Summer Heat Safety for Pets

As we welcome Summer and start to see our daytime temperatures rise above 90 degrees, Antioch Animal Services would like to



remind everyone to be especially mindful of the dangers extreme heat can pose for our pets. When outdoors, pets must always have access to shade, and plenty of cold water to drink. On sunny summer days, be sure to check the temperature of asphalt, concrete patios and sidewalks, and wooden decks, before allowing your dog to walk on them. These surfaces heat up quickly in the sun, and can severely burn your dog's feet. As a rule of thumb, if the ground is too hot for the palm of your hand, it's too hot for your dog's paws! Avoid hot surfaces by planning to walk your dog early in the morning or just before sunset.

Also, remember that it is never safe to leave your pet unattended inside a car. At just 70 degrees outside, the temperature inside a vehicle can rise an additional 40 degrees within 30 minutes. At 90 degrees outside, the temperature inside your car can exceed 150 degrees in just a few minutes! At these extreme temperatures, pets left inside a vehicle can suffer heat stroke and die before anyone can help them. Don't risk your pet's health; please leave them at home while you run errands.

Code Enforcement

The City of Antioch recently adopted new regulations governing sidewalk vendors throughout the City. These regulations establish rules for both roaming and stationary sidewalk vendors that include separation from intersections and driveways, a maximum display area for stationary vendors, requirements for health permits, and other similar issues. Sidewalk vendors will be notified of the new regulations and be given an opportunity to apply for City approval. The basis of these regulations is recent State legislation.

On June 5, 2019, the Planning Commission considered and recommended City Council approval of an application for a cannabis dispensary with delivery to be located at 2101 West 10th Street. If approved by the City Council, "Delta Dispensary" will offer cannabis products as well as consumption accessories. The City Council will consider the Planning Commission recommendation and this application at its June 25, 2019 meeting.

On June 19, 2015, the Planning Commission will consider another cannabis dispensary at 2625 Crow Court. This business would also offer cannabis sales and delivery. The Planning Commission will make a recommendation to be heard by the City Council at a future meeting.



Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter Registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Counter with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving a state prison sentence in county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.



You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

Median Landscape Improvements

Contracted crews finished installing the new plants andirrigation in the medians on Somersville



Road between Buchanan Road and Delta Fair Boulevard. Next up will be Auto Center Boulevard; we will keep you posted on our progress and locations and post photos as they become available. Caltrans is continuing to work on landscaping the interchanges and medians at Highway 4 and Somersville Road/ Auto Center Drive. One of City Council's priorities is clean up and beautify our City. Expect to see more of this type of activity around Antioch during this summer. Thank you for your patience, and please keep an eye out for the cone zone.



More Park Improvements Happening in Antioch! The parking lot at Williamson Ranch Park received a new overlay surface, and fresh striping and the trail resurfacing

project at Hillcrest Park is progressing on schedule. Hillcrest Park is a great place to kick start your exercise program with those new pathways just waiting for us to get out and breath in some fresh air. Sewer Repairs

Public Works Sewer Crews repaired a 6-inch sewer main at Brookdale Circle and 18 # 13th Street this week. If you see this crew working in the field, please respect the construction zone by keeping clear of the safety cones and barricades and understand that there is loud, heavy construction equipment in use, this is for everyone's safety.



Road improvements: Lone Tree Way

The final micro surfacing application on Lone Tree Way will continue through next week.To minimize impacts to the public, crews will work through the night on Lone Tree Way (8:00 p.m. – 6:00 a.m.). The work may have to move to daytime hours if the contractor is not able to meet the City standards in the dark hours. Day or night, the roads will remain open with some lane closures; only minor traffic delays are expected during construction. We expect to stripe the roadway two weeks after the entire micro surface is applied projected to be at the end of June (weather permitting). We will keep you posted on the project here and on the Public Works Facebook page.
