of City, for a period of three (3) years after final payment under the Agreement.

9.5 Intellectual Property. The City shall have and retain all right, title and interest, including copyright, patent, trade secret or other proprietary rights in all plans, specifications, studies, drawings, estimates, materials, data, computer programs or software and source code, enhancements, documents and any other works of authorship fixed in any tangible medium or expression, including but not limited to physical drawings or other data magnetically or otherwise recorded on computer media ("Intellectual Property") prepared or developed by or on behalf of Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant further grants to City a non-exclusive and perpetual license to copy, use, modify or sub-license any and all Intellectual Property otherwise owned by Consultant which is the basis or foundation for any derivative, collective, insurrectional or supplemental work created under this Agreement.

SECTION 10. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

- **10.1** <u>Venue.</u> In the event either party brings any action against the other under this Agreement, the Parties agree that trial of such action shall be vested exclusively in the state courts of California in the County of Contra Costa or in the United States District Court for the Northern District of California.
- **10.2** Severability. If a court of competent jurisdiction finds or rules that any provision of this Agreement is invalid, void, or unenforceable, the provisions of this Agreement not so adjudged shall remain in full force and effect. The invalidity in whole or in part of any provision of this Agreement shall not void or affect the validity of any other provision of this Agreement.
- 10.3 <u>No Implied Waiver of Breach.</u> The waiver of any breach of a specific provision of this Agreement does not constitute a waiver of any other breach of that term or any other term of this Agreement.
- **10.4** <u>Successors and Assigns.</u> The provisions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall apply to and bind the successors and assigns of the Parties.
- 10.5 <u>Use of Recycled Products.</u> Consultant shall prepare and submit all reports, written studies and other printed material on recycled paper to the extent it is available at equal or less cost than virgin paper.
- **10.6** Conflict of Interest. Consultant may serve other clients, but none whose activities within the corporate limits of City or whose business, regardless of location, would place Consultant in a "conflict of interest," as that term is defined in the Political Reform Act, codified at California Government Code Section 81000 *et seq.*

Consultant shall not employ any official of City in the work performed pursuant to this Agreement. No officer or employee of City shall have any financial interest in this Agreement that would violate California Government Code Section 1090 *et seq.*

Consultant hereby warrants that it is not now, nor has it been in the previous twelve (12) months, an employee, agent, appointee, or official of the City. If Consultant was an employee, agent, appointee, or

official of City in the previous twelve months, Consultant warrants that it did not participate in any manner in the forming of this Agreement. Consultant understands that, if this Agreement is made in violation of Government Code § 1090 et. seq., the entire Agreement is void and Consultant will not be entitled to any compensation for Services performed pursuant to this Agreement, including reimbursement of expenses, and Consultant will be required to reimburse the City for any sums paid to the Consultant. Consultant understands that, in addition to the foregoing, it may be subject to criminal prosecution for a violation of Government Code Section 1090 and, if applicable, will be disqualified from holding public office in the State of California.

- **10.7** Inconsistent Terms. If the terms or provisions of this Agreement conflict with or are inconsistent with any term or provision of any Exhibit attached hereto, then the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall prevail.
- **10.8** <u>Solicitation.</u> Consultant agrees not to solicit business at any meeting, focus group, or interview related to this Agreement, either orally or through any written materials.
- 10.9 <u>Contract Administration.</u> This Agreement shall be administered by <u>Scott Buenting</u> ("Contract Administrator"). All correspondence shall be directed to or through the Contract Administrator or his or her designee.

10.10 Notices. Any written notice to Consultant shall be sent to:

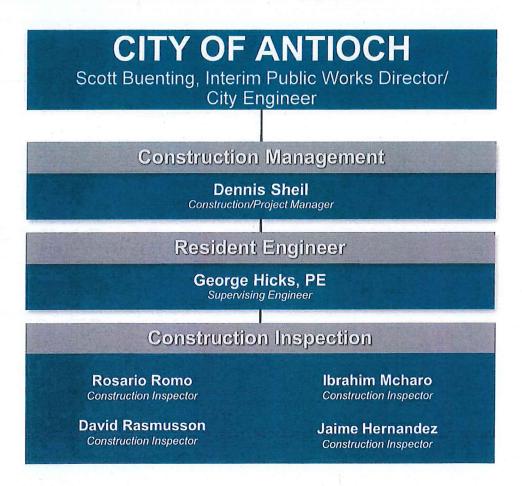

CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ANTIOCH AND PARK ENGINEERING, INC. FOR ON-CALL CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this 25th day of April, 2023 ("Effective Date") by and between the City of Antioch, a municipal Corporation with its principle place of business at 200 H Street, Antioch, CA 94509 ("City") and Park Engineering, Inc. with its principle place of business at 372 Village Square, Orinda, CA 94563 ("Consultant"). City and Consultant individually are sometimes referred to herein as "Party" and collectively as "Parties."

- <u>SECTION 1.</u> SERVICES. Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, Consultant shall furnish all technical and professional services including labor, material, equipment, transportation, supervision and expertise to provide to City the services described in the Scope of Work attached as Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein at the time and place and in the manner specified therein ("Services"). In the event of a conflict in or inconsistency between the terms of this Agreement and Exhibit A, the Agreement shall prevail.
- 1.1 <u>Term of Services.</u> The term of this Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date and shall end on <u>April 25, 2026</u>, the date of completion specified in <u>Exhibit A</u>, and Consultant shall complete the Services described in <u>Exhibit A</u> prior to that date, unless the term of the Agreement is otherwise terminated or extended, as provided for in Section 8. The time provided to Consultant to complete the Services required by this Agreement shall not affect the City's right to terminate the Agreement, under Section 8.
- 1.2 <u>Standard of Performance.</u> Consultant represents that it is experienced in providing these services to public clients and is familiar with the plans and needs of City. Consultant shall perform all Services required pursuant to this Agreement in the manner and according to the standards observed by a competent practitioner of the profession in which Consultant is engaged in the geographical area in which Consultant practices its profession.
- 1.3 <u>Assignment of Personnel.</u> Consultant shall assign only competent personnel to perform Services pursuant to this Agreement. In the event that City, in its sole discretion, at any time during the term of this Agreement, desires the reassignment of any such persons, Consultant shall, immediately upon receiving notice from City of such desire of City, reassign such person or persons.
- 1.4 <u>Time.</u> Consultant shall devote such time to the performance of Services pursuant to this Agreement as may be reasonably necessary to meet the standard of performance provided in Section 1.1 above and to satisfy Consultant's obligations hereunder.
- <u>SECTION 2.</u> <u>COMPENSATION.</u> City hereby agrees to pay Consultant a sum not to exceed <u>One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00)</u> notwithstanding any contrary indications that may be contained in Consultant's proposal, for Services to be performed and reimbursable costs incurred under this Agreement. In the event of a conflict between this Agreement and Consultant's proposal, attached as <u>Exhibit A</u>, regarding the amount of compensation, the Agreement shall prevail. City shall pay Consultant for Services rendered pursuant to this Agreement at the time and in the manner set forth below. The payments specified below shall be the only payments from City to Consultant for Services rendered



pursuant to this Agreement. Except as specifically authorized by City, Consultant shall not bill City for duplicate services performed by more than one person.

