Luckily, we were able to ensure their safety by contacting our friends at West Coast Ferret Rescue, who happily took in this delightful busyness of ferrets, and transported them to "legal" territory in Nevada, where they can find new forever homes. (Fun fact: A group of ferrets is called a 'busyness.')

Although ferrets are not legal to own in California, they are afforded the same opportunity for rescue as any other animal when abandoned. Please reach out to Antioch Animal Services if you have, or find, a ferret in need. Abandoning them is not an option.

#### Planning

On June 19 the Planning Commission recommended that the City Council approve a use permit for Alluvium cannabis dispensary located 2625 Crow Ct. The Planning Commission also received public comments on the Notice of Preparation (NOP) to prepare an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for The Ranch project. The project is an approximately 1,177 unit residential and commercial project located in the southeastern portion of Antioch across Deer Valley Rd. from Kaiser Hospital.

#### Get informed, get involved and VOTE.

Register to vote online or update your current registration. Voter Registration forms are also available at the City Clerk's Counter with free postage.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen,
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day,
- Not in prison, on parole, serving a state prison sentence in county jail, or serving sentence for a felony, and
- Not found to be mentally incompetent by a court of law.



You need to update your voter registration if you:

- Move to a new residence,
- Change your name, or
- Want to change your political party affiliation.

Water Main Break The Water Distribution **Emergency Response** Team responded to a water main break at 10:00 p.m. on Sunday.



The main break occurred on W. 4th Street at L Street. The break is attributed to the age of the infrastructure. Responding crew's first task is to secure the perimeter of the break to protect the public at this busy intersection. Next, they begin excavation to isolate the broken main line and determine the extent of the repairs.

#### Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors Meeting

On Tuesday, June 18th Economic Development Program Manager Zepeda attended the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors meeting in Martinez. The board considered accepting a report on recent Northern Waterfront Economic Development Initiative activities. The goal is to adopt a resolution approving a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the

Office for Northern Waterfront Economic Development Initiative marketing taglines.

Cities of Antioch, Brentwood, Concord, Hercules, Martinez, Oakley, and Pittsburg to collaboratively evaluate economic development projects, and to submit trademark applications to the United States Patent and Trademark

County staff presented an update to the Board of Supervisors on recent activities including the May 10th, Northern Waterfront Economic Development Initiative "Bringing the Jobs to the People" public forum held in Antioch. They also reviewed the draft MOU between the County and cities for future collaborative economic development projects. The Board of Supervisors approved the MOU. The City of Pittsburg approved it on Monday, June 17th, Hercules approved in May, Concord is scheduled to review the week of June 24th and Antioch anticipates the item to be on the City Council August 2019 agenda.
