City Manager

West Antioch Creek Improvement Project

Along with City Attorney Smith and Public Works Director/City Engineer Blank, I attended a meeting with representatives of the Contra Costa County Flood Control District to discuss the recently completed West Antioch Creek improvement project and final items related to these much-needed improvements for this part of town. There are still a few right-of-way issues to resolve. Staff is still pursuing additional funding to continue de-silting efforts on this channel that would result in greater flood protection.

employees with between 5 and 30-years of service for Antioch. I want to congratulate everyone who received an award and give a special thanks to Senior Public Works Inspector Kraig Hansen for his 30+ years of dedicated service. It's Hip to Chip!



Pets that are picked up by our Animal Control TTT Officers in the field have a greater chance of being returned to their owner if they have an upto-date microchip. When Animal Control Officers find a pet with an up-to-date microchip, they will try to return the pet home, before taking it to the shelter. Recently, we brought "Shrek" home to his owner after he was found wandering near San Jose Drive. All because of an up-to-date microchip, Shrek was able to go right back home. This scared little guy was all wiggles when he heard his owner's voice!

Do you need to have your pet microchipped, but don't know where to go? We can microchip pets at Antioch Animal Services for \$25.00, and no appointment is needed. Additionally, when licensing your dog, be sure to provide staff with your dog's microchip information so that we can store it in the shelter's database. This will allow us to return them home even quicker!

Hurray for Volleyball!

Did you know that the sport of volleyball is nearly 125 years old? The game originated in the United States, and today there are more than 46



million Americans who play volleyball. During the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics American men and women took gold and silver medals in the indoor volleyball competitions. Antioch residents can enjoy that same volleyball experience every Tuesday night from 7:00-9:30 p.m. Open gym drop-in volleyball is held at the Antioch Community Center gymnasium for ages 17 and older. Drop-in basketball takes place on Sundays from 12:30-2:30 p.m. Both activities require a fee of \$5.00 per person payable at the door.

CoCo Cafe

Throughout the week, 368 affordable healthy meals were served through the CoCo Café. This program helps prevent heart attacks, depression, asthma, and congestive heart failure. There are no memberships or income requirements to eat at the CoCo Café. Interested participants only need to register with the County food program at the Antioch Senior Center. Contra Costa County provides all meals and supplies for participating cafés





It's all about Balance

Last Friday, 12 participants began a new class at the Antioch Senior Center known as "A Matter of Balance." This program is an award-winning program designed to reduce the fear of falling and increase the activity levels of older adults who have concerns about falls. The workshop is facilitated by two trained coaches who promote exercise to increase strength and balance and allow participants to perform activities that were once restricted because of concerns of falling.

Community Development

What does Community Development do?

The Community Development Department consists of the Office of the Director/Community Development and Housing, Land Planning Services Division, Neighborhood Improvement Services, and Building Inspection Services



Division. Each of these Divisions is involved in the development and implementation of plans which will guide the community in the years ahead. By having staff work together in the various aspects of development, the development process is made more effective and efficient.

The Community Development Department is responsible for managing development in the best interests of the City by applying regulations and standards that make our City a better place in which to live, work, and play. It is through the efforts of these Divisions that the "quality of life" goals of the City take shape and are implemented. The quality of development, be it commercial, residential, or employment uses, determines in part the community's image and satisfaction of its residents.



Building Division

On February 25, 2019, the Building Division issued a permit for Vineyard Self Storage, a new mini-storage and RV and boat storage business located at the northwest corner of East 18th St. and Vineyard Drive.



Planning Division

On March 6, the Planning Commission recommended that the City Council approve a Use Permit for One Plant; a cannabis dispensary and delivery business located at 2701 West 10th St. The City Council hearing date is to be determined.

Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter Registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Counter with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving a state prison sentence in county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.



You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

Wastewater Inspections

Collection System Lateral Maintenance crew is inspecting sewer lateral service lines on **Hillcrest Avenue near Yellowstone Drive**. For everyone's safety slow for the cone zone. The Lateral Maintenance crew plays a critical role in assessing the service life, and physical condition of over 31,000 city maintained wastewater laterals. During field inspections, pipe defects are identified and classified according to a standard pipe condition code. If the crew identifies any debris, grease or roots in the pipe, they immediately conduct preventive maintenance with the sewer rodder machine.

Completing these inspections and proactively conducting maintenance plays a vital role in protecting our collection system, the environment and the health and safety of the members of our community. Lateral Maintenance Inspection crews are expected to complete 150 lateral wastewater inspections this past week. If you experience a sewer problem, remember to call us first to see if we can help you.

Park Parking Lot Closures

Effective Monday, March 11, 2019, Public Works will begin locking recently installed gates at City Park, Gentrytown Park, Hillcrest Park, and Williamson Ranch Park. This action is expected to improve park safety and overall



conditions by minimizing the increasing occurrences of illegal dumping and other undesirable activities of overnight stays in these parking lots.

Per City Ordinance 10-2.08 the gates will be locked from dusk to 7:30 am with some variance to allow travel time between the parks; this schedule is currently in place at Antioch Community Park. These hours will be adjusted to accommodate organized sports leagues and special events scheduled through the Recreation Department. Signs will be posted before March 11th at the parking lot entrances/exits to alert visitors.

Congress designates a National Heritage Area as a place where natural, cultural, and historic resources combine to form a cohesive, nationally significant landscape. This area stretches from San Pablo Bay to Stockton to Sacramento as shown on the following website http://delta.ca.gov/wp-content /uploads/2019/03/NPS-Delta-NHA-Boundaries.pdf. Besides this designation, the Delta Protection Commission is currently seeking historical and cultural materials that help tell the story of the Delta.