Consultant and City acknowledge and agree that compensation paid by City to Consultant under this Agreement is based upon Consultant's estimated costs of providing the Services required hereunder, including salaries and benefits of employees and subcontractors of Consultant. Consequently, the Parties further agree that compensation hereunder is intended to include the costs of contributions to any pensions and/or annuities to which Consultant and its employees, agents, and subcontractors may be eligible. City therefore has no responsibility for such contributions beyond compensation required under this Agreement.

- **2.1** <u>Invoices.</u> Consultant shall submit invoices, not more often than once a month during the term of this Agreement, based on the cost for Services performed and reimbursable costs incurred prior to the invoice date. Invoices shall contain the following information:
 - Serial identifications of progress bills; i.e., Progress Bill No. 1 for the first invoice, etc.:
 - The beginning and ending dates of the billing period;
 - A Task Summary containing the original contract amount, the amount of prior billings, the total due this period, the balance available under the Agreement, and the percentage of completion;
 - At City's option, for each work item in each task, a copy of the applicable time entries or time sheets shall be submitted showing the name of the person doing the work, the hours spent by each person, a brief description of the work, and each reimbursable expense;
 - The total number of hours of work performed under the Agreement by Consultant and each employee, agent, and subcontractor of Consultant performing services; and,
 - The Consultant's signature.

2.2 Payment Schedule.

- **2.2.1** City shall make incremental payments, based on invoices received, for Services satisfactorily performed, in accordance with the requirements of this Agreement, and for authorized reimbursable costs incurred. City shall have thirty (30) days from the receipt of an invoice that complies with all of the requirements of Section 2.1 to pay Consultant.
- 2.3 <u>Total Payment.</u> City shall pay for the Services to be rendered by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement. City shall not pay any additional sum for any expense or cost whatsoever incurred by Consultant in rendering Services pursuant to this Agreement, unless expressly provided for in Section 2.5.

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In no event shall Consultant submit any invoice for an amount in excess of the maximum amount of compensation provided above either for a task or for the entire Agreement, unless the Agreement is modified prior to the submission of such an invoice by a properly executed change order or amendment.

- 2.4 Hourly Fees. Fees for work performed by Consultant are on an hourly basis.
- **2.5** Reimbursable Expenses. There are no reimbursable expenses under this Agreement.
- **2.6** Payment of Taxes. Consultant is solely responsible for the payment of employment taxes incurred under this Agreement and any similar federal or state taxes.
- 2.7 <u>Authorization to Perform Services.</u> The Consultant is not authorized to perform any Services or incur any costs whatsoever under the terms of this Agreement until Consultant receives authorization to proceed from the Contract Administrator.
- <u>SECTION 3.</u> <u>FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT.</u> Except as set forth herein, Consultant shall, at its sole cost and expense, provide all facilities and equipment that may be necessary to perform the Services required by this Agreement. City shall make available to Consultant only the facilities and equipment listed in this section, and only under the terms and conditions set forth herein.

City shall furnish physical facilities such as desks, filing cabinets, and conference space, as may be reasonably necessary for Consultant's use while consulting with City employees and reviewing records and the information in possession of the City. The location, quantity, and time of furnishing those facilities shall be in the sole discretion of City. In no event shall City be obligated to furnish any facility that may involve incurring any direct expense, including but not limited to computer, long-distance telephone or other communication charges, vehicles, and reproduction facilities.

- SECTION 4. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS. Before beginning any work under this Agreement, Consultant, at its own cost and expense, shall procure insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property that may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work by the Consultant and its agents, representatives, employees, and subcontractors. Consultant shall provide proof satisfactory to City of such insurance that meets the requirements of this section and under forms of insurance satisfactory in all respects to the City. Consultant shall maintain the insurance policies required by this section throughout the term of this Agreement. The cost of such insurance shall be included in the Consultant's proposal. Consultant shall not allow any subcontractor to commence work on any subcontract until Consultant has obtained all insurance required herein for the subcontractor(s) and provided evidence thereof to City. Verification of the required insurance shall be submitted and made part of this Agreement prior to execution. Insurers shall have an AM Best rating of no less than A:VII unless otherwise accepted by the City in writing:
- 4.1 Commercial General Liability (CGL). Insurance Services Office Form CG 00 01 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products and completed operations, property damage, bodily injury and personal & advertising injury with limits no less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit. If Consultant's services include work within 50 feet of a railroad right of way, the Consultant shall have removed any exclusion on their liability policy limiting coverage for work near a railroad, or shall provide a Railroad Protective Liability policy in favor of the City. Limits for such coverage shall be no less than \$5,000,000.

- 4.2 <u>Automobile Liability Insurance.</u> ISO Form Number CA 00 01 covering any auto (Code 1), or if Consultant has no owned autos, hired, (Code 8) and non-owned autos (Code 9), with limit no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
- 4.3 <u>Workers' Compensation Insurance.</u> Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the State of California, with Statutory Limits, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limit of no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.
- **4.4** Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions). Insurance appropriate to the Consultant's profession, with limit no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence or claim, \$2,000,000 aggregate.
- 4.5 <u>Other Insurance Provisions.</u> Unless otherwise specified below, all insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:
- **4.5.1** Additional Insured Status. The City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Consultant including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. CGL coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Consultant's insurance (at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or if not available, through the addition of both CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 if a later edition is used). This requirement shall only apply to the CGL and Automobile Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.2** *Primary Coverage.* For any claims related to this contract, the Consultant's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it. This requirement shall only apply to the CGL and Automobile Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.3** Notice of Cancellation. Each insurance policy required above shall provide that coverage shall not be canceled, except with notice to the City.
- **4.5.4** Waiver of Subrogation. Consultant hereby grants to City a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of said Consultant may acquire against the City by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Consultant agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the City has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer. This requirement shall only apply to the CGL, Automobile Liability and Workers' Compensation/Employer's Liability Insurance policies specified above.
- **4.5.5** Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the City. The City may require the Consultant to purchase coverage with a lower deductible or retention or provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses within the retention.
- **4.5.6** Claims made policies. If any of the required policies provide claims-made coverage:

