## City Manager

#### Homeless Encampment Task Force

Hosted by Mayor Pro Tem Motts and Council Member Thorpe, I attended the day-long Homeless Encampment Task Force meeting. Several panels, including one, made up of Chief Brooks, Public Works Director Blank, Community Development Director Ebbs and Animal Services Manager Harding, presented the ways they interact with and attempt to assist the homeless, or as Council Member Thorpe began referring to them as



unhoused residents in an effort to provide information to the City Council Members who will take this testimony back to the full Council for their consideration and next steps. The next meeting of the subcommittee will be June 10th at 6:00 p.m. at the Antioch Community Center.



#### **Road and Median Improvements**

So much is being done to improve the appearance around Antioch this week. Lone Tree Way is being resurfaced to provide a smoother, better quality product. Medians on Somersville Road and Lone Tree Way are being re-landscaped, and Caltrans is continuing to work on landscaping the interchanges and medians at Highway 4 and Somersville Road/ Auto Center Drive. One of City Council's priorities is clean up and beautify our City. Expect to see more of this type of activity around Antioch during this summer. 


## Police- Animal Services

#### **Environmental Services**

Do you have more garbage or recycling than will fit in your carts? Maybe it's time to schedule an extra pickup. As part of your single family garbage service, residents can schedule two on-call garbage cleanups of up to 14 bags, two large items and three recycling on call appointments for cardboard or yard waste. #### **Planning- New Ordinance**

On June 11, 2019, the City Council will consider a new wireless telecommunications ordinance that would direct how the City of Antioch regulates future cellular telephone equipment. Federal and State laws already preempt much local control, and the City's proposed ordinance

would organize and clearly define the City's role moving forward. In the future, much of the cellular equipment will be mounted on existing utility poles, as in the photo below. The City's new ordinance will press installers to install more discrete equipment in these cases.



#### **Planning - Approved Project**

On May 28, 2019, the City Council approved a new commercial and light industrial project at the intersection of E. 18th Street and Drive-In Way. The project site contains 19.75 acres and will be developed to include new commercial buildings with a potential hotel, a self-storage facility, and a light industrial subdivision to be developed in the future. This project, along with the recently-approved housing development across the street represents a significant improvement to this part of E. 18th Street. The area will be dramatically different. This project, in particular, will provide new opportunities for jobs growth, small businesses, and tax generation.




## City Clerk

#### Get informed, get involved and VOTE.

Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter Registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Counter with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving a state prison sentence in county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.



You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

# **Road improvements: Golf Course Road & Lone Tree Way Course Road and Lone Tree Way began this past week.** Golf Course Road is complete, and Lone Tree Way will continue through next week. To minimize impacts to the public, crews will work through the night on Lone Tree Way (8:00 p.m. – 6:00 a.m.). The work may have to move to

daytime hours if the contractor is not able to meet the City standards in the dark hours. Day or night, the roads will remain open with some lane closures; only minor traffic delays are expected during construction. We expect to stripe the roadway two weeks after the entire micro surface is applied projected to be at the end of June (weather permitting). We will keep you posted on the project here and on the **Public Works Facebook page**.


#### Antioch Marina Kicks Off Boating Season
