Mayor and Members of the City Council:

This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending April 21, 2017

CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

Last week's update was received with mixed reviews. Most liked the new format and focus while others were concerned that the Police briefs were no longer provided in this report. To clarify, Police briefs can still be found on the Antioch Police Department's website <u>http://ci.antioch.ca.us/CityGov/Police/crime-maps/</u>. It has been, and continues to be, our goal to provide transparent information to interested community members. More about this subject can be found in the Police Department's <u>Crime Stats and Arrest Data</u> portion of this report.

At the Tuesday April 25th City Council Meeting, there will be a study session beginning at 5:00 pm to continue the presentation and discussion of the proposed 2017-19 General Fund budget accounts and the 5-Year Draft Capital Improvement Program 2017-2022. Both of these presentations are critically important as the City Council considers the financial health, safety, quality of life, and infrastructure needs of our community.

I would like to encourage all Antioch residents and business owners to download the City's new mobile reporting app. The Public Works Department has launched SeeClickFix, a citizen engagement app which replaces the GORequest reporting app. With enhanced features, SeeClickFix is used to report common non-emergency community issues such as potholes, burned out street lights, illegal dumping and abandoned shopping carts. This app has a mobile component that allows for on-the-go reporting, and an online component that allows residents to stay informed on community



issues. The SeeClickFix mobile app is available for download on Android Google Play Marketplace, and iPhone app store. In addition to the mobile apps, citizens can send reports to Antioch's website:

PUBLIC WORKS

<u>GIS</u>

We have had a successful soft launch of SeeClickFix, Public Works' new reporting platform. This soft launch allows citizens to report issues at their leisure, rather than exposure from publicizing the platform. Internal staff have been trained, briefed, and have already began responding to requests. Public Works will be making a presentation at the City Council meeting on April 25th.

Capital Improvements Division

A-S Pipelines, Inc. continues to repair and replacing sanitary sewer facilities on West 4th, West 5th and West 6th Streets as part of the Downtown Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation project. Exploratory excavations have been performed in preparation for a new water main on E Street between West 6th and West 8th Streets.



The downtown will continue to see improvements with the Community Development Block Grant Downtown Roadway Pavement Rehabilitation project that will follow right behind the sewer project. The public bid opening for this project is scheduled for May 2nd at 2:00 pm in the City Council Chambers located at 200 'H' Street.

R.J. Gordon is excavating an access pit at the intersection of D and Drake Streets in preparation for the lining of the water transmission pipeline under Highway 4. Roads in the vicinity of this work will be closed during the day.

The City will be hiring a contractor to construct a new traffic signal at Wild Horse Road/Folsom Drive and modify the signal West Tenth Street/L Street. The public bid opening for this project is scheduled for May 9th at 2:00 pm in the City Council Chambers located at 200 'H' Street.

Water Distribution



Crews were quick to respond to three different water main breaks within a two-hour window last week, repairing two of them and isolating the other for repair at a later time. The water was restored with minimal disruption to the City's citizens and customers. The different locations were 2nd Street, West 13th Street, and D Street.

Public Works Operations – Parks and Landscape



The City's Arbor Day tree planting and celebration was held at Mira Vista Park on Friday, April 14th. The Riverview Garden Club, Boy Scouts Troop 247 and the Public Works' Parks Division participated in the event. Arbor Day, was first observed in 1872 with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska. This year marks Antioch's 13th

Public Works did a trim and clean up of the trees at the north end of F Street. This opened up the area to a beautiful view of Beginning of Antioch monument and the San Joaquin River and will help deter undesirable activities at this location. On April 13th at about 2:15 pm Antioch Police Officer Pat Mayer was dispatched to Menona Drive for the report of two loose, aggressive dogs. He checked the area in his vehicle and did not locate the dogs. As he was leaving, Officer Mayer thought he heard the faint cry of someone yelling for

> Behind a vehicle on the side of a house, Officer Mayer found two pit-bull dogs mauling a 72 year old female on the ground. He yelled at the dogs, which immediately stopped attacking the woman and turned

their aggression towards him. The dogs lunged at Officer Mayer, who was forced to use his firearm in order to defend himself and the elderly female. Both dogs died instantly.

Officer Mayer immediately requested medical assistance for the 72 year old, who was bleeding badly from bite wounds all over her body. She stated she was going for a walk when the dogs came out of nowhere and started attacking her. Upon further investigation it was discovered the dogs had escaped from their yard by digging a hole under the fence. Their owners were notified and cooperative with Animal Services.

Without Officer Mayer's diligence in this case, we believe the outcome for the victim could have been much worse. Antioch Officers do remarkable things every day, and this is just one example, and one officer. We are very proud of Officer Mayer!
