Mayor and Members of the City Council: This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending February 23, 2018.

CITY MANAGER

We have completed our interviews with Public Relations & Marketing firms and will be bringing a recommendation to the City Council so we can begin this exciting prospect of professionally branding and marketing our city.

I attended the swearing-in of lateral Officer Shane Cole, our 96th sworn officer currently serving Antioch. Welcome to the Antioch family Shane.

I met with District Director Erica Rodriguez-Langley and Contra Costa County & Delta Field Representative Charles Dulac of Assemblymember Jim Frazier's office to discuss the numerous projects in Antioch and how we can better utilize the contacts and programs Assemblymember Frazier's office can help us access. Of particular interest is our brackish water desalination project and economic development opportunities related to workforce development and transportation funds.

Along with Mayor Wright, Council Member Ogorchock, City Clerk Simonsen, Chief Brooks and a number of other dignitaries and project advocates, I attended the ribboncutting of the Rocketship Charter School at their new site on Cavallo Road. The \$15M investment in this underserved area of town and quality educational opportunities for 600 K through 5th grade students and their families are two positive aspects of this very exciting project and opportunity to improve Antioch's quality of life.

I attended longtime downtown resident and business owner Jim Lanter's 40th anniversary in business as a State Farm Agent "ribbon-cutting" at his office in downtown Antioch. Thank you, Jim, for your ongoing commitment and contribution to making Antioch, and especially our downtown the best it can be.

We are proud to introduce our newest lateral police hire, Officer Shane Cole. Shane grew up in Antioch and graduated from Antioch High School in 2002. Shortly after graduating High School, Shane enlisted in the Marine Corps and eventually became an Infantry Mortarman, deploying twice before re-enlisting to become a combat skills instructor. Shane was honorably discharged at the rank of Sergeant.

After returning to the Bay Area in 2014, Shane was hired by the Modesto Police Department and graduated from the Stanislaus Sheriff's Regional Training Center in September 2015. Shane was assigned to patrol before accepting a job with the City of Antioch.

As part of the new program initiated by Chief Brooks, APD Police Officers began visiting Antioch schools during their lunch breaks to give students chance to meet Police Officers in a different setting. On February 14, 2018, Officer Marcotte visited students at MNO Grant Elementary. The students got to play games with Officer Marcotte and ask him questions about police work. Officer Marcotte was able to start building relationships, answer questions, and educate



students on how our Officers work every day to keep our City safe.

Ball field preparations are underway for the 2018 Adult Softball and Youth Baseball seasons at Antioch Community Park. Infields are being turned over and dirt is being added and smoothed out. All three fields are getting irrigation tune-ups, tree trimming, and fence repairs. The snack bar is opening after a long winter closure; all machines need to be fired back up and tested, and supplies are being delivered and stocked.

On Thursday, over 40 members of the Antioch community benefitted from free tax services provided by trained AARP Tax Service Representatives. This free program will continue each Thursday at the Antioch Senior Center, 415 West 2nd Street between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm, ending on April 12, 2018.

Planning

On Tuesday, February 27, 2018, the City Council will consider an amendment to the Municipal Code that addresses the use of donation bins throughout the City of Antioch. Donation bins can serve as a great tool to support local charities that can offer the donated items to those in need.

Unfortunately, if not properly tended and managed, donation bins can also lead to unsightly conditions. The proposed regulations require that donation bins be approved through an Administrative Use Permit (AUP) by the Planning Division prior to their placement. The AUP would ensure that the location does not conflict with parking, damage landscaping, or otherwise create a problem. In addition, the Planning Division would be enabled to revoke the AUP should the donation bin become a problem. On February 27, 2018, the City Council will also consider the second reading of the approval of the Wildflower Station project, a large mixed use development with 22 single-family homes, 98 multifamily apartments, and 89,422 square feet of new commercial space. The project site is 23 acres in size and is located at northeast corner of Hillcrest Avenue and Wildflower Drive. The City Council offered the initial approval on February 13, 2018.

Code Enforcement

On February 27, 2018, the City Council will consider an amendment to the Municipal Code that addresses the issuance of fines and, specifically, repeat offenders. When the Code Enforcement Division encounters a violation, they typically provide a Notice of Violation, which serves as a warning with direction for compliance that is generally required within ten days. If the terms of the Notice of Violation are not met, a citation is issued. In some cases, however, offenders will temporarily correct the violation to avoid the citation, but will then resume the violation once the case has been closed. When the Code Enforcement Officer returns, they are compelled to issue a new Notice of Violation and repeat the warning process.

