That's because the entire playground rubberized surface was re-topped with brand new material. This project was facilitated to upgrade the existing playground to improve the safety features, as well as to make it more aesthetically pleasing and to realize an increased useful life of the playground and its equipment.

Video inspection of additional pipelines in the downtown area have been completed and reviewed by City staff and the contractor. Damaged and deteriorated locations within the existing pipelines and manholes have been identified and A-S Pipelines, Inc. is expected to commence the repairs next week. Traffic patterns and street parking will be affected during this work. For the safety of our residents and the workers, please adhere to all construction signage.

The rehabilitation of the transmission pipeline under Highway 4 at D Street is nearing completion. The new segment has been connected to the existing system and the access pits have been backfilled and paved. R.J. Gordon is performing the final clean up of the work areas this week.

Marina. Kayak launches are now open. Recently the Antioch Municipal Marina was awarded a grant by the San Francisco Bay Water Trail to enhance non-motorized boat facilities along the City's waterfront. The \$32,000 grant application was written by Sandra Kelly, City Parks Commissioner and Marina Volunteer, along with James Pflueger, Marina Lead/Property Manager.

The grant allows staff working with volunteers to design the installation to meet specific needs of our community. Among the amenities is a 24-hour

accessible kayak launch located adjacent to the boat launch docks already in use. Located within the Marina grounds are storage racks for kayaks, stand-up paddle boards and canoes. A second dual-lane launch dock will be available for public use beginning July 1st. Launch facilities are free for cartop boats and the Marina serves visiting kayak clubs and groups, as well as the general public.

Special introductory day and monthly Marina rates allow access to the many other amenities offered at our facility including access to private restrooms, picnic grounds and exclusive gate access. These are just a part of the Marina's mission to be "The Best Deal on the Delta." ANNUAL WATER QUALITY REPORT

Your Drinking Water : Our Annual Water Quality Report for 2016 is now available. Every year we provide a report full of water quality data so you can see how Antioch's water quality compares to state and federal drinking water standards. Utilities – Collection Systems Division. The Collection Systems Lateral Maintenance Crew is currently working north of E. 18th Street between Cavallo Road and A Street.

The Lateral Maintenance Crew plays a critical role in assessing the service life and physical condition of over 31,000 City maintained wastewater laterals. During field inspections, pipe defects are identified and classified according to a standard pipe condition coding.

This systematic method provides accurate and consistent data which is used to prioritize future maintenance activities and to make decisions about pipe rehabilitation, pipe replacement, estimate the pipe's remaining useful life



and its long-term performance capabilities. If the crew identifies debris, grease or roots in the pipe they immediately conduct preventive maintenance with the sewer rodder machine.

Completing these inspections and conducting maintenance in a proactive manner plays a vital role in protecting our collection system, the environment and the health and safety of the members of our community. Lateral Maintenance Crews completed 155 wastewater lateral inspections this past week. If you experience a sewer problem remember to call us first to see if we can help you.

- An unlocked car is an invitation to a car thief and burglar. Lock up when you leave your car and take your keys with you, even if you are making a quick stop.
- Close all windows. Professional thieves have tools that unlock cars and break windows quickly and with no sound.
- When you park, remove cell phones and valuable possessions from plain sight. Do not leave packages, cameras, computers, etc., lying on the seat.
- Do not leave an auto in an unattended public parking lot for an extended period of time. A vehicle is five times more likely to be stolen from an unattended lot than from the street or attended lot.
- At night, park in well-lit areas with lots of people around.
- Keep your garage door opener in your purse, briefcase or backpack.

Earlier in the year retired officer Ed Almeida donated his Class A jacket and a tan uniform shirt for the APD History Project. Officer Almeida started as a Reserve or
