On motion by Commissioner Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Elekwachi the Antioch Police Oversight Commission members present unanimously adopted the resolution to restructure and combine the following ad hoc committees: 1) Policy; 2) Use of Force; and 3) Complaints, Internal Affairs, and Hiring Process, to "Police Practices" Ad Hoc Committee.

Commissioner Elekwachi volunteered to serve on the Police Practices Ad Hoc Committee.

Assistant City Attorney Kundinger reviewed the Brown Act as related to communications between Commissioners addressing Ad Hoc Committee assignments.

On motion by Chairperson Taylor, seconded by Commissioner Lacey-Oha the Antioch Police Oversight Commission members present unanimously appointed Chairperson Taylor and Commissioners Williams and Elekwachi to the Police Practices Ad Hoc Committee for a term of twelve (12) months.

Commissioner Kennedy announced May was Mental Health Awareness Month and expressed concern that the Sacramento County Sheriff Department would not be responding to calls related to a mental health crisis unless a crime had occurred, in progress or someone other than the person in crisis was deemed to be in imminent danger.

Commissioner Lacey-Oha reported on her attendance at a meeting with the California State President of the NAACP.

Commissioner Williams announced he was appointed third Vice President of the NAACP East County Chapter.

Chairperson Taylor welcomed Commissioners Kennedy and Elekwachi to the APOC. She announced there would be an Access to Victims Compensation event from 6:00 P.M. — 8:00 P.M. on May 22, 2025, at Intentional Event Spaces and a Social Justice Pageant for Youth event beginning at 9:00 A.M. on September 20, 2025, at Intentional Event Spaces. She reported on a meeting she attended with Sargent Price and encouraged APOC members to participate in ridealongs.
