
Contra Costa County Mayor's Conference

Suburban Poverty Task Force

Mayor's Conference hosted by the City of Concord. The panel <u>COUNTY MAYORS' CONFERENCE</u> discussion of recycling experts discussed the China National Sword and the Great Recycling Recession. The environmental and cost implications of China's change in policy on taking recycling from California is staggering. Only certain plastic bottles and jugs and corrugated cardboard currently have any recycling value with the rest, including glass and paper, basically valueless. Along with SB 1383 which mandates residential food recycling, and a myriad of other bills intended to protect the environment, the cost of recycling and garbage service will increase significantly.



LOCC City Manager's Conference

At last week's League of California Cities City Manager's Conference I attended several very informative sessions that included collaborative local California cities into the future which focused on building appropriate technology infrastructure, evolving trends in cannabis regulations, and federal and state approved Opportunity Zones. These zones may be enhanced with EIFDs/CRIAs (Enhanced Infrastructure Financing Districts/Community Revitalization and Investment Authorities) both of which utilize tax increment to finance infrastructure and redevelopment of underutilized property. The Suburban Poverty Task Force convened a meeting to discuss homelessness in Antioch and specifically downtown. Mayor Wright, Mayor Pro Tem Motts, Contra Costa County Homeless Services Director Lavonna Martin, city staff, business owners, nonprofits and faith-based groups were in attendance. The discussion focused on the significant challenges facing our city and county in the area of homelessness. The goal is to meet and discuss strategies; reduce misperceptions; identify broader community-based solutions with improved decision making and actions allowing for better impacts and outcomes.

Police- Animal Services

Backyard Chickens We are often asked if it is okay to keep backyard chickens. The short answer is, yes! The long answer is, Antioch



Municipal Code requires that you obtain a permit to own fowl (chickens or ducks), in certain circumstances. A permit is required if you want to own more than ten fowl within the City limits, or if you're going to own a rooster. The keeping of chickens and ducks in our City requires you to follow all pertinent City Codes, and the fowl cannot be located within 20 feet of any dwelling. The area where the fowl are housed must also be kept clean and must provide adequate room for the animal(s) being housed.

Chickens, ducks, roosters, etc., are not allowed to be "at large" at any time, nor to be off their owner's property. Also, when applying for a permit to own a rooster, or to keep more than ten fowl, the permitting process requires approval from your neighbors', and an inspection of the area where the fowl will be kept. 

Community Development


Building

The Community Development Department is working to update and expand its Unreinforced Masonry Building program. Presently, the City recognizes twenty-five unreinforced masonry buildings, based off surveys conducted in 1991. Over the years, several of these building have undergone seismic retrofits and are now eligible for new categorizations.



The goal of this program is to inform and educate property

owners and the public about the risks of unreinforced masonry buildings and to promote seismic retrofits of eligible buildings. Over the coming months, City staff will be updating its inventory of affected buildings and will be presenting the City Council with a new ordinance addressing the issue.



Code Enforcement Presentation

On February 20, 2019, at 7:00 p.m. the Code Enforcement Division will be making a presentation before the Police Crime Prevention Commission about Code Enforcement processes and procedures. Code Enforcement staff will be available to discuss Code Enforcement in the City of Antioch and to answer questions.


