New Voter Mailbox

In cooperation with the Contra Costa County Clerks Office, the City installed a new voter mailbox in the City Hall parking lot near the main entrance. This mailbox will allow voters to drop off their ballot from their vehicle conveniently. During non-election season, the mailbox will be covered to avoid confusion with the nearby mailbox for City water payments.

Water Feature at Hillcrest Avenue

Repairs are complete, and the water feature at the intersection of Hillcrest Avenue and Deer Valley Road is operable for the first time in almost ten years. The piece of artwork representing the convergence of the San Joaquin and Sacramento Rivers at our waterfront was turned off during the downturn in the economy and also prohibited from being operated during the drought. To continue our beautification efforts around Antioch, this and other water features and artwork are being repaired and restored to their original glory.




Code Enforcement

- You need to update your voter registration if you: Move to a new residence, change your name, or want to change your political party affiliation.
- You are eligible to register to vote if you are: A United States citizen, 18 years of age or older on Election Day, not in prison, on parole, serving state prison sentence in a county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.