- **4.5.6.1** The Retroactive Date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work.
- 4.5.6.2 Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract of work.
- **4.5.6.3** If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a Retroactive Date prior to the contract effective date, the Consultant must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of contract work.
- 4.6 <u>Certificate of Insurance and Endorsements.</u> Consultant shall furnish the City with original certificates and amendatory endorsements or copies of the applicable policy language effecting coverage required by this clause. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the City before work commences. However, failure to obtain the required documents prior to the work beginning shall not waive the Consultant's obligation to provide them. The City reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by these specifications, at any time.
- 4.7 <u>Subcontractors.</u> Consultant shall include all subcontractors as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated in this Agreement, including but not limited to naming additional insureds.
- 4.8 <u>Higher Limits.</u> If the Consultant maintains higher limits than the minimums shown above, the City requires and shall be entitled to coverage for the higher limits maintained by the Consultant. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the City.
- 4.9 <u>Special Risks or Circumstances.</u> City reserves the right to modify these requirements, including limits, based on the nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage or other special circumstances.
- **4.10** Remedies. In addition to any other remedies City may have if Consultant fails to provide or maintain any insurance policies or policy endorsements to the extent and within the time herein required, City may, at its sole option exercise, any of the following remedies, which are alternatives to other remedies City may have and are not the exclusive remedy for Consultant's breach:
 - Obtain such insurance and deduct and retain the amount of the premiums for such insurance from any sums due to Consultant under the Agreement;
 - Order Consultant to stop work under this Agreement or withhold any payment that becomes due to Consultant hereunder, or both stop work and withhold any payment, until Consultant demonstrates compliance with the requirements hereof; and/or,
 - Terminate this Agreement.

SECTION 5. INDEMNIFICATION AND CONSULTANT'S RESPONSIBILITIES.

- 5.1 To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall defend (with counsel reasonably acceptable to City), indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees, volunteers, and agents free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, costs, expenses, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, in law or equity, to property or persons, including wrongful death, in any manner arising out of, pertaining to, or incident to any acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Consultant, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, consultants or agents in connection with the performance of the Consultant's services or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all damages, expert witness fees and attorney's fees and other related costs and expenses. Consultant's obligation to indemnify shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by Consultant, the City, its officials, officers, employees, agents, or volunteers.
- **5.1.1** Acceptance by City of insurance certificates and endorsements required under this Agreement does not relieve Consultant from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. This indemnification and hold harmless clause shall apply to any damages or claims for damages whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to apply.
- 5.2 By execution of this Agreement, Consultant acknowledges and agrees to the provisions of this Section and that it is a material element of consideration, and that these provisions survive the termination of this Agreement.

SECTION 6. STATUS OF CONSULTANT.

- 6.1 <u>Independent Contractor.</u> At all times during the term of this Agreement, Consultant shall be an independent contractor and shall not be an employee of City. City shall have the right to control Consultant only insofar as the results of Consultant's services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and assignment of personnel pursuant to Section 1.3; however, otherwise City shall not have the right to control the manner or means by which Consultant accomplishes services rendered pursuant to this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other City, state, or federal policy, rule, regulation, law, or ordinance to the contrary, Consultant and any of its employees, agents, and subcontractors providing services under this Agreement shall not qualify for or become entitled to, and hereby agree to waive any and all claims to, any compensation, benefit, or any incident of employment by City, including, but not limited to, eligibility to enroll in the California Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) as an employee of City and entitlement to any contribution to be paid by City for employer contributions and/or employee contributions for PERS benefits.
- **6.2** Consultant Not Agent. Except as City may specify in writing, Consultant shall have no authority, express or implied, to act on behalf of City in any capacity whatsoever as an agent. Consultant shall have no authority, express or implied, pursuant to this Agreement to bind City to any obligation whatsoever.

SECTION 7. LEGAL REQUIREMENTS.

- **7.1 Governing Law.** The laws of the State of California shall govern this Agreement.
- 7.2 <u>Compliance with Applicable Laws.</u> Consultant and any subcontractors shall comply with all laws applicable to the performance of the Services.

- 7.3 Other Governmental Regulations. To the extent that this Agreement may be funded by fiscal assistance from another governmental entity, Consultant and any subcontractors shall comply with all applicable rules and regulations to which City is bound by the terms of such fiscal assistance program.
- 7.4 <u>Licenses and Permits.</u> Consultant represents and warrants to City that Consultant and its employees, agents, and any subcontractors have all licenses, permits, qualifications, and approvals of whatsoever nature that are legally required to practice their respective professions. Consultant represents and warrants to City that Consultant and its employees, agents, any subcontractors shall, at their sole cost and expense, keep in effect at all times during the term of this Agreement any licenses, permits, and approvals that are legally required to practice their respective professions. In addition to the foregoing, Consultant and any subcontractors shall obtain and maintain during the term of this Agreement valid business licenses from City.
- 7.5 <u>Nondiscrimination and Equal Opportunity.</u> Consultant shall not discriminate, on the basis of a person's race, religion, color, national origin, age, physical or mental handicap or disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, sexual orientation or any other legally protected status, against any employee, applicant for employment, subcontractor, bidder for a subcontract, or participant in, recipient of, or applicant for any services or programs provided by Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, policies, rules, and requirements related to equal opportunity and nondiscrimination in employment, contracting, and the provision of any Services that are the subject of this Agreement, including but not limited to the satisfaction of any positive obligations required of Consultant thereby.

Consultant shall include the provisions of this Section in any subcontract approved by the Contract Administrator or this Agreement.

