I. CALL TO ORDER

VI. BUSINESS

 L Street Pathway to Transit – Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvement, Phase I Project; P.W. 234-15

Commissioner Matthews arrived and joined the meeting at 7:03pm.
Acting Public Works Director Buenting introduced the item and provided background information on the project. Further information was provided by the consultant, Jaggi Bhandal from BKF Engineers.

A Public comment was received from Alexander Broom.

Commissioners Del Castillo and Commissioner Matthews expressed a strong desire to see continuous Class II bike lanes as opposed to Class III. This was echoed by other Commissioners as well. Acting Director Buenting responded that in order to accommodate Class II bike lanes, street parking would need to be removed, which was opposed by residents in the area during public outreach efforts.

No Action was taken for this item.

2. Draft 2024-2029 Five Year Capital Improvement Program, P.W. 150-24

Acting Public Works Director Buenting presented the item and highlighted projects that are related to Parks and Recreation. Commissioner Del Castillo expressed a desire to see additional bicycle parking at City facilities, which was supported by Commissioner Matthews. He also suggested that the tennis courts at Mira Vista Hills Park needed improvements. This was supported by all members of the Commission.

Motion to recommend approval of the Draft 2024-2029 Five Year Capital Improvement Program Parks and Recreation projects with recommended additions of added bicycle parking at City parks and facilities and a future project to improve Mira Vista Hills Park.

3. Discussion of Potential Commemoration of Indigenous Peoples for Julpun and Bay Miwok Meadows Parks

Chair King introduced the item, which originally came from a public comment made at the February meeting.

A Public Comment was received from Alexander Broom.

After a discussion, the Commission came to a consensus to research a project for each of the two parks that would include a bench for reflection in view of native plants, a series of approximately six interpretive signs along trails/pathways, and a commemorative plaque. Acting ACM Helfenberger will do preliminary research to ascertain the potential cost of such a project.

No Action was taken for this item.

VII. COMMUNICATIONS (Announcements and Correspondence)

1. Staff Communication

Acting ACM Helfenberger shared information about the opening of the Antioch Water Park for the 2024 General Admission Season, the upcoming Juneteenth Event scheduled for June 16th, and the launch of the Coyote Hills Summer Camps starting June 17th. He also announced that the Contra Loma Estates Park project had begun construction.

2. Commission Communication

Commissioner Del Castillo requested a future agenda item on developing a policy on using native plants in Antioch Parks. He also inquired about a City contractor blocking a sidewalk to perform tree trimming work and requested a future discussion item on encroachment permits. He also requested a discussion item on opportunities to provide shower services for unhoused residents in City Parks. Vice Chair Ellis requested an update on the status of the request for funding for training for Commissioners. Acting ACM Helfenberger responded that the budget had not yet been finalized. Commissioner Matthews requested a discussion to include a Bicycle Pump Track in a future project. Chair King provided an update on the STEM event held in Williamson Ranch Park that was funded by a Civic Enhancement Grant. She also shared positive feedback that the Recreation Department has done an excellent job on making programs inclusive of people with disabilities.






