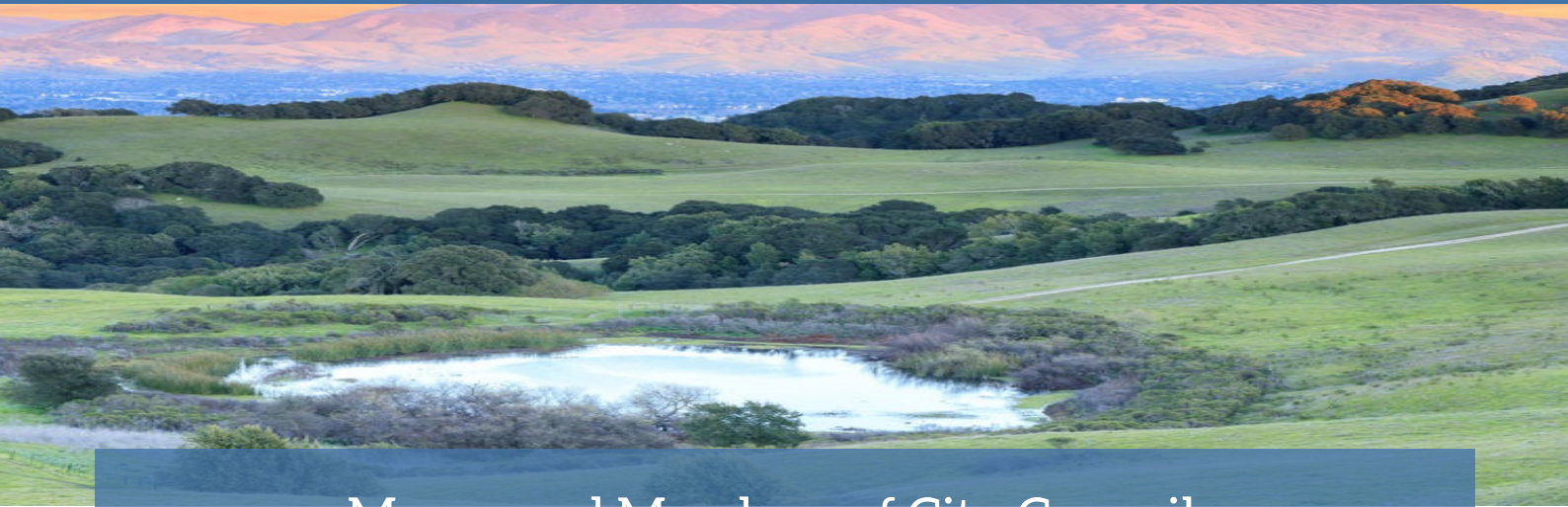

#### Act of Heroism

We're honored to share that Antioch resident Samantha Olive Barnhouse has recently been awarded the Carnegie Medal for an extraordinary act of heroism. Ms. Barnhouse saved Lobis Burton, 78, from a burning house on Feb. 17, 2018. Ms. Barnhouse, who lived across the street from Mr. Burton's apartment building, entered his apartment and moved past the

burning kitchen to reach Mr. Burton, who was sitting in a wheeled desk chair and was unable to move due to an injured hip. The chair became stuck, and Ms. Barnhouse pulled on it, freeing it, and both narrowly escaped. Mr. Burton was hospitalized for smoke inhalation and a broken hip. Ms. Barnhouse was treated at the hospital for smoke inhalation. Please help us celebrate this incredible act of heroism and share on Facebook and Twitter. #CarnegieHero.

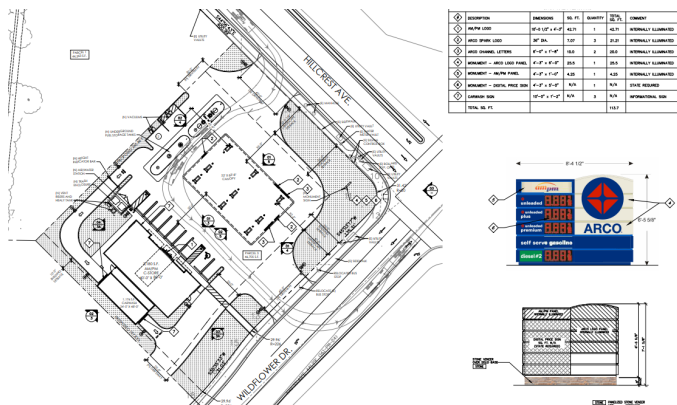
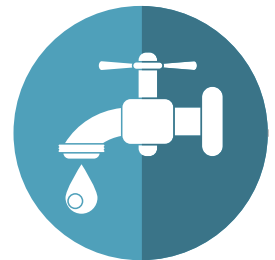

## Community Development

### Water Efficient Landscaping

On January 16, 2019, the Planning Commission will consider a proposal from the Community Development Department to recommend City Council approval of a Water Efficient Landscaping Ordinance (WELO). Presently, State law requires that all jurisdictions either adopt a WELO or use the State Department of Water Resource Model WELO. Though the City has required compliance for major development projects, this Ordinance will improve enforcement and implementation efforts and will better meet our obligation to conserve water. The WELO will require that all new landscaping projects meet specified goals for water conservation, will minimize turf and water runoff and will ensure that landscapes are maintained. The WELO will apply to large development projects, new production housing, City parks, and moderate-sized landscape remodels. It will not impact existing single-family homes.



