VI. BUSINESS

 Senior Center and Nick Rodriguez Community Center Programs Update from Recreation Supervisor Jun Gandia

Director Helfenberger introduced Jun Gandia, Recreation Supervisor in charge of programs and activities at the Nick Rodriguez Community Center and Antioch Senior Center. Supervisor Gandia provided a presentation on the progress of both facilities over the past year.

Commissioner Matthews presented his idea to create an "Adopt a Trail" program in the City, where individuals and/or businesses could volunteer to periodically pick up trash along certain sections of City trails for a given timeframe. The Commission is interested in pursuing such a program. Staff will research logistics involved in implementing a program.

1. Staff Communication

At 7:51pm, Commissioner Williams requested a brief recess. The meeting was called back to order at 7:55pm with Commissioners Del Castillo, Ellis, Matthews, and Williams present.

Manager Wright informed the Commission about the Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service events on January 15th. Deputy Director Zepeda provided a brief update on trail maintenance. The renovation projects for Jacobson and Marchetti Parks are scheduled to go out to bid in the near future. The annual Arbor Day event is planned for April. Commissioner Matthews asked about trail signage and dirty bike lanes on Hillcrest Avenue. Deputy Director Zepeda provided information on upcoming improvements to both. Director Helfenberger informed the Commission about the Rivertown Community Space Community Workshops scheduled for February 8th at the Antioch Community Center and February 18th at the Antioch Senior Center. He also provided an update on the Civic Enhancement Grants. There were 18 grant applications received, double the amount from last year. The Civic Enhancement Grant Ad Hoc Committee will meet in early January to recommend funding levels for each application.

2. Commission Communication

Commissioner Del Castillo expressed an interest in the development of a Bicycle Master Plan. Director Helfenberger informed the Commission that the City will begin a new Citywide Master Plan which will include a Transportation Element. The Commission will have the opportunity for input on this plan as it is developed.

SUBJECT: Civic Enhancement Grants: Report by Ad Hoc Committee and Final

Recommendation to City Council

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that the Parks and Recreation Commission review the recommendation for Civic Enhancement Grants from the Civic Enhancement Grant Ad-Hoc Committee and make a final recommendation to City Council for approval and authorization.

FISCAL IMPACT

The budget allocation for the Civic Enhancement Grant Program is \$50,000 for Fiscal Year 2023-2024.

DISCUSSION

The FY23-24 Budget includes continued funding for the Civic Enhancement Grants Program to support community events and improvement projects that originate with Non-Profit organizations in Antioch. It is the City's goal to assist Non-Profit organizations by creating and implementing a grant program to fund civic events and enhancement projects in an objective manner. The Parks and Recreation Commission makes final recommendations for grant approval to the City Council, which ultimately authorizes the grant allocations.

During the FY22-23 program, some organizations used awarded funds to rent City facilities for their programs. In response, the FY23-24 program added an option to request City facilities/ services as part of the application to allow organizations access without having to use awarded funds for this purpose. These in-kind requests are noted on the Proposed Funding List in the "Appx. Value of City Facilities/ Services" column. The value of these services are in addition to the recommended funding amount.

Applications for the Civic Enhancement Grant Program were published on November 2, 2023, and due December 18, 2023. The City received 18 applications for grant funding to support projects and/or programs in 2024. The City Council authorized \$50,000 in FY23-24 to fund the civic enhancement grant program. The total amount of funding requested is \$167,560.

On November 16, 2023, the Parks and Recreation Commission appointed three members to serve on the Ad-Hoc Committee to review the applications and recommend funding amounts for the grant applications. The Committee met on January 4, 2024 and January 9, 2024 to review the applications. The Committee's funding recommendation is included on the attached Proposed Funding List.

The attached documents provide summary information including the program policy, list of applicants, amount of funding requested, value of City facilities/ services requested, and amount of funding recommended. The Ad-Hoc Committee recommended 16 proposed projects & programs receive full or partial funding requested.

The City of Antioch is offering one-time grants that support events, historic & cultural activities, and community beautification projects that enhance civic pride and strengthen community engagement within the City.





1. Introduction

This application should be used by nonprofit organizations requesting funding from the City's Civic Enhancement Grant Program.

