COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Mt. Diablo Truck Maintenance Facility – Associate Planner Jose Cortez

Mt. Diablo Resource and Recovery (applicant) is proposing the development of the Mt. Diablo Resource Recovery Truck Maintenance Facility Project (proposed project) at 2600 Wilbur Avenue in the City of Antioch (City), California. The proposed project would be developed in three phases on a 10.28-acre site partially developed with a 9,730 square foot metal warehouse building and approximately 10,000 square feet of paved surface parking. The first phase would initially use the existing 9,730 square foot warehouse building as an **interim truck repair** and maintenance facility and construct approximately 3.5 acres of truck and employee parking and a truck fueling station. In the second phase, the proposed project would construct a new metal warehouse building of approximately 18,000 square feet with 15,533 square feet dedicated to truck service repairs and 3,000 square feet **dedicated to shop and dispatch offices**, restrooms, break room, locker rooms, and a storage room. The third phase of development would include drainage improvements and grading of approximately 1.73 acres in the west portion of the site.

Ducky's Car Wash – Associate Planner Kevin Scudero

An application is being reviewed for a self-service car wash at the Northwest corner of **Lone Tree Way and Country Hills Drive**. The project is being proposed on an undeveloped site and includes constructing a single-story **car wash tunnel**, covered self-service vacuum stalls, project landscaping, and associated site improvements. The project is tentatively

scheduled to go before the Planning Commission on February 17, 2021.

The Wild Horse Townhome Project – Associate Planner Zoe Merideth

The Planning Division is currently reviewing the Wild proposed project involves developing 126 townhomes in 25 buildings with related amenities on an approximately 12-acre site triangular parcel. The area is at the terminus of Wild Horse Rd and bounded by residential development to the west, by **State Route 4** to the east, and Wild Horse Road, the Contra Costa Water District's Pumping Plant 4, and the Contra Costa Canal to the south. The proposed project would also include parking, landscaping managed by a homeowner's association, and 1.6 acres of open space, including recreational amenities for residents. The Wild Horse Road extension is currently under construction through this parcel.

Transportation Development Act

The City has submitted their application for the Transportation Development Act (TDA) Article 3 Grant. If awarded, this grant will **fund pedestrian safety** improvements near Turner Elementary School and Fremont Elementary School, including updated signage and striping as well as installing curb ramps and flashing crossing beacons.

Engineering

Capital Improvement's P.W. 392-31 Pavement Rehabilitation Project is currently in progress. The project consists of the **construction** of concrete curb, gutter, sidewalk, and curb ramps, cold planing existing roadway sections, installing asphalt **concrete plugs**, replacement of traffic signal loop detector, installation of PMAR chip seal, and micro-surfacing on **Hillcrest Avenue**, Gentrytown Drive, and Delta Fair Boulevard. There will be some lane closures with minimal impacts on motorists during construction, which is expected to conclude by **September 2021**.

Opportunity Zones in California

Antioch has **census tracts** that include areas around the Somersville Town Center, the BART station, and Wilbur Avenue. The federal tax bill passed at the end of December 2017 allows the Governor to designate certain census tracts as **Opportunity Zones**. Investments made by individuals through special funds in these zones would be allowed to defer or eliminate federal taxes on capital gains.
