New City Attorney

Roadway Safety

Traffic-related issues continue to be a high priority with our citizens, and we are taking action to address those concerns. Our traffic detail recently focused on several areas throughout the city that have generated traffic complaints. All of these focus areas were brought to our attention by concerned citizens and neighborhood residents. As a result of this directed enforcement, our officers issued:

- (28) Moving violation citations,
- (15) Equipment & Registration citations,
- (1) Suspended License Citation which resulted in the driver's car being towed, and
- (1) Misdemeanor warrant arrest.

Driver and pedestrian safety is very important and we will continue scheduling details to keep roadway safe. When drivers are mindful of the "rules of the road," fewer accidents happen, and it makes driving and walking around the city safer for everyone.

Planning - Legal Nonconforming

On February 6, 2019, the Planning Commission recommended that the City Council adopt changes to the Zoning Ordinance to address legal nonconforming land uses and structures. Many folks commonly referred to buildings or land use as being "grandfathered," though the technical term for such a situation is legal nonconforming.



To be classified as legal nonconforming, a building or land use must have been established legally in the past but does not meet today's current zoning

standards. Examples might include a single-family home that was legally built in the 1960s on a residentiallyzoned street that has since been rezoned to commercial, such as A Street. This house would be considered legal nonconforming.

Another example is a house that was initially built just three feet from the side property line, where the current requirement is five feet. This condition would also be considered legal nonconforming. It is important to note that the legal nonconforming protections apply only to zoning standards and do not extend to the Building Code – any new construction, remodel, or repair work must meet current structural and safety standards.

The new rules surrounding legal nonconforming uses or structures attempt to balance the City's ultimate desire to steer existing development towards the new standards while maintaining owner's rights to use their property as initially intended and built. These new standards address what happens when a building is destroyed by fire or when the use is suspended for an extended period of time.



Office has placed large maps of the City



Emergency Sewer Repair

Our Sewer Collection crew responded to an emergency sewer main break on Carpinteria. The responding team secured the perimeter of the collapsed pipe to protect passing vehicle traffic. Our crew worked late into the night and early the next morning with another utility to restore flow for this resident. Our emergency response crew was also responding to flooding calls throughout the city.



The Public Works office is located at 1201 W 4th Street. We are open to serve the public from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays. Our Emergency Standby crew is on call seven days a week, 24 hour a day, 365 days a

year. If you require Public Works' assistance outside of our regular business hours, please call PD dispatch at 925-778-2441, and they will dispatch our emergency crews to assist you.



Park Ridge Model Homes

Model homes are open for viewing at Park Ridge Subdivision by Davidon Homes, located north of the intersection of Pinnacle View Way and Mountain Ridge Way, just east of Canada Valley Road, and at Heidorn Village Subdivision by Meritage Homes, located at the northwest corner of Heidorn Ranch Road and Prewett Ranch Drive. Homes in Davidon's Phase 1 have sold rapidly, and the release of Phase 2 is anticipated very soon.

Free On-Call Clean-Ups for Antioch Residents
