Covid-19 Vaccine

Contra Costa has made incredible progress since the vaccine became available in mid-December, with nearly 300,000 people – about 25% of our population – having already received at least one dose, but East County still has some of the lowest vaccine rates.

There are several ways to find a vaccine appointment.

1. Register with the State of California at myturn.ca.gov to be notified when you are eligible to receive the Covid-19 vaccination.

2. Make an appointment with Contra Costa County Vaccine Appointments for residents 65-74. Click here to request an



Fulton Shipyard Boat Launch Temporarily Closing

The City of Antioch has announced that the boat launch located at 225 Fulton Shipyard Road will be closed beginning on

CLOSED

March 15, 2021, with an anticipated re-opening in the summer of 2023. The closure is a result of **construction** related to the City of Antioch's brackish water desalination plant.

Anyone seeking access to a boat launch will have access to the Antioch Marina boat launch at 1 Marina Plaza. The Antioch Marina Boat Launch will be accessible 24 hours a day, seven days a week at **no cost during the** construction period. Additionally, Antioch residency is not required for the use of the Antioch Marina boat launch.

Narcan Used to Save Lives

Did you know APD officers are dispatched immediately to overdose calls and frequently use Narcan to save lives? Many officers are also equipped with automated **external defibrillators** (AEDs) to help those suffering from cardiac arrest. Do you suffer from drug/alcohol addiction or know someone who does? There is help available from the Contra Costa Health Services Behavior Health Hotline. ATTENTION Antioch Residential Landlords!

A NEW **Emergency Rental Assistance program** will provide eligible landlords with immediate relief through the payment of 80% of rental arrears accumulated by their lower-income tenants from April 1, 2020, through March 31, 2021. Landlords, in turn, agree to accept this payment as payment in full of any unpaid rent for that period.

This new program will be **accepting applications** in mid-March, and funding will not last beyond August 1, 2021, as it will be recaptured and reallocated if not used. **Be first in line** to apply for this rent recovery funding and learn more here: <u>https://landlordtenant.dre.ca.gov/</u>.

How can you know which of your tenants qualify for YOU to be reimbursed? Eligible lower-income tenants are those who have a household income at or below **80% of the Area Median Income** (AMI), with a priority on helping households at or below 50% AMI as well as households unemployed for the preceding 90 days at the time of application, and those who experienced a decrease in income as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Bringing Three-Sort Diversion to Public Places

While city facilities have been closed to the public, we have been working hard with our Recreation and Public Works colleagues to bring **organics diversion programs** to city facilities and public spaces. Last Friday, we **installed seven** new litter modules like the ones pictured here in Waldie Plaza.

Come down to the **Rivertown** Business District to check them out. Pick up some yummy food from one of the restaurants downtown, stroll along the river and then compost or recycle your discards. Any food waste or foodsoiled paper products can go in the green Compost spot. Plastic cups, bottles, or cans can go in the blue Recycle section. Straws, plastic utensils, and condiment wrappers need to go in the black Landfill spot. When in doubt, put it in the **Landfill** side to keep the other two options clean of contamination.

Staff will be **emptying** the containers regularly but can only **divert clean bags** to our Compost and Recycling programs. Any contamination will result in the whole container having to be landfilled. And we don't want that, right?

Waterline Project Update (CIP)

The water main replacement has been completed on Delta Fair Blvd and the adjacent streets, marking the end of the segments to be installed by the Water Main Replacement Project. This project included replacement of water lines on Delta Fair Blvd, Kendree St, Putnam St, San Joaquin Ave, W Tregallas Rd, Stamm Dr, Bonita Ave, Patricia Ave, and Shaddick Dr.

The crew is scheduled to complete the permanent paving in the Delta Fair area before the end of March which will conclude all work for this project. Residents should expect minor traffic delays on Delta Fair Blvd and Kendree St. during this period. Be safe out there!

Antioch Marina - Berth's Available

The City of Antioch owns and operates a 310-berth Marina, situated in east Contra Costa County along the Antioch Riverfront, and offering one of the best locations on the California Delta. Did you know that the City of Antioch was a 2018 "**Best of the Delta**" finalist, and the Antioch Marina won first place in the "**Best Public Launch Ramp**" category? That was and still is such an honor!

The Marina has a **dual-lane launch** ramp, which includes a separate area for kayaks and other non-motorized sports. The approach to the Marina is a natural shoreline gradient from approximately 68 feet depth in the center of the **San Joaquin River** that provides critical habitat for fish (striped bass, salmon, steelhead, and sturgeon) and wildlife. As a key fishing area and sail boater's dream location, i.e., **wide-turning basin** and great views, we're also just minutes away from Sherman Lake and Winter Island.

Amenities include a harbormaster office, berths, **boat launch area**, restrooms, fish cleaning station, tidelands trail, small park area, ample parking, self-fuel station, and a **state-of-the-art**