California Labor Code Requirements. Consultant is aware of the requirements of 7.6 California Labor Code Sections 1720 et seq. and 1770 et seq., which require the payment of prevailing wage rates and the performance of other requirements on certain "public works" and "maintenance" projects ("Prevailing Wage Laws"). If the services are being performed as part of an applicable "public works" or "maintenance" project, as defined by the Prevailing Wage Laws, and if the total compensation is \$1,000 or more, Consultant agrees to fully comply with such Prevailing Wage Laws. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees and agents free and harmless from any claims, liabilities, costs, penalties or interest arising out of any failure or alleged failure to comply with the Prevailing Wage Laws. It shall be mandatory upon the Consultant and all subconsultants to comply with all California Labor Code provisions, which include but are not limited to prevailing wages (Labor Code Sections 1771, 1774 and 1775), employment of apprentices (Labor Code Section 1777.5), certified payroll records (Labor Code Sections 1771.4 and 1776), hours of labor (Labor Code Sections 1813 and 1815) and debarment of contractors and subcontractors (Labor Code Section 1777.1). The requirement to submit certified payroll records directly to the Labor Commissioner under Labor Code section 1771.4 shall not apply to work performed on a public works project that is exempt pursuant to the small project exemption specified in Labor Code Section 1771.4.

If the services are being performed as part of an applicable "public works" or "maintenance" project, then pursuant to Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1, the Consultant and all subconsultants performing such services must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations. Consultant shall maintain registration for the full term of this Agreement and require the same of any subconsultants, as applicable.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the contractor registration requirements mandated by Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1 shall not apply to work performed on a public works project that is exempt pursuant to the small project exemption specified in Labor Code Sections 1725.5 and 1771.1.

This Agreement may also be subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations. It shall be Consultant's sole responsibility to comply with all applicable registration and labor compliance requirements. Any stop orders issued by the Department of Industrial Relations against Consultant or any subcontractor that affect Consultant's performance of services, including any delay, shall be Consultant's sole responsibility. Any delay arising out of or resulting from such stop orders shall be considered Consultant caused delay and shall not be compensable by the City. Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, its officials, officers, employees and agents free and harmless from any claim or liability arising out of stop orders issued by the Department of Industrial Relations against Consultant or any subcontractor.

SECTION 8. TERMINATION AND MODIFICATION.

8.1 Termination. City may cancel this Agreement at any time and without cause upon written notification to Consultant.

Consultant may cancel this Agreement only for cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to City and shall include in such notice the reasons for cancellation.

In the event of termination, Consultant shall be entitled to compensation for Services performed satisfactorily to the effective date of termination; City, however, may condition payment of such compensation upon Consultant delivering to City any or all documents, photographs, computer software, video and audio tapes, and other materials provided to Consultant or prepared by or for Consultant or the City in connection with this Agreement.

- **8.2** Extension. City may, in their sole and exclusive discretion, extend the end date of the term of this Agreement beyond that provided for in Section 1.1. Any such extension shall require a written amendment to this Agreement, as provided for herein. Consultant understands and agrees that, if City grants such an extension, City shall have no obligation to provide Consultant with compensation beyond the maximum amount provided for in this Agreement. Similarly, unless authorized by the Contract Administrator, City shall have no obligation to reimburse Consultant for any otherwise reimbursable expenses incurred during the extension period.
- **8.3** Amendments. The parties may amend this Agreement only by a writing signed by all the Parties.
- Assignment and Subcontracting. City and Consultant recognize and agree that this Agreement contemplates personal performance by Consultant and is based upon a determination of Consultant's unique personal competence, experience, and specialized personal knowledge. Moreover, a substantial inducement to City for entering into this Agreement was and is the professional reputation and competence of Consultant. Consultant may not assign this Agreement or any interest therein without the prior written approval of the Contract Administrator. Consultant shall not subcontract any portion of the performance contemplated and provided for herein, other than to the subcontractors noted in the proposal, without prior written approval of the Contract Administrator.

- **8.5** <u>Survival.</u> All obligations arising prior to the termination of this Agreement and all provisions of this Agreement allocating liability between City and Consultant shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- **8.6** Options upon Breach by Consultant. If Consultant materially breaches any of the terms of this Agreement, City's remedies shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - **8.6.1** Immediately terminate the Agreement;
- **8.6.2** Retain the plans, specifications, drawings, reports, design documents, and any other work product prepared by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement; and/or
- **8.6.3** Retain a different consultant to complete the work described in <u>Exhibit A</u> not finished by Consultant in which case the City may charge Consultant the difference between the cost to have a different consultant complete the work described in <u>Exhibit A</u> that is unfinished at the time of breach and the amount that City would have paid Consultant pursuant to Section 2 if Consultant had completed the work.

SECTION 9. KEEPING AND STATUS OF RECORDS.

- 9.1 Records Created as Part of Consultant's Performance. All reports, data, maps, models, charts, studies, surveys, photographs, memoranda, plans, studies, specifications, drawings, records, files, or any other documents or materials, in electronic or any other form, that Consultant prepares or obtains pursuant to this Agreement and that relate to the matters covered hereunder shall be the property of the City. Consultant hereby agrees to deliver those documents to the City upon termination of the Agreement. It is understood and agreed that the documents and other materials, including but not limited to those described above, prepared pursuant to this Agreement are prepared specifically for the City and are not necessarily suitable for any future or other use.
- **Qualification** All reports, data, maps, models, charts, studies, surveys, photographs, memoranda, plans, studies, specifications, records, files, or any other documents or materials, in electronic or any other form, that Consultant prepares or obtains pursuant to this Agreement and that relate to the matters covered hereunder shall be kept confidential by Consultant. Such materials shall not, without the prior written permission of City, be used by Consultant for any purpose other than the performance of this Agreement nor shall such materials be disclosed publicly. Nothing furnished to Consultant which is generally known, shall be deemed confidential. Consultant shall not use the City's name or logo or photographs pertaining to the Services under this Agreement in any publication without the prior written consent of the City.
- 9.3 <u>Consultant's Books and Records.</u> Consultant shall maintain any and all ledgers, books of account, invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other records or documents evidencing or relating to charges for Services or expenditures and disbursements charged to the City under this Agreement for a minimum of three (3) years, or for any longer period required by law, from the date of final payment to the Consultant.
- 9.4 <u>Inspection and Audit of Records.</u> Any records or documents that Section 9.2 of this Agreement requires Consultant to maintain shall be made available for inspection, audit, and/or copying at any time during regular business hours, upon oral or written request of the City. Under California

Government Code Section 8546.7, if the amount of public funds expended under this Agreement exceeds Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), the Agreement shall be subject to the examination and audit of the State Auditor, at the request of City or as part of any audit of City, for a period of three (3) years after final payment under the Agreement.

