This is the City Manager's Report for the week of April 15, 2019

City Manager

Thank you Antioch Police Department Volunteers! Along with Mayor Wright, Mayor Pro Tem Motts, and Council Members Ogorchock and Wilson, I attended the Police Volunteer Brunch to honor these local heroes. The countless hours put in by these faithful men and women (including our amazing Explorer young women and men) has resulted in over \$500,000 in value to our Police Department and community. Police and Animal Services volunteers are just another one of the reasons Antioch is such an amazing place to live, work, play and serve.





The proposed 394-unit Amcal affordable apartment project was the subject Mayor Pro Tem Motts, Community Development Director Ebbs and I attended along with Supervisor Burgis and the newly

appointed Contra Costa Fire Protection District CCCFPD) Chief Lewis Broschard to discuss fire protection services for this project and the City. The County has been trying to establish a CFD (Community Facilities District) and increase fees due to the claim that Antioch uses more services than any other city served by CCCFPD and pays lower taxes. I have a meeting scheduled with County Administrator Twa and Chief Broschard in early May to discuss this important matter.

Congratulations to our very own Antioch resident Janice Lipnisky for winning the 2019 California Plus America Royal Court. The California

Center on Juvenile and Criminal Justice

This month, the Center on Juvenile and Criminal Justice, released a report examining crime rates in the 78 cities in California with populations over 100,000. The report highlights the fact that the City of Antioch had the most substantial reduction of violent crime (20.8%) from 2017 to 2018 of all 78 cities.

The violent crime reduction is a testament of all of the great work being done by the men and women of the Antioch Police Department.



Community Development

Acorn Business Park

On Wednesday, April 17, 2019, the Planning Commission will consider an application for the development of a new commercial and light industrial complex at the northwest corner of E. 18th Street and Drive-In Way. The proposed project includes the subdivision of the 19.75-acre site into twelve lots, including a site for a future hotel and commercial building along E. 18th Street. To the north of these uses, the project proposes a self-storage facility and nine light industrial lots, including one dedicated to storm-water detention. The Planning Commission will be asked to make a recommendation to the City Council who will consider the item at a future meeting.





AMCAL Affordable Housing

The Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration for the AMCAL Affordable Housing Project was made available to the public on Friday, April 5. The document is available at https://www.antiochca.gov/community-development-department/planning-division/environmental-documents/. The public is invited to review the document and provide any comments to the City of Antioch Planning Division.

The project consists of the development of a 14.85-acre site to construct 394 multi-family apartment units, including 178 units dedicated specifically for seniors. The complex will include a clubhouse and community buildings, parking areas, and other amenities. - Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.



You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

Engineering & Development Services

Work has begun on Segment 3 of the Caltrans Highway 4 landscaping project. The project will provide irrigation and landscaping improvements at the Hillcrest Avenue interchange and the Highway 4 ramp connectors to Highway 160 and is expected to take approximately five months to complete. This

project will utilize drought tolerant plants and recycled water irrigation when feasible. Caltrans will maintain the new plantings and irrigation for a 3-year Plant Establishment Period after which the City will assume maintenance responsibilities. These improvements will bring a welcome beautification to our community.






