New Look to your Water Bill coming soon!

Beginning with your March bills, your City of Antioch Water Utility Bill will have a **new look**. We're about providing superior customer service. To better serve you, we're launching a new, redesigned bill statement. The new design is more **user-friendly** and informative.

Simplified Design: The goal of the new design is to better organize the data to make reading your bill simple, while still providing the information you need to understand the rates and charges.

Detailed Water Use Breakdown: Compare your water use to last cycle or last year with the monthly usage table. This new feature makes it easier for you to manage your water use.

Brackish Water Desalination Plant Groundbreaking

On Friday, February 19th, Antioch City Council Members, City staff, and state dignitaries broke ground on the City's new and **historic Brackish Water Desalination Plant**. The new desalination facilities will



improve the **City's water supply** reliability and operational flexibility. Once built, the desalination facility, located at the existing water treatment plant, will provide 6 million gallons per day of capacity (producing up to 5,500-acre feet per year (ac-ft/yr), helping the **City reduce its purchases** of more expensive water. Once completed, Antioch will be firmly positioned to preserve its **pre-1914 water rights** and provide the City with a reliable drinking water source for generations to come.



Contra Costa Extends Vaccine Eligibility to Essential Workers

Teachers, grocery workers and other **frontline essential workers** who live in Contra Costa County can now sign up to get vaccinated. Contra Costa Health Services (CCHS) updated its eligibility policy for **COVID-19 vaccine** to extend vaccination eligibility to residents who work in the education and childcare sector, food and agriculture workers, and emergency services workers as defined by California's vaccination plan **Phase 1B**. Residents in these groups, as well as county residents who are 65 years and older who have not yet been vaccinated, can sign up to access state and federal sites through **MyTurn** or by calling **(833) 422-4255**.

Dog Licensing

All dogs **over four months** of age are required to have a rabies vaccination and a City of Antioch Dog License. Dog Licenses must be purchased within 30 days of a new residence in Antioch or bringing a new dog home. For your convenience, Dog Licenses may be purchased online or by mail. To **purchase online**, visit **www.petdata.com/cs/ant**. To purchase by mail, send in a current rabies vaccination certificate, a spay/neuter certificate, and a check for the correct amount to Antioch Animal Services, 300 L Street, Antioch, CA 94509.

Due to the COVID pandemic, Antioch Animal Services is closed to walk-in patrons. To purchase dog licenses in person, you must make an appointment. Please call (925) 779-6989 in advance to **schedule an appointment**. Appointments are available daily and may be scheduled every 30 minutes from 10 AM – 5 PM on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday, or 10 AM – 2 PM on Sunday, Monday and Friday. The last appointment each day is 30 minutes before the close of business. When you arrive for your appointment, you must **wear a facemask** and maintain **social distancing** at all times. Be sure to bring a current rabies vaccination certificate and a spay/neuter certificate, if applicable, when you visit. The Antioch Community Center Goes Green

In partnership with the **Environmental Resource Department**, the Recreation Department is introducing new waste containers with dedicated space for trash, recycling, and compost at the Antioch Community Center. In addition to holding City Recreation programs, the Community Center holds over **200 private events** and meetings each



year, including weddings, receptions, quinceañeras, parties, and more, leading to large amounts of trash and food waste. With ten of these new containers installed, the facility is in **early compliance** with California SB 1383, aiming to reduce organic waste disposal by 75% by 2025.



Antioch Youth Scholarships are available now!

Would you like to **register your child** for a recreation program but can't because of a limited family budget? Financial assistance may be available through our Youth Activity Scholarships. **Funding is provided** by donations and the Antioch Community Foundation, a 501(c)(3) charitable organization. To be eligible, you must be an Antioch Resident or reside within the Antioch Unified School District (AUSD) boundary and meet household income requirements.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Environmental Programs for Students

Environmental Resources has been partnering with two environmental education programs for **Antioch schools**. With a focus on stormwater pollution, Kids for the Bay has been bringing their **Watershed Action Program** to Antioch Schools for over ten years. The program provides classroom activities and requires those teachers and principals who receive the program to continue implementing the curriculum in the years after. The **City helps to sponsor** working with a new teacher or teachers every year. Belshaw Elementary has been a long-standing participant in the program, and a video can be seen **here**.

We also partner with **Mr. Eco** to bring fun and engaging music performances to local schools. Mr. Eco schedules school concerts for K-6 (or 8) campuses focusing on recycling/litter or energy/water songs and messaging. With the sudden shift to distance learning due to the pandemic, both programs have adjusted and continue to offer programs to our schools. Due to **increased demand** this school year, Environmental Resources was able to increase the number of Mr. Eco performances sponsored.

Students at one of our local schools, **Antioch Charter Academy II**, were also part of a Mr. Eco music video, **Dates on Food**. Waste Prevention

Every year, roughly 63,000 tons of waste material is disposed of in local landfills by residents and businesses in Antioch. This equates to **3.1 pounds** per person every day! Our State mandated target is 4.2 pounds per person per day and the state average is 4.3, so great job! There are still a lot of resources that can be **diverted** from the landfill as we work on meeting the statewide goal of a 75% diversion rate.

In **partnership** with our Franchised Hauler, Republic Services the city offers many programs to help our businesses and residents reduce their waste. While subscribing to garbage and recycling service is mandatory for all, please keep in mind the even more important R's: Reducing your waste by not generating it, Reusing items, and Composting (Rot). 

Continuing Our Fight on Blight

The City of Antioch tries to keep our community as clean as we can by **removing blight** as quickly as possible. There are times when illegal dumping may occur in the City's creeks and storm channels, polluting the surrounding area with garbage and other debris. Our NPDES (National Pollution Discharge **Elimination System**) Division has the responsibility to ensure the creeks and storm channels are free from any obstructions to the natural flow, leading to a collaborative effort with the Community Development Departments Code Enforcement Division to abate the mess after the **illegal dumping** has been identified. This week, our NPDES crew cleaned up residual debris from the homeless on lames Donlon Boulevard and Somersville Road.

Don't Dig Into Trouble!

Call 811 before you dig to alert utilities to mark their underground lines. State law requires that ALL residential and commercial excavations are called into the USA North 811 call center 2-14 days before the excavation start date. USA stands for Underground Service Alert. This vital public safety service is FREE and required by law of everyone who will be digging, blasting, trenching, drilling, grading, or

excavating. The area to be **excavated is marked** in white paint by the person performing the dig. The other paint colors indicate the utilities in the excavation site vicinity, as listed in the chart below. These markings are not permanent and will fade over time. Public Works is **responsible** for marking the following City utilities:

- Water mains, valves, hydrants, backflow prevention devices, ARV's (air relief valves), blow-offs, sample stations, and service lines up to the water meter are marked in blue paint
- Sewer mains, maintenance holes, rodding-inlets, and laterals up to the PCO (proper clean-out) are marked in green paint.
- Storm drains, catch basins, maintenance holes, and culverts are also marked in green paint.


