

## City Manager



#### **Public Manager's Association**

I attended the Public Manager's Association meeting, where legislation making its way through the State legislature as well as the proposed CCTA sales tax measure were discussed. I will be a part of a subcommittee of City Managers that will be providing recommendations to the CCTA Board related to the proposed March 2020 sales tax measure.



## contra costa transportation authority

## **Contra Costa Transportation Authority**

Along with Council Member Wilson, who serves as Ex-Officio for Public Transit Bus Operators, I attended the CCTA (Contra Costa Transportation Authority) Special Meeting. The Initial Draft Transportation Expenditure Plan (TEP) was discussed as it relates to a proposed new ½ cent sales tax measure that would be on the March 2020 ballot. This measure would be a follow-up to Measure X, which failed to obtain voter approval in 2016. This \$3B Countywide transportation measure would be in addition to the current ½ cent sales tax passed by voters for Measure J.

#### Homeless Encampment Task Force

I attended the Homeless Encampment Task Force Series 2 of 4 meetings. Lead by Mayor Pro Tem Motts and Council Member Thorpe; the discussion focused on ideas and solutions for the problems the homeless of Antioch are encountering. Six break-out groups discussed and listed possible solutions and presented them to the group. The purpose of the subcommittee is to gather information and provide recommendations for steps moving forward to the City Council in August. Date of next meeting to be determined.

## Community Development

#### Planning

On June 5, 2019, the Planning Commission considered and recommended City Council approval of an application for a cannabis dispensary with delivery to be located at 2101 West 10th Street. If approved by the City Council, "Delta Dispensary" will offer cannabis products as well as consumption accessories. The City Council will consider the Planning Commission recommendation and this application at its June 25, 2019 meeting.

On June 19, 2015, the Planning Commission will consider another cannabis dispensary at 2625 Crow Court. This business would also offer cannabis sales and delivery. The Planning Commission will make a recommendation to be heard by the City Council at a future meeting.





#### **New Policies**

On Tuesday, June 11, the City Council approved changes to the Municipal Code and adopted new policies establishing regulations for wireless telecommunications facilities. The new policies create application procedures and establish aesthetic standards for wireless communications facilities on private and public property, which should streamline the approval process for future applications.




## City Clerk

#### Get informed, get involved and VOTE.

Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter Registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Counter with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving a state prison sentence in county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.



You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.



#### **Police Crime Prevention Commission**

The City is seeking applicants for one 4-year term on the Police Crime Prevention Commission and three 4-year terms on the Economic Development Commission. #### **Median Landscape Improvements**

Contracted crews finished installing the new plants and irrigation in the medians on Auto Center Boulevard. Next up is Delta Fair Boulevard. Teams are also prepping the medians on Lone Tree Way between E. Tregallas Road and Putnam Street. Caltrans continues working on landscaping the Highway 4 interchanges and medians.

## Economic Development

#### **Regional Chamber Mixer**

On Thursday, June 13th Economic Development Program Manager Ms. Zepeda attended the regional chamber mixer in Antioch at the newly renovated 2nd floor of Sutter Health, Sutter East Bay Medical Foundation located at 4053 Lone Tree Way Blue Rock Center. This medical office expansion included over 13,000 square feet (13,740) of medical tenant improvements, construction budget of 3.5 million dollars with a 5 ½ month construction period, large patient concourse, exam rooms, that created a collaborative space. Boulder Associates, an architect firm, was tasked to design the space with lean operational flow and improved patient experience. Many chamber representatives from the region were on hand and tours were provided. This project successfully expands Sutter's role as a health anchor supporting a rapidly developing community in the Antioch area.





Business & Economic Development Committee The Economic Development Director recently presented information on the City's Economic Development goals and rebranding efforts to the Business & Economic Development Committee of the Workforce Development Board. The main objective of this committee is to meet the workforce needs of high-demand sectors of local and regional economies. The presentation was well received, and staff looks forward to building the partnership with this committee.
