RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Parks and Recreation Commission review and recommend City Council approval for the Draft 2022-2027 Five Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) related to Parks and Recreation projects.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This presentation was originally scheduled for the May 19, 2022, meeting which was not held due to the lack of quorum. There are no updates in this staff report from the originally published May 19, 2022 item.

The Five-Year CIP is a planning tool to prioritize capital projects into the City's budget. It is a dynamic document intended to be updated every year. Staff has prepared the 2022-2027 update to the CIP and requests the Commission review the proposed Community Facilities and Parks related projects considered in the update.

Park in Lieu Fund forecasts approximately \$500,000 to be available for the 2022-2023 Capital Budget. Up to \$600,000 of additional funding is anticipated over the subsequent four-year period. The amount of available funding represents a significant opportunity to revitalize and improve the City's Park system.

The General Fund generally provides most of the funding for new and upgraded improvements to City facilities. The General Fund has allocations of \$1,764,000 of facility projects in the current Capital Budget. The CIP is projecting the need of \$6.6 million of funding needed to support the current list of Parks and Recreation facility projects. An expected California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA) State Grant is programmed to cover \$2.2 Million in the next fiscal year for the Nick Rodriquez Community Center. An additional \$2 million more is needed to complete the funding for the work.

These projects will require a funding source or sources to move into the budget. Potential funding sources for unfunded projects include Grants, ARPA funding and General Fund.

The park would consist of small roads that weave in and around landscaped areas with smaller scaled versions of real-life traffic features including signals, traffic signs, road markings, bus stops, bike lanes, train tracks, and more to help youth learn the rules-of-the-road. The City intends to pursue grant funding through the One Bay Area Grant program to fund the unfunded portion of the project.
