Mayor and Members of the City Council:

This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending February 9, 2018.

CITY MANAGER

Along with consultant Wally Bishop, I attended a Water Desalination Grant Program

Round 4 Draft Funding Recommendation and Continuous Application Process public workshop to receive comments on Draft Funding Recommendations held at Metropolitan Water District. The Department of Water Resources (DWR) received 30 proposals from applicants statewide with 8 recommended for funding. The City of Antioch was one of three proposals receiving a recommended \$10,000,000 grant award which was the highest amount available. In total, over \$34,000,000 in grant funding was recommended for final



award which is scheduled to be released by the DWR Director the week of February 19th. This grant construction funding will go toward the estimated \$62,000,000 brackish water desalination plant the City is proposing to construct. This facility would provide Antioch with 6 million gallons of quality, drought-proof water when the San Joaquin River salt levels increase beyond freshwater standards. Besides providing a more reliable water supply to our 115,000 residents and existing businesses, this project would provide a significant economic development benefit to businesses and industry looking to locate in the Bay Area and California.

I attended the Economic Development Commission meeting where a presentation on the economic benefits of allowing various types of cannabis-related businesses was made by the Commission Subcommittee on Cannabis. The Commission will be making a condensed version of this presentation to the City Council at their February 13th meeting. The City has hired Muni Services to conduct a more in-depth analysis which is scheduled to be presented to the Economic Development Commission in early March

with a presentation to the City Council scheduled for late March. While there is a moratorium in place until August, the City Council is gathering information and will be deliberating on this matter over the next several months.

I also attended a, "Join the Conversation" Quality of Life presentation at Public Works where residents and users of SeeClickFix were invited via the app. The goal of the meeting was to gather information from our residents on what they feel are important issues facing the City. There were many questions on many different topics and staff attempted to provide answers and invited follow-up with folks who still had questions or concerns. Participants were encouraged to complete a short survey where they could rank issues facing our City and provide additional comments on things that are most important to them. These types of meetings will be held throughout the community in order to get feedback on what is most important to our residents and businesses. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Building

On February 7, 2018, the Building Division issued a permit for construction of the Rocketship Charter Elementary School to be located at 1700 Cavallo Road. The school will serve up to 600 students between Pre-K and 5th Grade with 32 full-time staff. The Developer is in the process of completing the demolition phase of the project.



Planning

From Wednesday, February 7, 2018 to Friday, February 9, 2018, City staff attended the Science Advisor's Workshop for the Habitat Conservation Plan effort that is currently underway. The workshop included a field trip with expert scientists to evaluate the condition and value of wildlife habitat in the City of Antioch, as well as discussions with interested parties and affected public agencies. The Habitat Conservation Plan is continuing through the ordinary drafting process. On February 7, 2018, the Planning Commission held a meeting and took the following actions:

- 1. Recommended to the City Council that they approve the rezone of 1600 G Street from Single Family Residential (R-6) to Convenience Commercial (C-1). This is the site of the former Lee's Snack Bar and rezoning the site to Convenience Commercial (C-1) would allow the restaurant use at the site to be resumed.
- 2. Reviewed the preliminary development plan for the Delta Fair Village project at the intersection of Delta Fair Boulevard and Buchanan Road. The project includes the demolition of two large commercial buildings and the construction of a 308-unit multifamily residential building complex with four four-story towers. The Planning Commission offered general feedback to the applicant for further refinement of the project.



On February 13, 2018, the City Council will consider the Wildflower Station project, a large mixed-use development with 22 single-family homes, 98 multi-family apartments, and 89,422 square feet of new commercial space. The project site is 23 acres in size and is located at northeast corner of Hillcrest Avenue and Wildflower Drive. The Planning Commission recommended approval on January 17.
