1. Receive and Review the Draft 2017-2022 Five Year Capital Improvement Program Budget, P.W. 150-17

Public Works Engineering Staff provided a presentation outlining the Five Year CIP Budget that is directly related to parks and trails improvement. The plan identifies funding in the following manner:

\$0 FY 17-18; \$300,000 in FY 18-19; \$0 FY 19-20; \$300,00 in FY 20-2; \$0 FY 21-22.

Public comments were read into the record from East County Regional Group supporting continued funding at Contra Loma Estates Park, specifically new basketball courts.

The members of the Commission accepted the CIP report from staff with concern for the low level of funding for parks and trails in the next five year cycle.

- Discuss and Forward Recommendations to City Council For Providing Restrooms in City Parks and Public Places

The Commission concurred with staff recommendations regarding criteria to consider when adding restrooms to park design, development and operations. Additional items to consider and discuss as outlined by the Commission include but are not limited to construction products/vandal proof design, options for nice portable restrooms, restroom hours different based on several variables like season, park features focused on children may be important, size and type of park-one size fits all may not be practical. Commissioners recommended selecting a few parks to implement new ideas and concepts and requested that staff seek examples from other communities.

Motion to Recommend that Council discuss and include various options for restrooms in City Parks; include Commission comments and staff recommendations in planning and operations.
