
Approval for Temporary Housing

City Vision and Strategic Plan- Council Study Session



City Manager Conference

Along with a couple of hundred other city managers, I attended the League of California Cities City Manager Conference. Particularly informative sessions included our CalPERS employee retirement system and steps that are being taken to keep employer costs down and investments earning up, strategies to address homelessness on a regional basis, and the importance of keeping ethics at the forefront of all decisions and interactions.





Stolen Property Returned

She was absolutely devastated as her scooter was necessary for her to be able to get around. Unfortunately, at the time of the report, there were no leads for officers. A few days after the theft, the investigating officer, Officer Angelini, received information that the scooters may be listed on an online selling app. Officer Angelini used this information and dove into the investigation head-first, determined to identify the responsible and get the stolen property back. It took some time, but with the assistance of the victim, we were able to identify and arrest the responsible and recover the victim's property. It's always a good day when a plan comes together.

Hula and Tahitian Dance



If they are lucky, they learn how to be their best selves and repeating themselves over and over. Or maybe they can get made into something different. Over the next six weeks, regardless of whether Punxsutawney Phil sees his shadow or not, we are going to be highlighting garbage and recycling issues in a new Trash Talk Tuesdays feature. 1st Tip: If your 2020 plans include a refresh on your furniture and appliances, please consider donation or resale before you discard. Check out www.recyclewhere.org to search for recycling and reuse options. If the items you are replacing are not suitable for resale or donation, schedule to have two large items picked up every calendar year for free with your Residential Service through Republic Services, 925-685-4711.

Planning

On Wednesday, February 5, 2020, the Planning Commission considered a new ordinance regarding Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs). The State of California recently adopted laws that mandate that cities make greater provisions for ADUs and directs the adoption of an ordinance clarifying the requirements and allowances. An Accessory Dwelling Unit is a secondary unit that is constructed either as part of or detached from a single-family dwelling. In some cases, an ADU can be constructed as part of a multifamily project. The goal of the new laws is to increase housing availability in California. The Planning Commission recommended that the City Council adopt the proposed ordinance. This item will be before the City Council at its February 25, 2020 meeting. 

- You need to update your voter registration if you:
 - Move to a new residence, change your name, or want to change your political party affiliation.
- You are eligible to register to vote if you are:
 - A United States citizen, 18 years of age or older on Election Day, not in prison, on parole, serving state prison sentence in a county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.

Park Improvements

Construction to replace the play structure at Chichibu Park is progressing. As a cost-saving measure, Public Works crews handled the demolition and removal of the old structure and removed 300 yards of sand. Playground sand is costly, so we will use the sand in other parks with sand areas; this action will save us approximately \$15,000. Also, cost-saving, our Street Maintenance crews took care of leveling the play areas, and they are preparing to resurface the parking lot.

Two large pine trees had to be removed for safety reasons; they will be replaced in the future with a Scarlet Oak tree and a Crepe Myrtle tree. Although it looks bare right now, the contractor will begin installing the equipment in the coming weeks. We invite you to check back here and on our Facebook page for updates on this project. Chichibu Park is located at Longview Road and Acorn Drive, situated on over six acres in the neighborhood next to Sutter Elementary School.



Community Enhancements

The fountain in the median of Deer Valley Road and Hillcrest Avenue is back on! The fountain is situated perfectly at this major thoroughfare, enhancing the location as commuters head back and forth on Highway 4. The fountain pump recirculates water into a fine mist where most of the water is recaptured; it also has a wind feature and will shut off during high winds. We hope you are as pleased as we are to see it back up and running after some work.

City Hall Construction


As part of the Council Chambers Remodeling project, the open breezeway between the Chambers and City Hall is being enclosed beginning January 22nd through February. During construction, access to City Hall will only be available through the west entrance. Signs are posted to guide visitors, and a greeter is in place at the west entrance to assist visitors with building access and directions weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m and 5:00 p.m. during construction.



Northern Waterfront Economic Development Initiative



On Thursday, February 3rd, Economic Development Director, Kwame Reed, attended the Northern Waterfront Economic Development Initiative Ad Hoc Committee meeting in Martinez. County staff presented the group with updates on the action plan that included trademarking related to the initiative, short-line rail study in Wilbur Ave. Corridor, work with State Lands Commission in the Crockett area, and a budget proposal.

The Commission and staff are excited to get this project underway.






