PD- ANIMAL SERVICES

It is getting hot, hot, hot!

As we head into summer, it is important for pet owners to make sure that the furry members of their family are ready to beat the summer heat.

Walks: The ground will heat up and stay hot, so do not walk your dog on the hot pavement. Remember, if you touch the pavement with your hand and it feels hot to the touch, it is too hot to walk your dog. Make plans to walk your dog early in the morning, before the sun heats the sidewalk, or wait until after dark so the pavement has time to cool.

Car Rides: Leave your pets at home! Unless you are specifically taking your pet somewhere, like the veterinarian, there is no reason to risk leaving them in a hot car, even if it is just for a second. Temperatures rise very quickly in cars when the weather gets hot. If you see an animal in a vehicle that appears to be in distress, i.e., panting excessively, digging at windows/doors, lethargic, or passed out in a car, please call Animal Services or the Police Department immediately.

Hydration: Offer extra water to your pets on hot days, add ice to their water bowls, and be sure to refill water bowls often. Create frozen treats to entertain them and help them stay cool. Misting systems and kiddie pools may offer some additional options for the outside pets, and shaded areas are a must for outdoor pets.

For really hot days, if you have a pet that you normally keep outside, consider bringing them indoors during the hottest part of the day so they can cool off. If you suspect your pet is suffering from overheating, please seek immediate veterinary care. Do NOT dip a hot animal in cold water - this might send their body into shock. Instead, offer cool water for them to drink, and apply cool water compress to their neck, chest, and under their armpits and place them in front of a fan.

Planning

On Tuesday, June 22, 2021, the City Council will consider the Radix Growth project. The applicant is proposing to operate a cannabis facility at 3625 East 18th Street in an existing +/- 95,420 square foot commercial building that was previously a K-Mart store. The cannabis facility will consist of indoor cultivation, distribution, non-volatile manufacturing and a retail dispensary with delivery. The proposed cultivation operation will take place completely indoors and consist of 87 flower rooms that will occupy 47,715 square feet of floor space. However, the cultivation will be a two-tier grow and therefore the total cannabis cultivation area will be 95,340 square feet.

The manufacturing operation will be conducted under a **type 6** manufacturing license which allows for non-volatile manufacturing. Non-volatile manufacturing uses a mechanical extraction method or non-volatile solvents, such as carbon dioxide, ethanol, water, or cooking oils, to extract cannabis oils. The **distribution operation** will operate under a type 11 distribution license. A licensed distributor is responsible for: transporting cannabis goods, arranging for the testing of cannabis products, conducting **quality assurance** reviews of cannabis goods to ensure that they comply with all of the packaging and **labeling requirements**, and transporting cannabis goods between licensees.

The Planning Commission voted to **recommend the City Council** approve the project with the condition that the project return to the Planning Commission for **additional design review** approval.

Deer Valley Estates Project

On Wednesday, June 16, the Planning Commission considered the Deer Valley Estates project, which consists of 121 new single-family homes on 37.56 acres just north of Kaiser Medical Center on Deer Valley Road. The Planning Commission initially considered the project on May 19, where it was continued to resolve outstanding concerns with the developer applicant.

On June 16, the application was again continued so that staff and the applicant could address multiple **concerns expressed** by the community and the Planning Commission. A new date has not been set for this project to be reconsidered as staff works to provide the requested information. Asphalt Concrete Pavement Plug and Leveling Course Project Update – P.W. 392-31

Please note a change in the Asphalt Concrete Pavement Plug and Leveling Course Project. The 2021 Asphalt Concrete Pavement Plug and Leveling Course project is currently under construction. Work will begin during nighttime (also) on June 27th and June 28th at Hillcrest Avenue and Deer Valley Road.

Teichert Construction will continue working on that portion of the project during the day, from June 23rd through June 25th. These streets are being prepared for a Cape Seal surface treatment that will be **installed in 2022**.


The group had a discussion on how city and county governments can **better** understand the needs of food manufacturers.