9.5 Intellectual Property. The City shall have and retain all right, title and interest, including copyright, patent, trade secret or other proprietary rights in all plans, specifications, studies, drawings, estimates, materials, data, computer programs or software and source code, enhancements, documents and any other works of authorship fixed in any tangible medium or expression, including but not limited to physical drawings or other data magnetically or otherwise recorded on computer media ("Intellectual Property") prepared or developed by or on behalf of Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant further grants to City a non-exclusive and perpetual license to copy, use, modify or sub-license any and all Intellectual Property otherwise owned by Consultant which is the basis or foundation for any derivative, collective, insurrectional or supplemental work created under this Agreement.

SECTION 10. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

- 10.1 <u>Venue.</u> In the event either party brings any action against the other under this Agreement, the Parties agree that trial of such action shall be vested exclusively in the state courts of California in the County of Contra Costa or in the United States District Court for the Northern District of California.
- 10.2 <u>Severability.</u> If a court of competent jurisdiction finds or rules that any provision of this Agreement is invalid, void, or unenforceable, the provisions of this Agreement not so adjudged shall remain in full force and effect. The invalidity in whole or in part of any provision of this Agreement shall not void or affect the validity of any other provision of this Agreement.
- 10.3 <u>No Implied Waiver of Breach.</u> The waiver of any breach of a specific provision of this Agreement does not constitute a waiver of any other breach of that term or any other term of this Agreement.
- **10.4** <u>Successors and Assigns.</u> The provisions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall apply to and bind the successors and assigns of the Parties.
- 10.5 <u>Use of Recycled Products.</u> Consultant shall prepare and submit all reports, written studies and other printed material on recycled paper to the extent it is available at equal or less cost than virgin paper.
- 10.6 <u>Conflict of Interest.</u> Consultant may serve other clients, but none whose activities within the corporate limits of City or whose business, regardless of location, would place Consultant in a "conflict of interest," as that term is defined in the Political Reform Act, codified at California Government Code Section 81000 *et seq.*

Consultant shall not employ any official of City in the work performed pursuant to this Agreement. No officer or employee of City shall have any financial interest in this Agreement that would violate California Government Code Section 1090 *et seq.*

Consultant hereby warrants that it is not now, nor has it been in the previous twelve (12) months, an employee, agent, appointee, or official of the City. If Consultant was an employee, agent, appointee, or

official of City in the previous twelve months, Consultant warrants that it did not participate in any manner in the forming of this Agreement. Consultant understands that, if this Agreement is made in violation of Government Code § 1090 et. seq., the entire Agreement is void and Consultant will not be entitled to any compensation for Services performed pursuant to this Agreement, including reimbursement of expenses, and Consultant will be required to reimburse the City for any sums paid to the Consultant. Consultant understands that, in addition to the foregoing, it may be subject to criminal prosecution for a violation of Government Code Section 1090 and, if applicable, will be disqualified from holding public office in the State of California.

- **10.7** Inconsistent Terms. If the terms or provisions of this Agreement conflict with or are inconsistent with any term or provision of any Exhibit attached hereto, then the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall prevail.
- **10.8** <u>Solicitation.</u> Consultant agrees not to solicit business at any meeting, focus group, or interview related to this Agreement, either orally or through any written materials.
- **10.9** <u>Contract Administration.</u> This Agreement shall be administered by <u>Scott Buenting</u> ("Contract Administrator"). All correspondence shall be directed to or through the Contract Administrator or his or her designee.

10.10 Notices. Any written notice to Consultant shall be sent to:

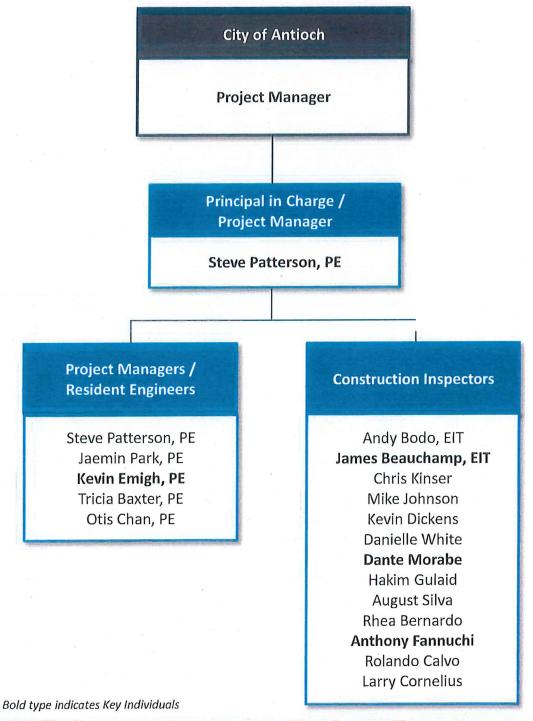

PROPOSED APPROACH TO SERVICES

MANAGEMENT AND COORDINATION

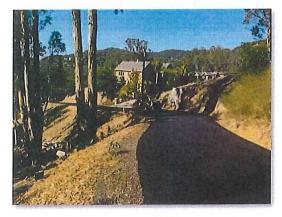

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal year 2022/23 Capital Improvement Budget includes \$500,000 of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds for the construction contract, engineering, inspection, testing and contract administration for the Antioch Water Park Perimeter Fence Repair Project (Project).

DISCUSSION

On April 4, 2023, five (5) bids were received and opened as shown on the attached tabulation. The low bid was submitted by Crusader Fence Company of Rancho Cordova in the amount of \$117,825. The bids have been checked and found to be without any errors or omissions.

This Project will consist of removal and replacement of various sections of the carbon steel perimeter fencing surrounding the Antioch Water Park at the Prewett Community

Park facility. Additional work includes removal and replacement of gate components, constructing concrete footings and water pollution control.

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered awarding the Project construction agreement (Agreement) to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Crusader Fence Company;

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered approving the Agreement with Crusader Fence Company in the amount of \$117,825 in substantially the form included in Exhibit 1; and

SUBJECT: Resolution to Transition the City's Vehicle Fleet to Zero-Emission

and Hybrid Vehicles

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the resolution to transition the City's vehicle fleet to zero-emission and hybrid vehicles.

