# City Manager

#### **Subcommittee Meetings**

I attended two City Council subcommittee meetings this week. The first was the Youth Task Force conducted by Mayor Wright and Council



Member Thorpe. Several panels discussed their perspectives on youth services needs in our community. The other was with the AUSD subcommittee which met at the District offices along with a similar subcommittee formed by the AUSD where communication, protocols and existing agreements between our agencies was discussed.

I attended a Neighborhood Watch meeting hosted by Pastor Jeff Becket

# Proposed Multi-Family Project Mayor Wright, Community



Development Director Ebbs and I met with Gabriel Chiu and his representatives to discuss his proposed multi-family project at the corner of Buchanan and Delta Fair Boulevards. This project would redevelop the old Food Max property bringing redevelopment to this part of town that is in desperate need. We also discussed improvements to Mr. Chiu's properties at Deer Valley Plaza and Antioch Square.

## Contra Costa Mayors Conference



Mayor Wright and I attended the Mayor's Conference at THE LOT City Center Bishop Ranch in San Ramon. The controversial CASA Compact, an outcome of an ABAG/MTC blue ribbon committee, was presented and discussed. Frustration with the fact that the CASA committee solicited very little local government input in the drafting of this document that attempts to address our region's housing affordability crisis was expressed by many of the mayor's as well as Senator Glazer who also spoke. Next steps involve discussion with our State legislatures.

You're in Luck... Antioch Friends of Animal Services is sponsoring the adoption fees for any animal adopted

from Antioch Animal Services during the entire month of March. The sponsored fee for dogs/cats includes spay/neuter, microchip, de-worming and age appropriate shots. Small animal adoption fees are also sponsored. You do NOT have to be an Antioch resident to adopt from our shelter; however, if you are, you must pay \$20 for a dog license at the time of adoption. If you have lost a pet, we encourage you to come to the shelter in person and ask staff for a "lost pet walk-through" to view stray animals held in the stray-hold area of the shelter and to check the "found pet" binders in the lobby in case a member of the public is holding a found pet. Intakes can be viewed online at www.petharbor.com The shelter is located at 300 "L" St in Antioch and is open Tues., Wed., Thu. & Sat., 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Fri., 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Mobile Farmers Market On Tuesday, the Mobile Farmer's Market returned for business.



#### **Planning Division Update**

The Planning Division is already experiencing a very busy 2019. In addition to City initiated projects and State mandated programs, the Division is processing several new residential development applications that total 635 new units and is processing applications for ten new or expanding commercial businesses. The Planning Division lists all new



and recently approved applications on the City's website in the Development Project Pipeline. The new applications include:

- AMCAL Multi-Family Development (Z-18-01): Proposed 394-unit apartment complex with affordable units for seniors and families located at 18th St. and Holub Lane. Pictured below.
- Delta Fair Village (GP-18-02): Proposed 210-unit apartment complex located on a portion of the Delta Fair Village shopping center at the northeast corner of Delta Fair Blvd. and Buchanan Rd.
- Park Ridge Design Review (AR-19-03): Design review of 58 single family homes in Phase 2 of the Park Ridge project.
- Target Rebrand (AR-19-01): Proposed exterior changes to the Target building located at 5769 Lone Tree Way.
- Acorn Business Park (PD-18-02): Proposed commercial development at the northwest corner of 18th St. and Drive-In Way containing approximately 122,000 square feet of self-storage, 113,000 square feet of a business park, and 22,000-33,000 square feet of commercial development.
- Contra Costa Farms, LLC (UP-18-23): Proposed cannabis cultivation, manufacturing, distribution, and retail at 3400 Wilbur Ave.
- Delta Dispensary (UP-18-13): Proposed cannabis retail business at 2101 West 10th St., Suite B.
- Eagle Extracts (UP-18-14): Proposed cannabis extraction business at 2101 West 10th St., Suite J

You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving a state prison sentence in county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.

#### **Collection Systems**

The Collection Systems (Sewers) Close Circuit Television (CCTV) crew is working in the downtown area inspecting and recording the



condition of the sewer mains in this area. Traffic will remain open during the inspections. Please slow for the cone zone!

#### **Park Parking Lot Closures**

Effective Monday, March 11, 2019, Public Works will begin locking recently installed gates at City Park, Gentrytown Park, Hillcrest Park, and Williamson Ranch Park. This action is expected to improve park safety and overall conditions by minimizing



the increasing occurrences of illegal dumping and other undesirable activities of overnight stays in these parking lots.

Per City Ordinance 10-2.08 the gates will be locked from dusk to 7:30 am with some variance to allow travel time between the parks; this schedule is currently in place at Antioch Community Park. These hours will be adjusted to accommodate organized sports leagues and special events scheduled through the Recreation Department. Signs will be posted before March 11th at the parking lot entrances/exits to alert visitors.

# Brackish Water Desalination Project

The City's Brackish Water Desalination Project website is now online **here**. This project is an essential component to the City's long-term strategy to improve its water supply reliability by diversifying its supply sources. This strategy will allow the City to reduce its dependence on higher-cost CCWD purchased water that is vulnerable to droughts, natural disasters, and regulatory restrictions.

Depending on drought conditions, the plant will account for over half of all water generated in the City during certain months of the year and about 30% on an annual basis. Visit the website to learn more about the project and keep up to date on our progress.




