AAS COVID-19 Operations Update

Although Antioch Animal Services is closed to the public during the shelter in place order, we are still adopting pets and taking in stray animals in need of care. If you believe your lost pet is in the shelter or want to adopt a pet, call us at 925-779-6989 to make an appointment to visit the shelter. Appointments are available daily. Social distancing and facemasks are required when visiting the shelter. Please plan accordingly.

Antioch Friends of Animal Services is sponsoring adoption fees through May 31, while we are all sheltering in place. The sponsored adoption fees include age-appropriate vaccinations, spay/neuter surgery, and a microchip. Antioch residents who adopt a dog will need to purchase a \$20.00 dog license at the time of adoption.

Antioch Water Park Closure

The **Antioch Water Park** remains closed due to COVID-19 restrictions. Opening for a summer season will take place when it is safe to do so. While the facility was closed, the contractor was able to complete the deck coating project. This new deck coating replaces the original surface that was laid nearly 25 years ago when the park was constructed. It is designed to improve traction for guests moving around the park with wet feet or shoes while staying cool from direct sunlight. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Update on Applications and Permits

The Community Development Department is offering limited in-person services on the second floor of City Hall. Applications can be submitted from 8:00 a.m. to - 5:00 p.m., Mon.- Fri., on the second floor. A storage rack has been installed where the public can drop-off completed applications in a contact-free setting. The elevator is available to access the second floor for this service. Applications for building permits, grading permits, planning permits, and engineering permits can all be applied for through this system.

Once the applications are received, they are routed for review. Once approved, the Community Development staff will contact the applicant to inform them that the application is ready for pickup and will set up an appointment. These appointments are available Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. The applicants will be admitted to the public counter area where a representative will meet them with their permit and approved plans. The applicant will then be directed downstairs to the Finance Department for payment. Checks are preferred and can be accepted directly at the Community Development Department.

The Community Development Department is committed to providing essential services in a safe environment. To that end, all applicants are required to wear masks while at City Hall and to observe established social distancing protocols. Planning Division

The Planning Commission held its ordinary meeting on Wednesday, May 20, where it considered two projects. The first was a Preliminary Development Plan for the development of the 11.72-acre site near the terminus of Wild Horse Road.

The proposal was for the development of 132 townhomes in 22 buildings. The Planning Commission considered the project and offered a positive direction on a revised site plan. The applicant can now prepare a formal development application for future submittal. In addition, the Planning Commission found the draft Capital Improvement Program to be consistent with the General Plan as required by State law.

The next scheduled meeting of the Planning Commission is Wednesday, June 3, 2020.





Economic Baseline and Strategic Plan Summit

The Economic Development Department held its second Economic Development Baseline and Strategic Plan Summit Meeting on April 29th, 2020, via video conference. The City's consultant, The Natelson Dale Group, Inc. (TNDG), led the strategic planning process to stakeholders that attended. The City of Antioch's Economic Development Strategic Plan (EDSP) will provide a blueprint for attracting targeted new development and business investment, creating jobs, and ensuring the City's long-term fiscal health. The Plan will identify key industries that should be the focus of Antioch's business retention/ expansion/attraction efforts and will also consider closely-related issues such as infrastructure, land use, education, and workforce development.
