Mayor and Members of the City Council: This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending March 30, 2018.

CITY MANAGER

Council Member Wilson and I attended the Redefining Mobility Summit at Bishop Ranch where participants from around the world met to hear from government and industry leaders about how innovative research and cutting-edge technology is redefining transportation. Hosted by Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA), GoMentum Station, Stantec, and Bishop Ranch the summit emphasized the rapidly changing world we live in as it relates to transportation and the exciting innovation and tools that will improve the way we move about in the very near future and years ahead.



I met with Congressman McNerney to discuss the positive things that are happening in Antioch and how he can help in our efforts to continue to provide innovative solutions to the challenges that face our community. The Brackish Water Desalination project, job creation, and homelessness were a few of the issues we discussed. With an office located at our Antioch Community Center, our 9th District congressman is looking for ways to help Antioch and our region at a federal level.



Along with the Department of Public Works management staff, I participated in their third Quality of Life forum at the Antioch Community Center this week to gather input from our concerned and interested residents. The meeting was full of questions and input about what's important to our residents and business owners as we strive to improve our delivery of services to our community. Tim started a Gofundme page garnering financial support for the purchase of a new K9 for the Police Department needed due to retirements, promotions, and reassignments. As of 3/29/18 a total of \$19, 330 has been raised which completely covers the purchase of a new four-legged Officer, necessary training, and equipment. As part of our continued proactive crime suppression/prevention efforts, officers completed several pre-planned probation searches on 3/22/18. Two arrests were made, and a stolen firearm recovered. We are committed to conducting proactive details such as this which enhance our ability to reduce violence and crime in our city.

On Saturday, March 24, 2018, the City of Antioch co-hosted a meeting for the Antioch Home Ownership Program (AHOP). The response was so strong that a second meeting was held in the afternoon. AHOP is a program sponsored by the City of Antioch and the Bay Area Affordable Homeownership Alliance (BAAHA) that provide financial literacy courses, homebuyer education, as well as up to \$45,000 in direct subsidies for buyers in the program. Cannabis Ordinance Process in Antioch 2nd Cannabis Community Workshop – We Want to Hear from you. Saturday, May 5, 2018, 9:00 a.m. Downtown at the Nick Rodriguez Community Center 213 F St, Antioch, CA 94509

The City Council continues the process of developing a Permanent Commercial Cannabis Ordinance. On November 1, 2017, the City Council extended the moratorium it had previously enacted in late 2016 to all commercial cannabis land uses. The ordinance was extended for nine months. During this final extension period for the moratorium, staff promptly began the process for enacting a permanent, regulatory ordinance for such uses. Staff also provides regular progress updates every other month at council meetings.

MuniServices is the City's consultant on cannabis and will be conducting a Special City Council Meeting/Workshop on Saturday, May 5th at 9:00 a.m. located downtown at the Nick Rodriguez Community Center. This is your opportunity to come and learn about Prop 64, ask questions, and how this use will be allowed in Antioch. There will be City maps, and an interactive chart to gather your information. The first reading of the permanent ordinance before the City Council is expected to occur at the Council's May 22, 2018, meeting with the process to be concluded by the Council's regularly scheduled meeting on June 26th.
