# **Mayor and Members of the City Council:**

This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending February 16, 2018.

### **CITY MANAGER**

The City Council had a productive week. On Tuesday night, they approved the Wildflower Station Planned Development located at the northeast corner of Hillcrest Avenue at the intersection with Deer Valley Road and Davison Drive. This 23-acre project will develop a key parcel of land close to BART and transit and include 90,000 sq. ft. of commercial uses, 98 market-rate condominium units, and 22 single family homes. Council also received public input regarding the drafting of a proposed map or maps and the sequencing of elections for a District-Based system of electing Antioch Council Members. The same presentation on District-Based elections was made at a Special City Council Meeting held on Thursday evening at the Antioch Community Center. In addition to providing public comment on the proposed idea of districts, the public was encouraged to identify "Communities of Interest" so the demographers can begin the process of creating potential district boundaries. The final deadline for comments to be considered for the Draft Maps is March 7th. A third Special Meeting is scheduled for March 10<sup>th</sup>. At this Public Hearing, drafts of possible district alignments will be presented and discussed.

Antioch resident Joyann Motts submitted an FPPC Form 501 "Candidate Intention Statement" to run for a City Council seat in the November 6th General Election. The Filing Period for City Council Candidates will take place July 16 to August 10, 2018, for the November General Election.

# **Building**



On February 7, 2018, the Building Division issued a permit for construction of the Rocketship Charter Elementary School to be located at 1700 Cavallo Road. The school will serve up to 600 students between Pre-K and 5<sup>th</sup> Grade with 32 full-time staff. The Developer is in the process of completing the demolition phase of the project.

# **Planning**

On Tuesday, February 13, 2018, the City Council approved the second and final reading of the ordinance adopting the Downtown Specific Plan. This Plan provides general land use guidance, as well as zoning and development standards for a greater Downtown Antioch. The Plan was funded by the Sustainable Communities Planning Grant and Incentives Program through Strategic Growth Council. On February 13, 2018, the City Council also approved the Wildflower Station project, a large mixed-use development with 22 single-family homes, 98 multifamily apartments, and 89,422 square feet of new commercial space. The project site is 23 acres in size and is located at northeast corner of Hillcrest Avenue and Wildflower Drive. The Planning Commission recommended approval on January 1, 2018. ### **PUBLIC WORKS**

What is a V-Ditch? You may have seen a v-ditch and not really knew what it is or why we need them. During the winter months v-ditches play an important role in collecting and conveying storm water. Over time vegetation and sediment collects in the v-ditches. Periodic removal of this material is required to maintain the hydraulic capacity of the ditches.

# **Capital Improvements/Engineering Division**

Ghilotti Brothers Construction recently completed the seventh phase of the City's Downtown Pavement Roadway Rehabilitation program. This project removed and replaced the asphalt concrete pavement on West Seventh Street from 'D' to 'G' Streets, West Eighth Street from 'D' to 'G' Streets, 'E' Street from West Sixth and West Tenth Streets and 'F' Street from West Sixth and West Ninth Streets. Six intersections were



completely rebuilt to improve storm water drainage and pedestrian access. Twenty-four curb ramps were constructed and numerous improvements were made to deteriorating, damaged and uneven concrete flatwork within the project area.

# **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

The City Manager's Economic Development Department is interviewing Public Relations and Marketing Firms that made the shortlist for the City. Council has expressed a need for marketing Antioch and authorized \$100,000 for this effort. Final interviews are scheduled for next week with a recommendation for firm selection to be made to the City Council in March 2018.

At this week's City Council Meeting, the Economic Development Commission (EDC) made a presentation on the potential for locating different types of cannabis businesses in the City. A final Council decision on the matter will be made by August 2018.




