COMMUNITY FIRST

As we enter the new year, the City of Antioch is uniquely positioned to **celebrate** the 150th anniversary of our cityhood. Historically, Antioch started as one of the oldest cities in Contra Costa County and has morphed into the second largest city of approximately 115,000 residents. Acknowledging and **paying homage** to the founders of Antioch provides a sense of community and reverence, which we all can embrace. From the rolling hillsides that grace our skyline to the shimmering river waters, where the San Joaquin River intersects with the Sacramento Delta, the City of Antioch is a wonderful enclave where a strong sense of **community exists**. This collective sensation of community was the impetus and driving force behind the City Council's decision to create a Community Resources - Public Safety Department.

This newly formed department will consist of several existing departmental divisions, including Animal Services, Environmental Resource, Code Enforcement, Community Development Block Grant, and programming Youth Network Services. Additionally, the City Council has supported creating several new divisions that will serve our residents and improve the quality of life for those in desperate need of city services. These newly formed divisions will **concentrate** on the community crisis and our unhoused residents. The development of the city's community crisis **intervention response team** is still at the infancy stage. Nevertheless, once the planning phase is completed, the citywide mobile response team will provide much-needed services and enhance our city government's overall effectiveness. This sentiment is equally welcoming to our newly formed, full-time Unhoused Resident Coordinator position. The Unhoused Resident Coordinator plays a vital role in ensuring our unhoused residents receive the best and most **dignified services** befitting to individuals who are either suffering from mental health challenges or who have just fallen on hard times.

The true measurement of any governmental entity is determined by how well it serves those in the greatest need of services. Regardless of either an individual's moral or political views, one thing is certain, our **collective quality of life** is intrinsically intertwined. This humanitarian bond is the main ingredient to a healthy and caring community. Opportunity lives here under the **banner of community** because family and community always come first.



LOVE IS IN THE AIR

Love is in the air in Antioch and your officers had the opportunity to share some heart-shaped greetings with our **beloved community members** at the Bedford Center. Officer Kendall was challenged by Richard to a good ol' fashioned game of hoops. It's hard to say who won, but the two hugged it out in the end, acknowledging it was all love. We don't need to be struck by Cupid's arrows in Antioch to **spread the love** to our community.

The Bedford Center primarily serves East Contra Costa County and is the only licensed adult day health care center in this region. Their **adult day programs** provide services for frail elders and adults with disabilities to remain independent and retain their dignity while engaging in an active social life. **https://choiceinaging.org/adult-day-centers/**

RECOVERED STOLEN VEHICLES

Our officers recovered three stolen vehicles with three suspects in custody in four hours. What's even more impressive is that two of the stolen vehicles were recovered 15 minutes apart from one another.

When it comes to stolen vehicles, California ranks amongst the states with the highest rates in the country. According to the California Highway Patrol, in 2020, there were approximately **180,939** vehicles stolen at an estimated total value of \$1.6 billion. With that said, of the 180,939 cars stolen statewide in 2020, 89.2 percent were successfully recovered, representing 161,464 recovered vehicles.

In Antioch, we strive to reacquaint owners with their vehicles every opportunity we get and have been able to recover 62 stolen vehicles so far in 2022.

CITY CLERK HISTORY

In honor of **Antioch's 150th anniversary**, here is some history about early Antioch City Council Meetings!

The Honorable **Roswell Butler Hard** was elected as Contra Costa County Supervisor 1866-1868 and Sheriff from 1867 and 1869. He built his large **two-story brick house** on Front (First) Street in 1869 using bricks from Antioch's first brick factory. It was considered the nicest and most costly home in the area at the time. It served as the **meeting place** for the first board of trustees (called the city council today) for the newly incorporated City of Antioch. Roswell Butler Hard was elected mayor at this meeting! Known now as the "Roswell Butler Hard House," this **historic building** is owned by the City of Antioch. Although it remains vacant, there are plans to **renovate** the building and use it for satellite city hall offices.

WASTEWATER REPAIR CREW

The City of Antioch Collection Systems Division has a wastewater repair crew dedicated to repairing the **City's Sanitary** and **Storm Sewer Conveyance Systems**. This construction/repair crew consists of a large backhoe, vacuum truck and three to four Wastewater/Collection Systems employees who are specifically trained in all aspects of underground wastewater and storm system repairs. The construction/repair crew responds to emergency pipe failures and **strategically planned repairs** within the Collection Systems where teams have identified structural defects, major root intrusion, or any other potential pipe failure that may occur.

The City's Sanitary and Storm Sewer Construction/Repair Maintenance Program ensures that the system continues to operate at full capacity and **renews our aging infrastructure**. If you see this crew working in the field, please respect the construction zone by keeping away from the safety cones and barricades and understand that loud, heavy construction equipment is in use, as this is **for everyone's safety**.



NEW CITY HALL ENTRYWAY!

As the City continues to spruce up the edifice and surrounding areas at City Hall with a new Council Chambers, updated interior, **ADA accessible breezeway**, and entryway, the walk up to City Hall has also had a makeover with a **newly paved concrete** and brick inlay area!
