VI. BUSINESS

 Adding an Additional Member to the Rivertown Community Space Ad-Hoc Committee

Director Helfenberger gave background on the project and progress so far. An Ad Hoc Committee for the Rivertown Community Space was formed at the Parks and Recreation Commission Regular Meeting of August 17, 2023 and initially included Commissioners Ellis and King. At that time, the Commission requested to have the option to add a third member at this meeting.

2. Formation of an Ad-Hoc Committee for Purposes of Reviewing Civic Enhancement Grant Applications and Award Recommendations

Director Helfenberger gave background on the Civic Enhancement Grant Program, which provides \$50,000 annually for non-profits for programs and infrastructure enhancements. The Ad-Hoc Committee will review applications and provide recommendations to the Commission for final funding recommendation to City Council.

Motion to create an Ad-Hoc Committee for the Civic Enhancement Grant Program with Commissioners King, Ellis, and Matthews to serve on the Committee with the option to add a third member of the Committee at a future meeting.

3. Discussion of Possible Hygiene Stations in Parks

Commissioner King explained her idea of placing Hygiene Stations in selected parks. The station would resemble a "lending library" that would have toiletries and other hygiene supplies intended to be available primarily for unhoused residents but also for anyone who needs them. Commissioner King's vision is to identify a non-profit organization to establish and maintain the station. She agreed to connect a non-profit interested in this work with Director Helfenberger to discuss next steps.

This item will return for discussion when an update is available.

VII. COMMUNICATIONS (Announcements and Correspondence)

1. Staff Communication

Director Helfenberger introduced Acting Recreation Services Manager Shahad Wright, who will be attending Commission meetings on a regular basis moving forward. Manager Wright shared information about upcoming events and activities including the Holiday Delites Parade and Tree Lighting. Commissioners King, Ellis, and Eubanks volunteered to serve as parade judges.

2. Commission Communication

Commissioner Eubanks welcomed the new Commissioners and asked about Big Truck Day, which was held in September. Commissioner King shared that she attended the Veterans Day event on November 11. She also asked about the City's Youth Programs. Director Helfenberger gave a brief outline on programs currently being offered. Commissioner Del Castillo shared his interest in improving cycling opportunities and creating a Bicycle Master Plan. Director Helfenberger shared that the Parks and Recreation Commission has been designated by the City Council to also serve as the Bicycle-Pedestrian Advisory Committee so this is a subject that can be discussed. Commissioner Ellis then asked about the status of the Bicycle Garden Project and Director Helfenberger provided a brief update.

DISCUSSION

This item is solely for the Parks and Recreation Commission's discussion. The item was requested for discussion by Commissioner King, who has shared with staff that the issue has been brought to her attention by a few residents who have expressed frustration with the existing municipal code on designated areas for skating. This discussion will help identify possible areas of focus for future projects. The existing relevant municipal code section is below:

10-2.08 PARKS/RECREATION FACILITIES REGULATIONS (2) No skateboards, roller blades, roller skates or bicycles are permitted on tennis courts or other areas not designed for such use. They must not be operated in an unsafe manner within all park sites.
