

On Tuesday, Los Medanos Elementary School enjoyed their annual Water Park Buy-Out. More than 400 students were able to use the slides and picnicked on the hillside.

On Wednesday, Staff conducted the last lifeguard pre-course for the year. The final Lifeguard class begins June 11<sup>th</sup> and when completed, there will be another 15 new certified lifeguards.

Last week, 12-17 year old teens participated in the Babysitting Safety & Certification program. Certified babysitters, unlike regular babysitters, are individuals who have received specialized training in babysitting duties and responsibilities. Antioch's certified babysitters attend a 4.5 hour training program, which prepares young adults to provide safe and high quality care in our community.



This week, staff met and interviewed potential program contractors for the Fall 2017 season of classes and activities. There are many exciting new additions to the activity line-up including an all new Winter Day Camp program, Holiday Dance Classes, Kayaking Discoveries in the Delta, and a series of all new S.T.E.M. Afterschool Programs.

On Friday, staff participated in the Antioch Rivertown Senior Complex Informational Fair. Agencies from all over Contra Costa County contributed and shared information to interested senior citizens. City of Antioch staff contributed by sharing the Antioch Senior Center Newsletter, the Antioch Recreation Activity Guide and other city information.

Over the last week, 273 affordable, healthy meals were served through the CoCo Café. The Center was closed on Memorial Day. This program helps prevent heart attacks, depression, asthma and congestive heart failure. No membership or income requirements are required to eat at the CoCo Café. All supplies are provided by the County for participating cafés.

The City of Antioch is now hiring three summer interns through our Used Oil Recycling Grant. Do you want to make a difference in your community? **Fulton Shipyard Boat Ramp.** The refurbishments are complete and in place to assist boaters to and from their boats. The dock is available for use on June 1<sup>st</sup>, just in time for summer fun on the Delta. Remember to stay safe on the river and always wear a life jacket. We want to thank all of our customers for being patient and supportive.

**Capital Improvements Division.** A-S Pipelines, Inc. has completed the initial phase of localized repairs to the existing sewer mains and service laterals in the downtown area. The video inspections of additional pipelines have been completed and are being reviewed by the contractor. Pipelines found to be damaged or deteriorated will be repaired prior to rehabilitating the facilities using the cured-in-place pipe lining method.

R.J. Gordon has satisfactorily completed all testing of the newly installed pipeline under Highway 4 at D Street and the new segment is being connected to our existing facilities. The access pits on Drake Street and near West Tregallas Road are expected to be backfilled in the next couple of weeks.
