### Mayor and Members of the City Council:

This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending May 18, 2018.

#### **CITY MANAGER**

transportation Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) and members of his executive team met with me to discuss projects and initiatives they are working on that affect Antioch and the region. Some of the items we discussed included Antioch's ability to adopt our Highway 4 interchanges that will be landscaped over the next 12 months, the June 8th Envision East County event to be held at the Byron Airport where projects like SR 239 and the Jobs Corridor between Tracy and Buchanan Airport will be discussed, the 2017 Countywide Comprehensive Transportation Plan, Innovate 680, and the 2018 Countywide Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. Led by Mr. Iwasaki, CCTA has been instrumental in getting over 1.5 billion dollars of Highway 4 widening and BART improvements constructed through Antioch and in our region.

Water Treatment Superintendent Tim Coley and I attended a Municipal/Wholesale Customer Outreach Meeting at Contra Costa Water District (CCWD) where the proposed CCWD rate structure was presented. Scheduled to be implemented in the first quarter of 2019, changes to rate structure would increase the cost of untreated water by an estimated 5% per year. Combined with a projected 6% rate increase, this would mean Antioch would be paying 11% more for our untreated water beginning in 2019. Staff will be working with CCWD to understand these proposed changes better and provide comments as necessary to make sure our Antioch customers are receiving the best value available.

Along with Mayor Wright and Council Member Ogorchock, I attended the Antioch Police Department Awards Ceremony held at Lone Tree Golf and Event Center. Always a very

impressive and at times emotional event, officers and civilian staff are recognized for extraordinary acts of valor, going above and beyond in the line of duty, and for years of dedicated service to our community for those who have retired last year. I want to thank Chief Brooks, who just finished his first year as our Chief, for his exceptional leadership to the outstanding men and women who serve and protect our families and community.

The Annual Senior Picnic was held at the Antioch Senior Center. Along with Council Member Ogorchock, Council Member Tiscareno, Mayor Wright and many folks from various City of Antioch departments, I was honored to help serve lunch to some



of the most beautiful and precious members of our community. Besides a wonderful meal, there was a hula dancing exhibition by some or our seniors, music and more dancing...made me tired just watching our seniors in action! I'd also like to thank Parks and Recreation Director Nancy Kaiser and her staff, for all their hard work to make this special and memorable event.

Patrol Officers provide traffic enforcement during the regular course of their shift, while our Motor Unit is dedicated to traffic specific issues throughout The City. In addition to these, our VIPS deploy the radar trailers and decoy patrol cars as traffic calming measures. Last week, we paired up for a traffic enforcement detail with Pittsburg, Oakley, and Brentwood Police Departments. Collectively, these officers issued 88 citations in Antioch alone before moving on to Brentwood and Oakley. The increased presence

was a good reminder for motorists to pay attention to their surroundings and drive a bit slower and safer, the goal being to "arrive alive."

#### **Animal Services**

We have lift off! On Friday, April 11, Antioch Animal Services employees and volunteers made a trip to Buchanan Field in Concord to put 14 of our shelter dogs on a flight to Idaho. The flight was sponsored by Dog is My CoPilot, Inc., which was founded in 2012 to fly animals from areas of pet overpopulation, to areas of the United States where the dogs are in higher demand. There is no charge to the animal welfare organizations for whom DIMC flies...the planes fly on public donations alone. Once they



arrived in Idaho, the dogs were transferred to the Idaho Humane Society and the Animal Shelter of Wood River Valley to find their furever homes. Everyone at Antioch Animal Services is excited about this innovative approach to finding our shelter dogs new homes, and we're looking forward to the next flight in July!

On Saturday, Antioch Recreation hosted the first citywide "Recreation & Health Expo." Over 250 guests enjoyed swimming in the afternoon, and entertainment and resources were available for all ages throughout the day. The one-day discount registration resulted in more than \$16,000 in revenue collected for programs and classes.

Last week, Recreation staff collaborated with the County Elections Office to provide training and testing on the new voting equipment. The equipment was on display with County staff at the Antioch and Nick Rodriguez Community Centers, and more than 65 individuals participated. The Antioch Community Center will be a location for early voting beginning May 29, 2018.

On Saturday, Antioch Community Park was the host facility for Sacramento based All Star Tournaments "Crazy Socks" youth fast pitch tournament for girls ten years and under and 12 years and under. Ten teams from as far away as Hollister and San Jose, along with some local teams from Antioch, Brentwood and Benicia gave their best shot of being crowned



"Champions." Antioch will host a total of eight such events in 2018.

#### **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

On May 16, the Planning Commission unanimously approved the Palabra de Dios Community Center at 501 Auto Center Drive. The Community Center is located at the miniature golf course and amusement center formerly operated by KangaZoom. The Community Center will offer community focused workshops and classes, and general assembly uses in the main building that once housed arcade games. The Community



Center will also operate the miniature golf course and batting cages.

On May 24 the Zoning Administrator is scheduled to consider a use permit for Phases 1 through 3 of the Vineyards at Sand Creek Project. The first phases of construction of the Vineyards at Sand Creek Project will be a combination of Phase 1 (96 units), Phase 2 (121 units) and Phase 3 (120 units), which is generally the northern half of the Vineyards at Sand Creek Project (337 total units). Phase 1 will be Market-Rate Single Family homes for families, and Phases 2 & 3 will be Active Adult Single-Family homes for seniors. The project site is bounded by a residential subdivision to the north, the future extension of Sand Creek to the south, Heidorn Ranch Road and City of Brentwood City limits to the east, and future Hillcrest Avenue extension and vacant residential land to the west. The Zoning Administrator meeting will be held in the 2nd-floor conference room of City Hall at 3:00 p.m.

#### **PUBLIC WORKS**

#### **Collections System/NPDES**

Our NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) crews have started performing state required and regulated routine maintenance in our creeks and channels.



When the creek area is not adequately maintained, the resulting obstructions can lead to increased flooding, changes in the course of the creek, and increased



erosion. Proper creek care includes removing blockages (whether natural or man-made) that could cause flooding, keeping the banks vegetated to prevent erosion, preventing pollutants from entering waterways, and removing trash to help maintain a healthy watershed. It is imperative that the work is conducted in such a manner that it will not adversely affect the natural habitat of vegetation and wildlife that share the creeks with us, and in such a way that we preserve the beauty of our creeks.

Our creek maintenance season begins April 15th through October 31st every year. In that time our NPDES crew along with our partners: Pacific Coast Landscaping, Code Enforcement and MJH Construction help accomplish our goals for the year.