The proposed language would eliminate this step and allow the Code Enforcement Officer to issue a citation if the same violation occurs within one year of the initial Notice of Violation. Even if a party corrects the violation within ten days, they could not repeat the violation within one year without risk of an immediate citation. We hope that this improvement to the process will promote better stewardship of property throughout the City of Antioch and increase compliance.

Sanitary Sewer Maintenance Systems

Our Vac-Con trucks offer many useful options when it comes to cleaning and repairing our infrastructure. The Vac-Con is equipped with a 16 cubic yard tank that can hold 3,200 gallons of water and debris and we utilize these trucks to their fullest capabilities.

During cleaning operations we use over a 1,000 feet of hose with 3,000 PSI to remove roots, grease and debris from sewer pipes. The vacuum system is able to remove large amounts of dirt without damaging the pipes. It also has the capacity to vacuum debris 30 feet down a manhole.

This is just one of the vehicles in our fleet that helps make a clean, safe and beautiful Antioch.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Colliers 2017 Industrial/Commercial Property Summary & Future Projections The Antioch Industrial/Commercial real estate market continues to stay busy, as 2018 unfolds, the Highway 4 Corridor will be good for property owners and be challenging for buyers. However, dynamics are in place that will cause new construction.

Lease rates and price points on building sales are still below the returns needed to encourage new development in East County and land available for development has become increasingly scarce along the Highway 4 Corridor with the best opportunities in the eastern portion of the region. The cost of new development has increased significantly since last quarter. Below is a list of properties that were leased or sold in the last quarter of 2017 in Antioch:

- Smart 72 Solar Co. leased an approximate 1,700 sf. office/warehouse building on Verne Robert Circle in Antioch, a Northern California expansion from their Central Coast hub.
- Rocketship Charter Schools purchased a 24,000 sf. office/warehouse building on 2 acres at 1700 Cavallo St. Antioch to convert to a neighborhood charter school.
- Swirls Frozen Yogurt leased a 1,347 sf. in-line retail shop at Bluerock Center, Antioch. The premium Bluerock Center is a mix of high-quality office property (Sutter Delta Urgent Care, Contra Costa Medical College, TrueMed Home Services) and retail (Starbucks, Mr. Pickles, Swirls).
- The 23,750 sf. Antioch Indoor Sports facility at the Hillcrest Ave and Highway 4 interchange sold to a private investment group that will continue to operate the premier indoor sports facilities.
- TrueMed Home, an in-home assistance & care placement business leased 1,750 sf. at the Bluerock Center Antioch. This is an expansion of their So. San Francisco and Walnut Creek-based operations.
- Expanding from San Leandro CA, Bay View Insulation leased a 2,100 sf. office/ warehouse property 2515 W. 10th Street, Antioch, to support the residential construction expansion along the Highway 4 Corridor.

- Tidal Marine relocated from its Concord location to 2540 Wilbur Ave, Antioch. The 1.5-acre property with shop and office buildings was the ideal mix for the marine construction business.
- ABC (American Builders & Contractors) Supply, the national roofing, and construction supply, recently augmented their Martinez CA branch by also signing a 10-year lease at 2701 Verne Roberts Circle, Antioch, The property is a 20,000 sf. warehouse/showroom & office building situated on 2 acres with fenced yard.
- The 8,800 sf. "Home Team Pest" building on W. 10th. Street, Antioch sold to a private family trust. The tenant recently signed a long-term lease extension, positioning the property ideally for long-term steady income.
- ATT signed a lease extension on approximately 50,000 sf. warehouse on Verne Roberts Circle Antioch to extend their long-term occupancy at the warehouse & office facility. The building has a unique combination of features that include dock high loading, fenced yard areas, quality corporate office image and quick freeway (Highway 4) access.

Where Are We Headed?

- The trend of lower vacancy rates will continue through 2018; making it increasingly challenging for some businesses to find a suitable property.
- There will be more and more qualified small owner-occupier building buyers in the market, and fewer buildings available for sale.
- The Highway 4 widening is set to surprise many on how efficient it is to move in and out of the Highway 4 Corridor.
- \circ Warehouse rental rates will rise another ±10% in 2018.
- BART to Antioch will become operational in May 2018, from Pittsburg to the Hillcrest Station.