Funds may only be used for:

- Activities performed directly for the benefit and enjoyment of all Antioch residents; open to the public and all citizens and/or underserved youth/communities.
- Improvements to or operation of arts and cultural facilities
- General city beautification

Applications are due December 18, 2023, 5:00pm.

While pleased to contribute toward enhancement activities, the city is interested in investing where other funding entities also contribute to the cost of programs, events and projects. Please describe in detail the program, event or project that you would like the City to support; other funders and supporters, and the positive impact it will have on the community. If your proposal is for a program or event to be held at a City facility, please include the approximate facility fees separately on the form along with proposed dates/times/locations, even if tentative. This will allow the City to waive facility/permit fees rather than have the organization pay them from any awarded grant funds.

Funding disbursements will be made after the nonprofit has been notified from the City. The city reserves the right to adjust grant awards based upon budgetary circumstances following the adoption of the Fiscal Budget.

Submit **one** (1) **original** of the application packet and three (3) copies. Note: All attachments to the application must be included in the original and all copies. Hard copies and emailed PDFs are accepted.

The application package must include the following:

- (1) Completed application form
- (2) IRS 501 (C) Tax Exemption Determination Letter
- (3) Current List of the Organization's Board of Directors
- (4) **Evidence of Insurance** (Listing of policies by type and coverage amount, indicating policy end dates, or copies of certificates of insurance.)

Policy Introduction

The City of Antioch offers one-time grants to provide funding that support operations, marketing and promotions for Antioch special events, historic and cultural activities, and facilities that enhance civic pride and strengthens community engagement within the City. Grants are funded by revenues from City Transient Occupancy Taxes (TOT) and/or the General Fund and approved by the City Council. Applications will be reviewed by the City and the Antioch City Council makes the final grant award decisions.

Funds may only be used for:

- Activities performed directly for the benefit and enjoyment of all Antioch residents;
 open to the public and all citizens and/or underserved youth/communities.
- Improvements to or operation of arts and cultural facilities
- General city beautification

Applications may also include a request to use City facilities for programs or events. These costs should be listed separately on the application along with tentative dates, times, and locations. This will allow the City to waive facility/permit fees rather than have the organization pay them from any awarded grant funds. Applicants and grant recipients must meet certain reporting requirements and deadlines. This may include reports of how grant funds from previous fiscal years were used.

Applicant eligibility

To be eligible for civic enhancement grants, organizations must be a non-profit corporation, or have a qualifying fiscal agent with tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(3), 501(c)(4), or 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code. Organizations/ Fiscal Agent must provide a copy of their current 501(c)(3), 501(c)(4), or 501(c)(6) IRS determination letter when submitting an application. Private individuals are not eligible to submit applications for programs, events or projects.

How to apply

Applications for grants are only accepted during the submission period, which will end December 18, 2023. City funds that are budgeted for grants must be committed by June 30, 2024, which is the end of the Fiscal Year.

- Organizations must meet all the applicant requirements detailed in the current application packet. Read the instructions and all application materials very carefully.
- Complete and submit all of the application materials listed on the grant application checklist. Applications missing any of the required materials will not be considered for



funding. Please note that official budget reports and fiscal statements from the nonprofit organization may be required under the final grant contract.

Application forms

Applications for Civic Enhancement Grants will be available after July 1st each year. The application may be downloaded from the City of Antioch website: www.antiochca.gov/recreation.

Types of grants

- Activities performed directly for the benefit and enjoyment of all Antioch residents;
 open to the public and all citizens and/or underserved youth/communities.
- Improvements to or operation of arts and cultural facilities in Antioch
- General city beautification within Antioch

All events proposed for funding must be:

- Open to the public and/or underserved youth/communities
- Take place within the over-arching boundaries of the Antioch City Limits
- Committed and/or scheduled between July 1 and June 30 of the fiscal year for which the grant is awarded

10-2.08 PARKS/RECREATION FACILITIES REGULATIONS (2) No skateboards, roller blades, roller skates or bicycles are permitted on tennis courts or other areas not designed for such use. They must not be operated in an unsafe manner within all park sites.