FISCAL IMPACT

The City has engaged Frontier Energy to develop a fleet transition study that includes determining the fiscal impact of transitioning the City's fleet to zero-emission vehicles, which will include cost estimates. Staff plans to report to the City Council on options for transitioning to a zero-emissions fleet and the anticipated fiscal impact of this program within the next three months.

DISCUSSION

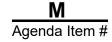
On September 23, 2020, California Governor Gavin Newsom signed executive order N-79-20 stating "It shall be the goal of the State that 100 percent of in-state sales of new passenger cars and trucks will be zero-emission by 2035. It shall be a further goal of the State that 100 percent of medium and heavy-duty vehicles in the State be zero-emission by 2045 for all operations where feasible and by 2035 for drayage trucks. It shall be further a goal of the State to transition to 100 percent zero-emission off-road vehicles and equipment by 2035 where feasible." The Governors executive order compels cities to transition to a zero-emission fleet. This resolution would codify the City of Antioch's commitment to advancing toward that goal as soon as possible.

The City's Vehicle Fleet

The City has more than 200 vehicles in its fleet including one (1) electric vehicle and eight (8) hybrid vehicles. The City's fleet includes passenger cars, vans, trucks, and heavyduty vehicles. The City has two (2) charging stations at the Water Treatment Plant for City use only and one (1) charging station at City Hall for the employee and public use.

City Council Direction and Action on Zero-Emission Vehicles

At the January 25, 2022 city council meeting, the City Council directed staff to bring a policy back that would transition the City's vehicle fleet from internal combustion engines ("ICE") to zero emission and hybrid vehicles.



On June 28, 2022, the City published a Zero-Emission Vehicle Feasibility Assessment and Project Management Request for Qualifications ("RFQ"). The RFQ closed on July 21, 2022. The City received two complete and qualified RFQ responses. Frontier Energy was selected as the most qualified consultant meeting the needs of the City of Antioch as outlined in the scope of work of the RFQ.

At the September 13, 2022 city council meeting, the City Council approved a proposal from Frontier Energy to develop a zero-emission vehicles policy for the City of Antioch. Frontier Energy is assisting the City of Antioch in transitioning to zero emission vehicle fleet by analyzing the City's existing vehicle fleet and develop a transition plan that includes (1) an infrastructure assessment, (2) phased implementation plan and technical reports; (3) construction documents and technical specifications; (4) evaluation of existing vehicle maintenance facility; (5) citywide strategy for public and workplace charging at public facilities; and (6) City of Antioch ZEV Infrastructure Plan/Policy. Once the ZEV feasibility assessment is completed, staff will report to Council on the assessment and propose a draft zero emission vehicles policy for approval.

At the April 11, 2023, city council meeting, the City Council authorized the Acting City Manager to execute an agreement for the purchase of three (3) 2024 new-to-fleet hybrid or electric vehicles and up to twenty (20) 2024 hybrid or electric vehicle replacement vehicles utilizing cooperative purchase agreements for an amount of \$1,843,897. If hybrid and electric vehicles are not available this year, the City Council provided authorization to purchase gas-powered replacement vehicles next year utilizing cooperative purchase agreements for an amount of \$1,843,897.

Resolution Transitioning the City's Fleet to Zero-Emissions and Hybrid Vehicles

The proposed resolution directs staff to (1) report to the City Council quarterly on the design and implementation of an action plan and budget implications for transitioning the City's vehicle fleet to zero-emission vehicles including installation of charging stations at all major City facilities with parking lots including City Hall, the Antioch Community Center, Prewett Water Park the Antioch Police Department, the Nick Rodriguez Community Center, the Senior Center, the Marina, Antioch Community Park, Antioch City Park, and the Maintenance Service Center; (2) immediately begin the procurement process for securing zero-emission vehicles, hybrid vehicles, and electric vehicle charging stations with currently budgeted funds; (3) require all future vehicle purchases by the City to be zero-emission vehicles and hybrid vehicles, unless otherwise approved by the Antioch City Council; and (4) pursue federal, state, and local grants as well as innovative funding options to expedite the transition of the City's vehicle fleet to zero-emission vehicles.

Subsequent Review of Purchasing Ordinance

Successful transition to a zero-emission and hybrid fleet may require innovation in the City's purchasing methods. The City Attorney is working with Public Works staff to examine the City's existing purchasing ordinance and policies to determine how best to purchase zero-emission vehicles and facilitate transition of the City's fleet to zero-emissions vehicles.

- **WHEREAS**, electric vehicles are less costly to operate and maintain than gas powered vehicles;
- **WHEREAS**, EVs require a lower cost of maintenance per mile that gas-powered vehicles;
- **WHEREAS**, conversion of the City's fleet to zero-emission vehicles will require installation of additional electric vehicle charging stations;
- **WHEREAS**, the City has considered the implications of converting the City's fleet to electric vehicles and contracted with Frontier Energy to advance toward this goal;
- **WHEREAS**, conversion of the City's fleet to zero-emission vehicles will require installation of additional electric vehicle charging stations; and
- **WHEREAS**, hybrid vehicles offer high fuel economy and low emission providing a temporary alternative to electric vehicles if the City is unable to procure a suitable electric vehicle replacement.

SUBJECT: Approval of Payment to Haight Brown & Bonesteel LLP for Legal

Fees Incurred Under a Procedurally Invalid Contract

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council approve a payment of \$38,744.52 to Haight Brown & Bonesteel LLP for legal fees billed to the City by attorney Greg Rolen pursuant to a procedurally invalid contract dated November 4, 2022, authorize the Acting City Manager to make the payment, and declare that no further work shall be performed pursuant to this contract.

FISCAL IMPACT

Beyond the noted amount of the expenditure (\$38,744.52), this action will not have any additional material fiscal impact.

DISCUSSION

I. Background

On or about November 4, 2022, the City Manager Cornelius Johnson signed an agreement with Attorney Greg Rolen of Haight Brown & Bonesteel LLP ("Haight") to provide legal services to the City concerning its internal investigation procedures (the "Agreement") [Attachment A]. The Agreement was signed without the knowledge of the City Attorney and was not approved by the City Attorney as required by Antioch Resolution Number 2021/26. Therefore, the agreement is procedurally invalid.

Since that time, Haight has billed the City \$38,744.52 for legal services purportedly pursuant to the Agreement.

II. Analysis

The City cannot lawfully provide Haight with any compensation pursuant to a procedurally invalid contract. However, any failure to pay Haight for services rendered to the City could result in a claim for payment by Haight, further litigation expenses to the City, and potentially legal liability to the City.

