




Mayor Pro Tem Motts, Council Member Ogorchock and I attended the second City/AUSD (Antioch Unified School District) Ad Hoc




On 4/27/19 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., the Antioch Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public its 17th opportunity in 9 years to prevent pill abuse and theft by helping them rid their homes of potentially dangerous, expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs.

Bring your pills for disposal to the Antioch Police Department at 300 L Street, Antioch, CA. (The DEA cannot accept liquids, needles or sharps; only pills or patches).



The service is free and anonymous - no questions asked. This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines - flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash - pose potential safety and health hazards.



- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.




You need to update your voter registration if you:

Landscape Maintenance The contracted cul-de-sac trim and clean up to over 400 courts is scheduled to begin in May. These landscape services are typically performed once a year in the Spring however beginning this year there will be a second trim and clean up in Autumn to provide improved quality of service to these neighborhoods. The semi-annual trim and clean-up includes: trimming existing plants; spraying weeds; removing dead plants; litter removal; removing low tree branches.

The Public Works Department is pleased to introduce Adopt-A-Court, a volunteer landscape maintenance program. This program was created in response to community members who have expressed an interest in installing and maintaining new plants in the landscaped parking medians and/or open space in their court. The purpose of this program is to provide volunteer support for those community members wishing to improve their neighborhood above what is provided for in the Lighting Landscape Maintenance District (LLMD) assessments. Any community member can make a difference in how their neighborhood looks.

Pictured is an example of a court adopted by volunteers who took the initiative to install new plants, trees and solar lighting. This is a shining example, however any effort will positively impact your neighborhood!

Following are some things you can do that will improve the landscaped areas in your court: pick up trash and litter; rake leaves; remove weeds; report vandalism; report broken irrigation; light gardening and landscaping.

Please contact Public Works so that we can discuss the program guidelines for maintenance and how our irrigation is scheduled. We can also recommend drought tolerant plants that thrive in our area and require minimal maintenance. On April 15th, Economic Development Director Kwame Reed, attended CCEP Board of Directors meeting in Walnut Creek. Director Reed also presented the new marketing campaign as well as the new website, www.AntiochlsOpportunity.com. Other topics of the meeting included presentations on the Opportunity Gap in Contra Costa County as it relates to child poverty and educational preparedness at the earliest level, and on Contra Costa Community College District Analysis of Economic Impact.



On April 18th Economic Development Department staff Kwame Reed & Lizeht Zepeda

participated in the Countywide Economic
Development gathering. This meeting held in
Pleasant Hill helps the group exchange information,
discuss upcoming events, learn about educational
outlets and best practices for those of us working in
economic development in Contra Costa County. This
also gives Antioch staff the opportunity to share
projects and milestone with the rest of the Cities.



On Friday April 19th Economic Development Department staff Lizeht Zepeda participated in second Priority Production Area (PPA) working session hosted by the Bay Area Urban Manufacturing Initiative. Last year, ABAG (now part of the MTC) completed a study of potential PPAs in partnership with a research team from UC Berkeley. The Priority Production Area (PPA) program seeks to designate industrial areas of importance to the regional and local economies, provide supportive resources and implementation actions for these areas, and ultimately, support the kinds of industrial businesses that sustain middle-wage job opportunities. PPAs would be locally-designated areas where production, distribution and repair services (PDR), would be a priority consideration in determining future land use. PPAs would be areas with broad community support for continued industrial activity that, in many cases face pressure to convert to higher-value uses. The PPA program would complement existing Priority Development Area (PDA) and Priority Conservation Area (PCA) programs. It would build on the regional and local partnerships and knowledge resources that ABAG/MTC has developed over the past three years in establishing the Greater Bay Area Regional Economic Development District.
