The settlement allows the City to avoid potentially lengthy and costly litigation.

On May 16th, 2019, the Planning Commission considered a wireless telecommunications ordinance that would direct how the City of Antioch regulates future cellular telephone equipment. Federal and State laws already preempt much local control, and the City's proposed ordinance would organize and clearly define the City's role moving forward. In the future, much of the cellular equipment will be mounted on existing utility poles, as in the photo (right). The City's new ordinance will press installers to install more discrete equipment in these cases. The City Council will consider this ordinance at its June 11th, 2019 meeting.

Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter Registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Counter with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving a state prison sentence in county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.



You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

Public Works employees received the Mayor's proclamation at the May 14th City Council meeting. Public Works services provided to the community are an integral part of our citizens' everyday lives providing health, safety, and comfort. These services include water production and distribution, sewers, storm drains and channels, streets, parks, marina, fleet and Geographic Information Services (GIS), medians, open space, and public buildings. The quality and effectiveness of the operation and maintenance of these facilities, as well as their planning, design, and construction are vitally dependent upon the efforts and skill of our qualified and dedicated personnel. Antioch's Public Works Department is committed to serving our community to the utmost of our ability and appreciates every opportunity to partner with those who share our commitment towards improving our community.

Collections System/NPDES

Our National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) crews have started performing state required and regulated routine maintenance in our creeks and channels. Our creek maintenance season begins April 15th through October 31st every year. In that time our NPDES crew along with our partners: Work Alternative Crews, Alfresco Landscaping, Code Enforcement, and MJH Construction help accomplish our goals for the year. We are currently working in West Antioch Creek and will continue our work throughout the city until all creeks are completed.