Therefore, in order to avoid the risk of a legal claim by Haight – and corresponding litigation costs and potential liability – the City may lawfully provide Haight with payment for its legal services to the City pursuant to the Agreement, provided such payments are duly ratified by the City Council. If the City ratifies this payment, the City should also declare that no further work shall be undertaken under the invalid Agreement.

This letter follows our recent communications and will when signed by you confirm your engagement of Haight Brown & Bonesteel LLP ("Haight" or "the Firm") to represent the interests of City of Antioch ("Client") in connection with the above-referenced matter. This Attorney-Client Retainer Agreement ("Agreement") sets forth the terms and conditions of our engagement in compliance with the requirements of the California *Business and Professions Code* (including Section 6148 thereof) and the California *Rules of Professional Conduct*.

We have examined our conflicts database based on the information provided to us and are not aware of any conflicts at this time. comments, please feel free to discuss those with us. We encourage you to discuss these matters with our attorneys at the inception of the matter, and to continue to do so should you have questions as the matter proceeds.

The scope of the representation that you have asked us to undertake is as follows:

General counsel services

The scope of our representation may be expanded from the services described above only if agreed upon in writing by both of us.

The undersigned will be the principal attorney supervising this matter and is also responsible for billings. Any billing-related inquiries can be directed to the undersigned's attention, or you may contact our Director of Finance, David Bacon, in the Firm's Los Angeles office. It is our practice to assign the lowest billing rate professional who is sufficiently experienced and well capable of handling a particular matter. However, we reserve the right to make assignments which, in our reasonable judgment, are necessary and desirable irrespective of the billing rate(s) of such person(s).

The following standard terms and conditions of our engagement shall apply to this matter:

Execution of Retainer Agreement. If this Agreement was executed on behalf of a corporate or partnership entity, the representative(s) of such corporate or partnership entity represent(s) that he/she/they is/are a duly appointed officer, partner, shareholder, or manager of such corporation or partnership, that the corporation or partnership is active and in good standing and that he/she/they possess actual authority to enter into this Agreement on behalf of such corporate or partnership entity. If more than one person executed this Agreement as Client, then each of them waives any conflict of interest that may exist or might hereafter arise between them in their representation by Haight, except this waiver shall not apply after written notice from one of them objecting to continued representation, or from us notifying you that a conflict has arisen which would preclude such joint representation.

With respect to legal services, Client will be billed on an hourly basis (unless otherwise agreed to in writing) at rates which will vary with the nature of the matter, as well as with the experience and skill of the attorney(s), paralegal(s) or professional(s) rendering the services. Please note that our regular hourly rates are typically adjusted every twelve (12) to twenty-four (24) months. We will notify you at least thirty (30) days in advance of any such adjustment before any legal services at the adjusted rates are provided. For purposes of this matter, our present rates are as follows:

Partners: \$410.00 / hour

Of Counsel: \$375.00 / hour

Senior Counsel: \$310.00 / hour

Associates: \$300.00 / hour

Paralegals: \$155.00 / hour

Reimbursable Costs. Our invoices will also reflect reimbursable costs incurred on your behalf in the referenced matter at the amount(s) actually charged or incurred, including costs associated with travel, lodging, copying, scanning, printing; telephone calls; courier/overnight services; postage; third-party conference calls and third-party services such as: transcript, filing, and recordation fees; and other case-related disbursements such as charges by expert witnesses, consultants and investigators. Costs will be paid upon approval of Client. While many expenses are generally paid by the Firm and charged to Client, it is our practice to forward invoices for significant disbursements greater than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to Client for direct payment to the vendor. In addition, if it becomes apparent that substantial costs are to be advanced in connection with this matter, it is the Firm's practice to obtain a "cost retainer" from Client for payment of such expenses. Client hereby authorizes us, consistent with any applicable written litigation guidelines or procedures applicable to this matter with which Haight has agreed to comply, in our discretion and without the need for prior consultation or approval, to incur on Client's behalf filing fees, attorney service fees, registration fees, recording fees, copying costs, travel costs and other costs incurred in representing Client's interests in this matter. Retainer. It is the Firm's policy to require an initial retainer before commencing legal services for a new client, or where circumstances warrant a retainer for existing clients. Accordingly, the amount of the initial retainer for this matter is \$50,000.00. The retainer to be paid by you constitutes fees paid in advance to us as compensation for the legal services to be performed. If there is no retainer or such balance is insufficient to pay the subject invoice in full, Client agrees to pay the balance due and, as appropriate, to replenish the retainer within fifteen (15) days. The full and prompt payment of our invoices is vital to our ability to efficiently provide legal services to all clients. Failure to timely pay our bills may affect our ability to represent you adequately and could result in our withdrawal as legal counsel. We reserve the right to discontinue services if our bills are not paid in a timely manner, and to seek payment for all past services rendered and costs advanced.

Conflicts of Interest. Haight observes the professional and ethical requirements of the Rules of Professional Conduct as promulgated by the State Bar of California, including its rules as to avoiding the representation of adverse interests among clients and protecting the confidentiality of attorney-client communications. Please be advised that the Firm invests time, energy, and commitment in certain long term client relationships of our choosing, in which clients may rely upon the availability of our representation. Accordingly, it is understood and agreed, and you hereby consent, that our attorney-client relationship with you and the maters in which we represent you or any related persons'



and entities' interests will not, in themselves, serve as a basis for our disqualification from representation of other clients or parties in any legal proceedings, cases, controversies, or matters, except if and to the extent absolutely non-waivably required by the Rules of Professional Conduct. In the event of a conflict, we may withdraw from representing you or another client in our discretion in order to address conflict issues.

Our engagement by you is also understood as entailing your consent to our representation of our other present or future clients in "transactions," including litigation and business or counseling matters, in which we have not been engaged to represent you or in which you have other counsel, and in which one of our other clients would be adverse to you in matters unrelated to those that we are handling for you. amount of or hourly rate for legal services which they will pay and may further refuse reimbursement for various cost items. In addition, some insurance companies may unilaterally impose other restrictions which are different from the terms of this Agreement. While Haight will, of course, work cooperatively with any insurance company defending Client, and make every effort to minimize the expense not absorbed by Client's insurance company, Haight's agreement is with Client, and Client nevertheless understands and agrees that it shall remain liable to Haight for all legal fees and costs which are not paid by such insurer(s) or which are within the applicable deductible(s) or retention(s) of, or are otherwise not covered by, such insurance policy(ies).

