Planning

On Wednesday, May 19, the Planning Commission considered the **Radix Growth** project. The applicant is proposing to operate a cannabis facility at 3625 East 18th Street in an existing +/- 95,420 square foot commercial building previously a K-Mart store. The cannabis facility will consist of **indoor cultivation**, distribution, non-volatile **manufacturing**, and a retail dispensary with delivery. The proposed cultivation operation will take place entirely indoors and consist of 87 flower rooms that will occupy **47,715** square feet of floor space. However, the cultivation will be a two-tier grow, and therefore the total cannabis cultivation area will be 95,340 square feet. The **manufacturing operation** will be conducted under a type 6 manufacturing license which allows for non-volatile manufacturing. Non-volatile manufacturing uses a mechanical extraction method or **non-volatile** solvents, such as carbon dioxide, ethanol, water, or cooking oils, to extract cannabis oils. The distribution operation will operate under a type 11 distribution license. A **licensed distributor** is responsible for:

- Transporting cannabis goods.
- Arranging for the testing of cannabis products.
- Conducting quality assurance reviews of cannabis goods ensures that they comply with all packaging and labeling requirements.
- Transporting cannabis goods between licensees.

The Planning Commission voted to **recommend** the City Council approve the project with the condition that the project return to the Planning Commission for **additional design review** approval. The City Council is currently scheduled to hear the project at the June 22 meeting.

Rehabilitation of **Pipeline Segments**

As part of the City's continuous efforts to maintain an efficient **sewer collection system**, Southwest Pipeline & Trenchless Corp. has commenced the trenchless rehabilitation of 85 pipeline segments throughout the City. The contractor will be installing **cured-in-place** pipe liners within existing sanitary sewer mains.

The project will reduce groundwater infiltration, prevent root intrusions and decrease the required maintenance within the system.



PUBLIC WORKS

Capital Projects Underway

Teichert Construction has begun the 2021 Asphalt Concrete Pavement Plug and Leveling Course project. This work will remove and replace deteriorating sections of roadway and install asphalt concrete leveling courses over various streets and locations within the City. These streets are also being prepared for a Cape Seal surface treatment that will be installed in 2022.

 Roadway rehabilitation of Hillcrest Avenue, Gentrytown Drive, and Delta Fair Blvd. is currently under construction. As part of this project, work at the intersection of Davison Drive, Hillcrest Avenue, and Deer Valley Road will be performed overnight on June 20th and June 21st.

The contractor will also be performing pavement repairs on Hillcrest Avenue during the day from **June 22nd** through June 24th. This work will be followed by a full street width Cape Seal of Hillcrest Avenue, Gentrytown Drive, and Delta Fair Blvd. to be **installed in July**.

We ask for your patience during construction and that you obey all traffic control and warning signs that are placed for the **safety of workers** and the **public**.


Economic Development staff attended a **Build Back Better Ports & Marine** Technologies
