#### SeeClickFix

Late last year, the City's Public Works and Code Enforcement Department teamed up to improve our **SeeClickFix platform**. After some team training on how to get the most out of the platform and provide the best service, citizens now receive an **Open, Acknowledged, and Closed** response on all submitted requests. This keeps citizens informed throughout their requests being resolved and allows requests to be facilitated more efficiently. What's best about this is the app and web interface haven't changed at all. **Citizens can still submit requests** just as they always have but now benefit from these key improvements.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT**

#### **Newest Member of the Antioch Police Department**

Please join us in welcoming the newest member of the City of Antioch family, **Officer James Desiderio**! We would like to take a moment to talk about the journey James, and many officers before him, have taken to become an officer.

James' journey with Antioch began in May of 2020 when he applied as an Entry Level Police Officer. His application was accepted and on June 19, 2020, he came to the APD and completed his physical agility test. Because he had already completed his **written examination** (required by Peace Officer Standards and Training – POST) he was able to complete his oral board panel on the same day. Our physical agility tests the applicant's basic physical abilities and readiness for the academy. The oral board is a formal interview to allow the applicant to demonstrate their problem-solving abilities and general aptitude.

Only the best of the best from that interview process are invited to complete a 25-page personal history statement (PHS). That PHS leads to a polygraph (lie detector), extensive background and **medical and psychological evaluations** (with results being reviewed at every step of the way). The average success rate in this process for most police agencies is 2-3 applicants hired out of 100. Antioch is routinely 1 out of 100. All of this, just to make it INTO the Police Academy (6 months, full time). This is what James has completed. He still has his 10 weeks of **field training program** ahead of him, but we are confident with our department's excellent training officers, he will

do just fine.

## Mt. Diablo Resource Recovery Maintenance Facility Project

On Wednesday, April 7, 2021, the Planning Commission approved a **new project** at 2600 Wilbur Avenue. The 10.28 -acre site contains an empty warehouse and is otherwise currently vacant. The approved project is the Mt. Diablo Resource Recovery Maintenance Facility. This new project will serve as a **truck** repair and maintenance facility for Mt. Diablo Resource Recovery, a local solid waste service company that provides garbage collection services to many local cities and unincorporated areas.

The existing warehouse building will be repurposed to serve as a mechanical garage, and the entire site will be improved to create parking areas, stormwater drainage facilities, and an eventual new building. In addition, this portion of Wilbur Avenue will be improved by the project proponent to include proper curbs, gutter, and sidewalk, which will give a finished appearance to the street.

## **Operational Improvements**

Mountain Cascade is constructing the **concrete pad** for the new emergency backup generator at the **Hillcrest Booster Pump** Station.
Operational improvements are being performed at both the Hillcrest and James Donlon Booster Pump Stations.

The work includes **structural modifications** and the installation of new emergency backup generators at both facilities.



## **PUBLIC WORKS**

#### **Concrete Curb Ramp Improvements**

JJR Construction, Inc. is installing concrete curb ramps as part of the **2021 Curb Ramp Installation project**. These pedestrian access improvements are being performed on Serpentine Drive, Barmouth Drive, Boulder Drive, and Marble Drive. **Over 30 ramps** will be constructed during this project. This work is being conducted in preparation for the placement of a pavement surface treatment scheduled for next year.

#### **Collections Divisions Closed Circuit Television Crew**

Collection Systems Inspection crew completes approximately 25% of sewer mainline video inspections of our sewer system each year. The **CCTV crew** utilizes two (2) **highly trained staff** members and a small tractor-mounted camera to identify, locate, and assess the City's sewer and **storm infrastructure** condition. CCTV condition assessment provides the critical information needed to evaluate the service life, physical condition, and functionality of our 310 miles of wastewater and 282 miles of stormwater collection systems.

During the field inspection, **pipe defects** are classified using a standard coding system, and pipe condition is assessed using a **systematic method** 

to produce consistent, useful information. The data collected is reviewed by the Collection Systems management team. The data helps in the scheduling of **preventative** and routine maintenance, making decisions about pipe rehabilitation, pipe replacement, and provides an estimate of our pipe's remaining useful life and its long-term **performance** capabilities.



Completing these inspections and proactively conducting maintenance plays a vital role in **protecting** our collection systems, the environment, and the health and safety of the members of our community.

## Workforce Development Board of Contra Costa County's Business & Economic Development Committee Meeting


