CONTINUED PUBLIC HEARINGS

2. UP-08-11/V-08-03/AR-08-11 – Black Dot Wireless on behalf of AT&T and Sprint/Nextel requests approval of a Use Permit to install a new multitenant wireless communication facility and a variance to construct a 75 foot freeway oriented sign to house the new antennas. The project site is located at 2436 Mahogany Way (APN: 074-370-022).

Chairman Azevedo stated that City staff had recommended that this item be continued to December 17, 2008.

The applicant also requests approval of a tentative map to create two parcels from one existing parcel. The project site is located on the northwest corner of Lone Tree Way and Country Hills Drive (APN: 055-071-080).

Associate Planner Gentry provided a synopsis of the Staff Report dated November 14, 2008.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

In speaking to the Housing Subcommittee Committee, Commissioner Brandt stated that RBF Consulting had provided information to the Subcommittee, per their request, and that the Subcommittee would be discussing these issues in the near future. Commissioner Trail added that she was concerned to the disbursement of funds and noted that additional discussions would take place at future meetings.

Commissioner Azevedo reported that the Transplan Subcommittee had authorized the Program Manager for 511 Contra Costa Transpac and Transplan to submit applications to the Contra Costa Transit Authority for Fiscal Year 2009-10, Measure C Carpool Van, Park and Ride and Ride Lot Funds. The Program Manager was also authorized to execute the required grant contacts and enter into new cooperative agreements with the respective agencies for obtaining grants. Bob Taylor, Mayor of Brentwood and Jim Frazier, City Council member-elect of Oakley were appointed to the Joint Transplan Tri-Valley Transportation Council Vasco Road Subcommittee.

City Attorney Nerland announced that the new City Council members would be sworn in on December 9 at 6:00 p.m. and the next City Council meeting would be held on December 16, 2008.
