City Manager

Downtown Antioch Clean-Up Day

We're serious about addressing illegal dumping in our City. In response to this ongoing problem, our Code Enforcement Manager Curt Michael is working with our garbage provider Republic Services to organize Antioch's first Clean-Up Day on Saturday, April 27th. Specific neighborhoods in downtown will be invited to participate in this no-cost event where just about everything except engines, car parts, tires, appliances, dirt, concrete, paint, oil, and other hazardous materials will be accepted. We plan on continuing this event throughout the rest of the City over the next year allowing all parts of Antioch to participate. *Please see the What's Happening in Antioch portion of this update for more information.*

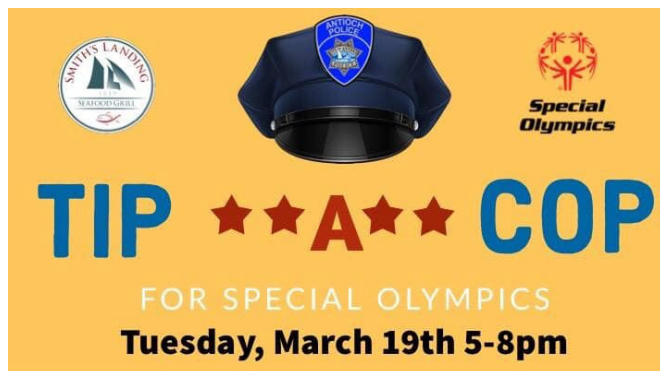

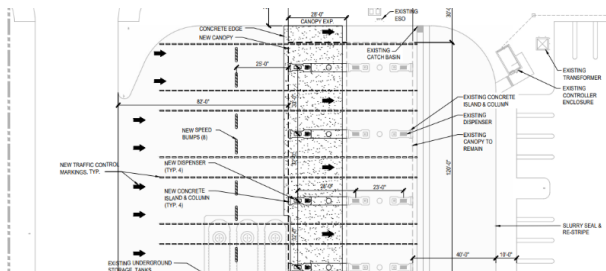
Community Development



Building

On March 20, 2019, the Building Division received

an application for a building permit to enlarge the gasoline pump canopy and install four new gas pumps at the Costco Wholesale located at 2201 Verne Roberts Circle. The new gas pumps will be located to the west of the existing gas service area and will significantly expand the capacity and reduce wait times. The gas station currently has 16 pumps, and the addition will add eight more pumps.



Planning

On March 20, 2019, the Planning Commission adopted a resolution recommending that the City Council adopt an ordinance requiring a Development Agreement as a condition of approval of a Use Permit for all future Cannabis Business applications. The Development Agreement is a common tool used to formalize financial and other arrangements between a developer or business operator and the municipality. The City Council will consider this ordinance along with a draft Development Agreement template at its April 9, 2019 meeting.

Code Enforcement

Many people may not be aware that it is illegal to park a commercial vehicle over one ton in size on a residential property or in a residential neighborhood. Antioch Municipal Code Section 4-5.1223 states, "No person shall park any motor vehicle used for commercial, industrial, or agricultural purposes and rated more than one-ton capacity, and no trailer used for the same, in any residential district." The only exceptions to this rule are for vehicles that are actively loading, unloading, or rendering services such as a moving van being unloaded or a UPS delivery truck and agricultural vehicles on active farms with 5 or more acres. This prohibition applies both to private residential property and to public streets in residential zones. In either case, the owner of the property or vehicle is subject to citations by the Code Enforcement Division or Antioch Police Department.

Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter Registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Counter with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving a state prison sentence in county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.



You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

City Council Meetings are held on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month in the Council Chambers, 200 H Street, beginning at 7:00 p.m. City Council Agendas, including Staff Reports, are posted on our City's Website 72 hours before each Council Meeting.

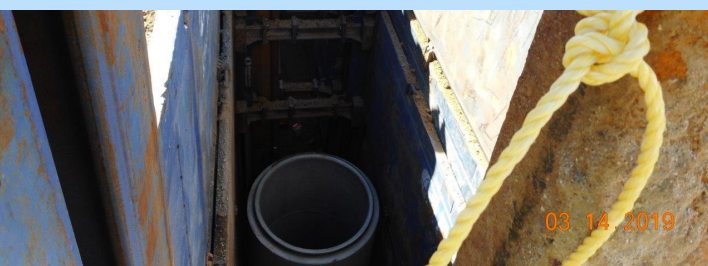
Wastewater Collection

Our wastewater collection cleaning crew is currently working on Brookside Drive cleaning approximately 4,000 feet of sewer pipe each day. These procedures reduce the inconveniences and environmental effects of a sanitary sewer spill to members of our community. This also reduces FOG (Fats, Oils, and Grease) related issues in the sewer system.

