COVID-19 Testing Site at the Antioch Community Center

Contra Costa residents who need a fast, convenient, no-cost COVID-19 test will have a new option in Antioch. A **mobile testing site** provided through the State of California is moving from Los Medanos College in Pittsburg to the Antioch Community Center, **4703 Lone Tree Way**, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Thursday through Monday – weekend appointments available.

The new location is intended to increase **testing access** to East County neighborhoods heavily impacted by the pandemic. Appointments are required to get a test. To make a testing appointment in Antioch or other community testing sites across Contra Costa County, **call 1-844-421-0804** or schedule online at **coronavirus.cchealth.org/get-tested**.

Home To Home™ Proving Successful in Finding New Homes for Antioch Pets

HOME TO HOME

In July 2020, Antioch Animal Services launched a new interactive tool, **Home To Home™**, to give families who are no longer able to keep their pets an opportunity to find new homes without surrendering them to the shelter. In the seven months since we began offering this service, **56 pets** have been listed for rehoming, with 16 finding a new home and only two pets having to be surrendered to the shelter.

Home To Home[™] is a great tool to help keep pets out of the shelter. Those needing to **re-home pets** should visit our Home To Home[™] **website**, fill out a brief form, upload a picture, and hit submit. For those seeking a new pet, visit the website and use the search feature to help you find a new pet. Home To Home[™] is free for everyone to use; however, there are some rules to the site, such as no money is allowed to exchange hands. Re-homing fees don't lead to better outcomes for pets, but **quality communications** with potential adopters will.

Our participation in Home To Home™ is due to **Maddie's Fund** Grant's generous support, #ThankstoMaddie. Our share of the Maddie's Fund Grant covers the cost of our own Home To Home™ branded website and a year of web hosting.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Permit Software Upgrade

The Community Development Department will soon be embarking on the installation of a new permit software system. After a thorough Request for Proposal (RFP) process, the Department selected EnerGov, a software system offered by **Tyler Technologies**, **Inc**. According to their website, EnerGov is a "Comprehensive, Automated, Connected Civic Services Software for **Smart Government Operations**."

The Community Development Department intends to apply this permitting software's full capabilities to do far more than simply issue building permits. This software will be **custom built** to service the Building Inspection Services Division, Planning Division, Code Enforcement Division, Engineering Division of the Public Works Department, and the Environmental Programs function.

The public will be able to access information on current and proposed development, monitor building permit progress and inquire about active **code enforcement cases**. The software has a **built-in GIS feature** that will allow users and the public to access a map to display this information. Building inspectors and code enforcement officers will be able to input inspection information and generate cases in the field, saving time and resources.

Permit Software Cont.

In addition, Energov will allow for online submittal, review, and issuance of building permits and many other common planning and engineering permits. This will save time for both the public and staff, reduce our carbon footprint by reducing trips to City Hall, and create a safer environment in this era of COVID-19.

The City Council approved the contract for the Energov project on January 26, 2021, and implementation and **training will begin soon**. A Technology Fee funds the project collected on all building permits for this specific purpose. Our goal is to have this production fully operational by the end of the calendar year. Sandbags

The City's self-serve sandbag station is up and running. It is located at the Public Works facility at 1201 W 4th Street; enter at N Street, and you will find the station just before the chain link gate on the right; it is stocked with bags, shovels, and a sand funnel while supplies last. There is no charge for the sandbags due to COVID-19.

PUBLIC WORKS

Operations & Utilities

Our **collection cleaning crew** is currently working off Gentrytown Drive between James Donlon Boulevard and Buchanan Road, doing an outstanding job, cleaning approximately 4,000 feet of pipe each day. This is an **essential aspect** of what we do here in collections; it is vital for our sewer system to stay functioning properly. These procedures **reduce** the inconveniences and environmental effects of a sanitary sewer spill on members of our community. This will also minimize FROG (**Fats, Rags, Oils, and Grease**) related issues in the sewer system.

A friendly reminder about FROG:

Scrape and wipe down pots, pans, and work areas before washing Dispose of food waste directly into compost bin or trash. Do not pour waste oil directly into the drain, parking lot, or street. Do not use emulsifiers or solvents other than dishwashing detergents Do not flush rags or wipes down the toilet. (even flushable wipes damage your system)

We will be working in that area for the next few weeks. If you see a truck with a big tank and blue hose attached to the front, know that your sewer system is being maintained.




