CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

The State of the City address, sponsored by the Antioch Chamber of Commerce and Republic Services, featured presentations from Mayor Wright, Chief Brooks and me. This positive event provided those in attendance with a snapshot of what is happening and the collective vision and opportunities for our City moving forward. There will be another opportunity to hear the presentation at a free event being held on Wednesday, June 14th at 7:00 p.m. at the Antioch Community Center. All are invited to attend.

There is a Memorial Day Celebration on May 29th at 10:00 a.m. at Oak View Memorial Park Cemetery, 2500 East 18th Street in Antioch, honoring our Veterans past and present.

City offices will be closed in observance of the Memorial Day holiday on May 29th.



The City Council held their last Budget Study Session on Tuesday, May 23rd, where they provided staff with direction on the proposed 2017-18 and 2018-19 budgets. The City Council's decision to invest in Antioch's future through strategic staffing and programs will provide additional opportunities for a safer more attractive city and enhanced responsiveness to resident and customer needs. Staff is scheduled to bring the final budget document to Council at the June 27th Council Meeting for consideration and adoption. I would like to thank City staff, and especially Finance Director Dawn Merchant, for all their hard work on preparing and presenting this important document.


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FINANCE

Throughout the week, Water Park staff continued preparing for opening day. The 2nd All Staff Training took place on Sunday, May 21st, with approximately 60 staff members attending.

PUBLIC WORKS



The new playground structure at Prosserville Park will soon be ready for family fun and EVERYONE is invited to the ribbon-cutting and dedication on Saturday, June 10th. Prosserville Park is one of the City's oldest parks and the new playground is an exciting enhancement for our community to enjoy.

This project was made possible by the collaborative efforts of our City Council, Parks & Recreation Commission, FIRST 5 of Contra Costa, Miracle Play Systems, Inc. with Grant and discounts of over \$50,000, our dedicated Public

Works field staff and the wonderful people in our community that provided their support and feedback for this project. With analysis and research from FIRST 5 of Contra Costa, and a grant written by Parks & Recreation Director Nancy Kaiser, the City received a \$40,000 grant.

The playground area is approximately 6,000 square feet in size; one of the largest playground footprints in the neighborhood park system. The new playground features poured in place surfacing, two slides, climbing rocks, new LED lighting and many more exciting elements for our children to enjoy.

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Capital Improvements Division. A-S Pipelines, Inc. continues to perform localized repairs to the existing sewer mains and service laterals in the downtown area and video inspections of additional pipelines are being performed. Pipelines found to be damaged or deteriorated will be repaired prior to rehabilitating the facilities using the cured-in-place pipe lining method.

R.J. Gordon is performing minor repairs on the pipeline under Highway 4 at D Street. Following the repairs, the slip line water pipeline will be retested. Once this testing has been satisfactorily performed, the pipeline will be connected to the existing facilities.