### Inspection

The Building Division has been busy inspecting the construction of a new ARCO AM/PM gas station, mini-mart and car wash at the western corner of Hillcrest Avenue and Wildflower Drive. The builder has recently raised walls on the main building, and the project is moving quickly towards completion.

### Environmental

The City of Antioch participates in CivicSpark, a California Governor's Initiative AmeriCorps program, dedicated to building local government's capacity to address community resilience and justice issues through National Service. The City of Antioch currently supports two Fellows, Tinúviel Carlson and Tal Litwin, who are completing an 11-month Fellowship supporting environmental, sustainability, and housing efforts in Antioch. These two Fellows were recently quoted in an article in Northern News, a publication of the Northern Section of the California Chapter of the American Planning Association. Look for more great work to come out of these two rising professionals! One project that Tinúviel is currently wrapping up is our eco-pages updates to the city website. Check out the work to date and let us know what more you want to see!

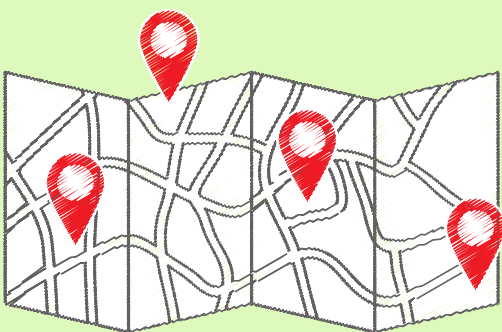
## City Clerk

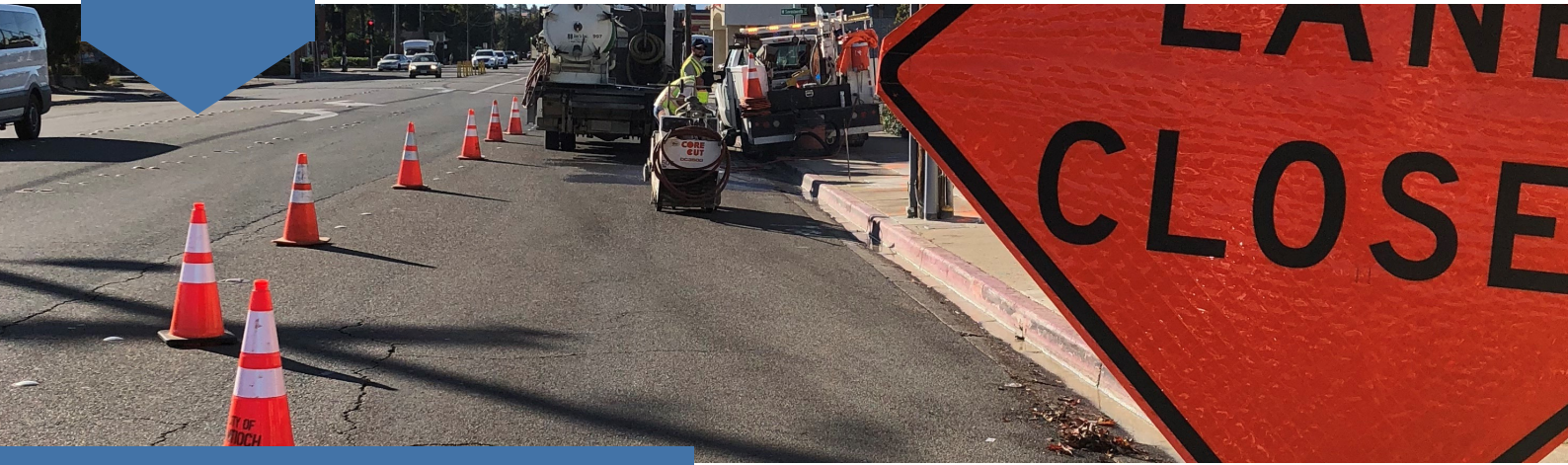

### Collection Systems

The Collection Systems Sewer Lateral Maintenance Crew is currently working on Hill Drive. The Lateral Maintenance Crew is comprised of two state-certified Collection System Workers that conduct inspections of the City-owned wastewater (sewer) laterals using a cable mounted, manual operated portable camera to identify, locate and assess the condition of the City's wastewater lateral connections. In addition to conducting inspections, the crew utilizes a rodder machine to clear debris, grease, and roots whenever necessary and use a handheld Global Positioning System (GPS) data unit to mark the exact location of all City maintained sewer clean outs. Please remember to **CALL US FIRST** if you experience a sewer problem to see if we can help.



### Retirement

The City of Antioch is celebrating the retirement of Larry Noack after almost 17 Years of Service. Larry Noack began working with the City of Antioch as a Warehouse Worker on January 14, 2002. Throughout his time here, he ensured that staff had the parts and supplies needed across divisions and that the department's wide-ranging inventory was properly maintained. 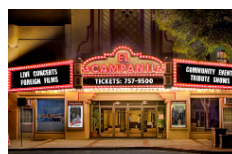