Term of Engagement. Either of us may terminate this engagement by fifteen (15) days' prior written notice to the other, for any reason, by written notice to that effect, subject on our part to applicable Rules of Professional Conduct. If permission for withdrawal is required by a court, Haight will promptly apply for such permission, in accordance with local court rules, and Client agrees to cooperate in such process and to engage successor counsel. Unless previously terminated, or otherwise agreed in writing, our representation of Client for purposes of the referenced matter will terminate upon our sending the final statement for services rendered in this matter or, if there are no outstanding fees due (and thus no need for a final statement for services), a written communication to Client confirming the termination of our representation.

Information/Client Responsibilities. We will keep Client informed of the status of the referenced matter and will send copies of correspondence, pleadings and/or other relevant documents which we initiate, and copies of correspondence, pleadings and/or other relevant documents we receive from others. Client agrees to cooperate fully with the Firm and to provide promptly all information known or available which is relevant to the Firm's representation of Client's interests, including furnishing all documents requested by us.

Disposition of Records. Haight is not obligated to keep files/records related to a matter after that matter is finished unless required to do so by operation of law. Client agrees that Haight may destroy matter files or records thirty (30) days after providing notice of its intention to destroy them (unless Client requests delivery of those materials within thirty (30) days of such notification), or without prior notice after five (5) years from the date the matter has been completed, whichever is earlier.



Responses to Audit Letters. If Client engages certified public accountants to audit Client's financial statements, it is likely the accountant or accounting firm will request, during the audit, that Haight provide a written description of all pending or threatened claims or lawsuits to which Haight has given substantive attention on Client's behalf. This request is typically a standardized letter provided by the accountant or accounting firm which Client is requested to send to Haight. Minimum fees for responses to such audit letters will be billed at \$500. However, if more than two hours of time is necessary to prepare such a response, we will charge our regularly hourly rates for time actually incurred.

SUBJECT: Proposed Ordinance Amending Section 6-8.14 of the Antioch

Municipal Code Regarding Restrictions on the Sale of Tobacco

Products

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the City Council waive the first reading and introduce, by title, the proposed ordinance amending the Municipal Code regarding tobacco sale restrictions, attached as Attachment A.

The proposed changes would:

- Remove restrictions on tobacco products based on package size or price; and
- Amend restriction on sale of tobacco products with characterizing flavor to clarify that restriction applies to any product containing a constituent that imparts characterizing flavor.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no anticipated direct or indirect fiscal impact as a result of this item.

DISCUSSION

At its March 16, 2023 regular meeting, the Council considered comments from the public, including owners of local retail stores, concerning the feasibility and impact of certain restrictions on the sale of tobacco products. Specifically, the Council considered comments regarding restrictions based on package size and price that were adopted on March 8, 2022 and effective December 14, 2022.

At the same time, the Council adopted prohibitions against the sale of flavored tobacco products and electronic cigarettes. The proposed ordinance would not affect these prohibitions.

The Council directed staff to return with an ordinance amending Section 6-8.14 of the Municipal Code to eliminate the restrictions based on package size and price. Refer to Attachment A for the proposed revisions. The Council also provided direction regarding

the restrictions on the sale or transfer of tobacco businesses. Because that amendment would apply to the Zoning Code, it is subject to different procedures and will be presented to the Council for consideration at a future meeting. The Planning Commission must first consider the amendment and offer a recommendation to the City Council.

In the attached ordinance, staff has included an additional revision that would conform the text of the prohibition on flavored tobacco products to the original intent, and current interpretation, of the City's prohibition. Additionally, this amendment will align the City's prohibition with the State prohibition of the sale of tobacco products, which avoids potential confusion by local retailers and enforcement officials.

This revision clarifies that the City prohibition applies to products containing a constituent or additive, other than tobacco, that imparts a characterizing flavor. To the extent the current prohibition is understood to apply to tobacco products with added flavors, this amendment does not substantively change the prohibition.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ANTIOCH AMENDING SECTION 6-8.14 OF THE ANTIOCH MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING RESTRICTIONS ON THE SALE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS

The City Council of the City of Antioch does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. <u>AMENDMENT</u>. Section 6-8.14 of the Antioch Municipal Code is amended as follows (additions in underline italics; deletions in double strikethrough):

§ 6-8.14 RESTRICTIONS ON TOBACCO RETAILERS

- A. No tobacco retailer shall sell, offer for sale, possess with the intent to sell, offer in exchange for any form of consideration, or provide at no cost any tobacco or tobacco product <u>that contains a constituent or additive, other than tobacco, that imparts</u> with a characterizing flavor.
- B. No tobacco retailer shall sell, offer for sale, possess with the intent to sell, offer in exchange for any form of consideration, or provide at no cost any electronic cigarette or e-cigarette for use with tobacco or tobacco products.
- C. No tobacco retailer shall sell, offer for sale, possess with the intent to sell, offer in exchange for any form of consideration, or provide at no cost any of the following:
 - (1) Any package of fewer than twenty little cigars
 - (2) Any package of fewer than six cigars
- (3) Any package of cigarettes, little cigars, or cigars at a price that is less than ten dellars per package, including applicable fees and taxes.
- **SECTION 2.** <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any provision or part of this ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, is held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, the remainder of this ordinance, and the application of such provision to other person or circumstances, shall remain in full force and effect.
- **SECTION 3.** <u>PUBLICATION</u>. This ordinance shall take effect and be enforced thirty (30) days from and after the date of its adoption and shall be published once within fifteen (15) days upon passage and adoption in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in the City of Antioch.

§ 3-12.01 CREATED.

There is hereby created within the city government an Economic Development Commission.

§ 3-12.02 DUTIES.

The Commission shall make recommendations to the City Council and staff regarding policies, regulations, marketing, development strategies and activities to retain and enhance the economic base of the community, and further, to articulate a vision of economic development with clearly-defined goals and objectives for the city during a rolling five-year horizon.

(Ord. 1002-C-S, passed 1-28-03)

§ 3-12.03 MEMBERSHIP.

- (A) The Council shall appoint the seven members of the Commission. At least five members shall be Antioch residents. Non-resident members shall own or operate a business in the city.
 - (B) Members with backgrounds in commercial real estate, marketing or investment banking are strongly preferred.
 - (C) The Antioch Chamber of Commerce shall recommend one member.