A friendly reminder about FOG:

- Scrape and wipe down pot, pans, and work areas before washing.
- Dispose of food waste directly into compost bin or trash.
- Do not pour waste oil directly into the drain, parking lot or street.
- Do not use emulsifiers or solvents other than dish washing detergents.

We have said this before, but it is vital that we keep getting the word out because we hear from residents who have paid contractors for services Public Works provides at no cost...If you experience a sewer problem, remember to call us first to see if we can help you.



New Developments

Crews are prepping and paving in the Vineyards at Promenade at the south end of Heidorn Ranch Road. Construction is underway as a 24-inch sanitary sewer main 27-feet deep on Heidorn Ranch Road is installed. The new sewer line is for the new development at the south end of Heidorn Ranch Road and the south end of Hillcrest Avenue. The three subdivisions are Heidorn Village, Aviano and The Vineyards at Promenade.



Park Parking Lot Closures

Public Works will begin locking recently installed gates at City Park, Gentrytown Park, Hillcrest Park, and Williamson Ranch Park. This action will minimize the increasing occurrences of illegal dumping and other undesirable activities of overnight stays in these parking lots.

International Commercial Shopping Centers

Delta Protection Commission

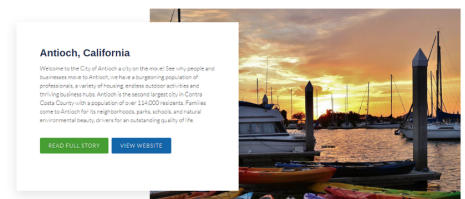
On March 12, 2019, President Trump signed into law a new bill establishing the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta as a National Heritage Area. Congressman Garamendi and Senator Feinstein proposed the new legislation. Congress designates a National Heritage Area as a place where natural, cultural, and historic resources combine to form a cohesive, nationally significant landscape. This area stretches from San Pablo Bay to Stockton to Sacramento as shown on the following website <http://delta.ca.gov/wp-content/uploads/2019/03/NPS-Delta-NHA-Boundaries.pdf>. Besides this designation, the Delta Protection Commission is currently seeking historical and cultural materials that help tell the story of the Delta. 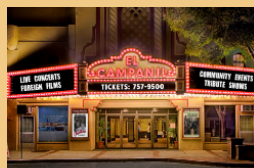

Downtown Antioch Cleanup Day

On Saturday, April 27, 2019, the City of Antioch will host a cleanup event for residents of the Downtown area between M Street and G Street and W. 2nd Street & W. 6th Street. Dumpsters will be placed in the downtown Marina overflow parking lot and residents in this geographic area will have the opportunity to dispose of residential trash and junk, at no cost. This cleanup event begins at 8:00am and continue until 12 noon or when the dumpsters have been filled whichever occurs first. Commercial dumping is not allowed.

Republic Services will not allow hazardous materials, paint, oil, tires, appliances, engines or other car parts, dirt or concrete to be placed in the dumpsters. Please drop off these types of items at Delta Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility located at 2550 Pittsburg-Antioch Highway, Antioch. In the upcoming days, Republic Services will be mailing out flyers to those residents that are eligible to participate in this cleanup event. The City anticipates holding more cleanup events like this in other locations throughout the City.

Attendees will monitor dumpsters, which will be restricted to residents who show a copy of this flyer. Dumping will begin at 8:00 a.m. and continue until 12 noon or the boxes are full, whichever is earliest. Commercial dumping is not allowed.

Republic Services will not allow the following items to be placed in the dumpsters:
Hazardous materials, paint, motor oil, rocks, dirt, concrete, car batteries, car parts, transmission blocks, engines, tires, refrigerators and other appliances

Furniture and large items must be broken up. It is recommended that you recycle all items that have potential for future use and help preserve the environment. Paint and hazardous materials can be disposed of at:
