


Celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the 19th Amendment and Women's Right to Vote.

#### **New Police Officer Process**

Becoming a police officer is a long, difficult process. The process starts with evaluating the applicant's fitness level and academic aptitude. There are interview panels, a polygraph, and a very extensive background investigation followed by a complete medical and psychological examination. This process alone can sometimes take up to 6 months. For entry-level applicants, successful completion of this process leads them to the police academy (another six months). All of this culminates into a "swearing-in" ceremony, where the officers take an oath to serve and protect our community.

All downhill from there, right? Truthfully, this is where the rubber meets the road. Once new officers take their oath, they begin their Field Training Program. Depending on their level of experience, the Field Training Program can typically take anywhere from 10 weeks to 6 months. During this Program, the new officers are trained by experienced officers and receive daily evaluations. It is an incredibly stressful process. So, when you see these pictures of our new officers who have successfully completed their Field Training Program, know for certain that this is a tremendous accomplishment and that we have taken every measure possible to make sure they are ready to serve and protect our great community.





#### **Antioch Dog Licensing**

Did you know that all dogs over the age of four months must be licensed annually with the City of Antioch? To license your dog, you must have proof of a current rabies vaccination given by a licensed veterinarian. Antioch dog licenses may be purchased for a period of one, two, or three years based upon the expiration date of your dog's rabies vaccination. To purchase your Antioch dog license in person, bring your rabies vaccination certificate to the Antioch Animal Shelter, at 300 L Street, during regular business hours, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday 10:00 a.m.– 5:00 p.m. or Friday 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. Antioch dog licenses may also be purchased online by visiting the PetData website here: www.petdata.com/cs/ant Questions about Antioch dog licensing requirements can be directed to Antioch Animal Services at 925-779-6989 or by calling PetData at 1-877-238-2698.


#### **Antioch Home Ownership Program**

The City of Antioch is about to fund and launch a local Home Ownership Program (AHOP). AHOP will provide up to \$50,000 in down payment assistance to eligible homebuyers. AHOP's objectives are to:

- Increase affordability and access to homeownership
- Provide education and counseling to help prepare and guide homebuyers through the home purchase process



- Currently live or work in the City of Antioch
- Have not owned a home in the past three years
- Have a household that earns 80% or less of the area's median income
- Complete HUD certified education within the past twelve months to participate in the Program.

COUNT ME IN FOR CENSUS 2020 BECAUSE.....IT IS IMPORTANT

The Census determines the number of Representatives each state has in

Congress and is used to draw district boundaries. Census data is used to distribute billions of dollars in Federal and State funding. Being counted brings those resources back to your community.

#### IT IS EASY

The Census form includes ten questions about each person's age, gender, race, and relationship to householder. It should take about 10 minutes to fill out, more if there are more people living in the home. In 2020, you will be able to fill out the census form online, over the phone, by paper, or in person.

#### IT IS SAFE

All data collected by the U.S. Census Bureau is confidential and may not be turned over to any other government agency. Please click on the following link for additional information regarding the 2020 Census for Contra Costa County.

#### **Collection Systems**

This Collection Systems crew was hard at work repairing the sewer line at W 3rd and G Streets this week. Working on our sewer system is no easy task; City crews receive specialized training and are required to maintain their state certification to work on the underground pipelines. If you experience a sewer problem, please remember to call Public Works first to see if we can help you at 925-779-6950 Ext. 0; we have crews standing by evenings, weekends, and holidays.

#### **Park Improvements**

Last month, we reported that Chichibu Park is receiving a brand-new play structure. As a cost-saving measure, Public Works crews handled the demolition of the old structure and removed 300 yards of sand. Playground sand is costly, so we will use the sand in other parks with sand areas; this action will save us approximately \$15,000. Construction is expected to continue through the end of March. Signs have been installed at the parking lot entrances/exits to alert visitors. We invite you to check back here and on our Facebook page for updates on this project. Chichibu Park is located at Longview Road and Acorn Drive, situated on over six acres in the neighborhood next to Sutter Elementary School.



#### Beautifying Residential Areas


One of City Council's priorities is to clean up and beautify our City, with that goal Council,



approved additional funding for landscape services and landscape cleaning of the medians in all courts citywide was increased form one time per year to two times per year. The second cleaning of all 456 courts was completed at the end of December as scheduled.

**Landscape Maintenance Continues** 

Public Works in-house crews have been working on irrigation inspections and repair citywide and leaf, litter, and debris removal in City landscaping on Delta Fair Boulevard, Downtown, and Wexler Peak Way. Contracted landscape maintenance crews are trimming and removing leaves on Canada Valley Road and Laurel Road.


