1. Chair/ Vice-Chair Elections

Director Helfenberger explained the annual process to select a chair and vice-chair.

2. Civic Enhancement Grants: report by Ad Hoc Committee and Final Recommendation to City Council

Director Helfenberger provided a recap of the process thus far. The Ad-Hoc Committee met twice in early January to determine final recommendations for funding for the Civic Enhancement Grants for FY2023-24. Following the final recommendation by the Parks and Recreation Commission, the City Council will approve funding at the February 13, 2024 meeting. The Committee recommended 16 applications for a total funding amount of \$50,000. There were two public comments on the item. Kimberly Ahumada representing Delta Learning Center spoke on programs they are hosting. She thanked the Commission for the grant opportunity. Mickie Marchetti representing the Police Activities League shared that they would use the funding to purchase uniforms for local youth sports.

3. Discussion of Areas in Parks Designated for Skateboarding, Roller Blading, Roller Skates, or Bicycles

Chair King shared that she had heard from a group of adults who enjoy skating in parks, but would like to be able to skate on tennis courts. Director Helfenberger shared that the Antioch Municipal Code specifies that tennis courts are for tennis play only. Skating and other activities on surfaces designed for tennis have the potential to cause excessive wear. Chair King asked about plans to improve existing hardscapes. Deputy Public Works Director Carlos Zepeda will visit a future meeting to provide an update on this. Commissioner Matthews expressed that he would prefer to keep existing regulations as is. There will also be additional opportunities to develop hardscapes with the upcoming Bicycle Garden project.

At 7:41pm, Commissioner Williams left the meeting.

#### 4. Discussion of Commissioner Attendance at Special Events

The Commission held a discussion on the benefits of sharing information to the community about the Parks and Recreation Commission's work as well as attending special events hosted by the City. Vice-Chair Ellis requested that the Commission receive reminders on when special events are scheduled. She also requested the Commission be provided with either name badges or shirts identifying them as commissioners to be used at events. Director Helfenberger responded that reminders will be sent to the Commission and that work was already underway to create emails for the Commission. He will also research options for name badges or shirts.

#### VII. COMMUNICATIONS (Announcements and Correspondence)

#### 1. Staff Communication

Director Helfenberger reminded the Commission about the Rivertown Community Space Community Workshops scheduled for February 8<sup>th</sup> at the Antioch Community Center and February 18<sup>th</sup> at the Antioch Senior Center. Vice-Chair Ellis requested that the Commission be provided with city email addresses, to which Director Helfenberger responded that he is already in the process of working on this. Commissioner Matthews shared some thoughts on the Rivertown Community Space project. Commissioner Eubanks asked if all Commissioners can participate. Director Helfenberger responded that due to the Brown Act, the workshops would be limited to Ad-Hoc Committee Members and that after their work was completed the entire Commission would then have the opportunity to provide feedback.

#### 2. Commission Communication

Chair King shared that she participated in several events on Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday, including the City Events. She also expressed an interest in seeing more collaboration between

City and non-City Events. She also shared that she attended a Teen Bowling Night hosted by the Council of Teens. She asked if Parks and Recreation oversees the Council of Teens. Director Helfenberger responded that the Council of Teens is overseen by the new Public Safety and Community Resources Department. Chair King requested future agenda items on Poetry and Pickleball. Director Helfenberger informed the Commission that the City Council is planning to have a discussion on a Poet Laureate program at a Special Meeting schedule for January 30, 2024. Commissioner Matthews asked about having a preliminary discussion on a Bicycle Master Plan as requested by Commissioner Del Castillo at the January Meeting. Director Helfenberger responded that he would discuss the matter with the Planning Division about how to proceed.


