Mayor and Members of City Council

This is the City Manager's Report for the week ending July 13, 2018

City Manager

Along with our new Economic Development
Director Kwame Reed, I attended the Chamber of
Commerce Government Affairs meeting where Richland
Communities explained their proposed initiative to allow
limited development in the Sand Creek Focus Area west of
Deer Valley Road while preserving much of the natural
state of that area. It was explained that the initiative is in
response to an initiative backed by Save Mount Diablo
also striving to be on the ballot in November. The City
Council will be considering certification of signatures and
action to be taken regarding the Richland and Save Mount
Diablo initiatives at their July 24th meeting.



With Mayor Pro Tem Thorpe, I attended the Mayor's Conference in Pittsburg. Joe Greaves, Executive Director of the Alameda-Contra Costa Medical Association and Rebecca Rosen, Regional Vice-President, Hospital Council of Northern and Central California made a presentation focused on the changing health care delivery system and challenges with funding and measuring improvement to services provided.

I attended the Public Manager's Association Meeting where two presentations were made by the Leadership Academy workgroups. One was related to Animal Services in the County and how it compares with other models in the region. Interestingly Antioch, who has the only city operated shelter in the County, takes in 3 times more animals per capita than the County does and at a lower cost per animal. The other presentation was on how to best prepare for a coordinated emergency response, especially in light of the Santa Rosa wildfires and takeaways from that disaster which is still impacting this community and the neighboring region.

Police



Traffic Enforcement


On Tuesday, July 3rd, APD's Traffic Unit conducted a multi-agency operation with Pittsburg PD, Brentwood PD, and Oakley PD. In the morning, the joint-traffic detail started in the neighboring City of Pittsburg where 95 citations were issued for moving violations. The afternoon was spent in Antioch where traffic officers wrote an additional 40 citations for speeding along the Lone Tree Way corridor in the area of James Donlon Blvd.

4th of July Holiday

Beginning on Friday, June 29th APD staffed extra officers to patrol the city in preparation for the upcoming 4th of July Holiday. These extra patrols focused on continuously circulating throughout residential neighborhoods and parks while responding to complaints associated with the possession and illegal use of fireworks. The officers also used historical data to guide their response toward the most active areas for fireworks complaints. During their patrols, the officers interrupted several "citizens behaving badly." Citizens caught using fireworks were issued citations, and their fireworks were confiscated. Officers took advantage of each opportunity to educate community members about the dangers involved with using fireworks while passing along safety tips for an enjoyable holiday. The nightly "fireworks" patrols extended through the Holiday and ended on Saturday, July 7th. During the Holiday week, APD received 393 complaints associated with fireworks, and officers cited 17 violators. Numerous fireworks were confiscated and will be sent for destruction. Many of the fireworks were extremely dangerous and highly flammable.



Dr. Mills and RVT Taft are now working to perfect their processes, and expect to begin more involved surgeries, like spay surgeries on large dogs, very soon. We are excited to be able to bring these veterinary services "in-house," as the benefit to the community, and our shelter animals are priceless. This week, representatives from Humana spoke to members about Medicare coverage, benefits and provided information on health plans.



CDBG

On Thursday evening, Antioch hosted the East County meeting on Fair Housing at the Antioch Council Chambers, with over 35 people in attendance. The purpose of the meeting was to gain public input on fair housing access, discrimination, and access to a variety of opportunities such as good schools, employment, a healthy environment, and transportation. The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status, national origin, and prevents discrimination. This meeting is part of a study to see how all of Contra Costa County is doing to improve integrated living patterns and reduce differences in access to opportunity experienced by residents. The study will result in a planning document called the Assessment of Fair Housing, which is required by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) every five years for all cities and Housing Authorities receiving federal funds such as the Community Development Block Grant.

Code Enforcement

Code Enforcement officers attended a one-day training session on substandard conditions and enforcement as it relates to the California Fire Code. This training contained information about common fire hazards present in a variety of construction types and provided enforcement tactics for substandard properties and illegal businesses with legitimate fire and life safety hazards.

Collection Systems - Close Circuit Television Crew (CCTV)

The Collection Systems Inspection crew completes approximately 25% of sewer mainline video inspections of our sewer system each year. The CCTV crew as we call it utilizes two highly trained staff members and a small tractor mounted camera to identify, locate and assess the condition of the City's sewer and storm infrastructure.


CCTV condition assessment provides the critical information needed to assess the service life, physical condition, and functionalityof our 310 miles of wastewater and 282 miles of stormwater collection systems. During the field inspection, pipe defects are classified using a standard coding system, and pipe condition are assessed using



a systematic method to produce consistent, useful information. The data collected is reviewed by the Collection Systems management team and is used to assist in the scheduling of preventative and routine maintenance, to make decisions about pipe rehabilitation, pipe replacement, estimate our pipe's remaining useful life and its long-term performance capabilities.

We are working in our hot spot areas this week off of Delta Fair Blvd. and Somersville Rd. Hot spots are areas within the City's collection system that are designated areas of known problems.


Our Facility Maintenance team is doing their part cleaning and refinishing the benches at Waldie Plaza for the City's Concerts by the River that begins this Saturday.

A General Municipal Election will be held in the City of Antioch on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, for the following officers:

Two (2) Councilmembers – Term of two (2) years for each office(Ordinance 2141-C-S)

A nominee must be a registered voter residing within the City of Antioch. Nomination petitions may be obtained from the City Clerk, City Hall, 200 "H" Street, Antioch, CA, commencing on July 16, 2018, the 113th day before the election and shall be filed with the City Clerk in person no later than 5:00 P.M., August 10, 2018, the 88th day before the election. Candidates may submit a candidate statement 250 words in length and will be responsible for the expense. Statements must be submitted in block form; standard upper and lower case words. If an incumbent fails to file for reelection by 5:00 p.m. Friday, August 12, 2016, the filing period will be extended to 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, August 17, 2016, for non-incumbents.

The City Clerk shall submit a certificate of facts to the City Council (1) if no one or only one candidate files for any office which is elected on a citywide basis, or (2) if no one or only one candidate files for any office which is elected from or by a city legislative district, or (3) if the number of persons filing for offices elected at large does not exceed the number of seats to be filled. The City Council shall adopt one of the courses of action outlined in Section 10229, Elections Code of the State of California.

The regular business hours for the City Clerk's Office are 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Candidates are strongly encouraged to make an appointment with the City Clerk's Office for obtaining and filing nomination papers by calling (925) 779-7008 or emailing Cityclerk@ci.antioch.ca.us. Please refer to the Fair Political Practices Commission website link for important information: www.fppc.ca.gov or call (866) 275-3772.

Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Campaign Finance Reports for open candidate, officeholder and local Political Action Committees are required to file their semi-annual Form 460 or Form 470 Campaign Finance Report to the City Clerk's Office no later than July 31, 2018. Electronic copies are not accepted. Candidate campaign finance reports are available for the public to review at the City Clerk's Office.

City Council Meetings are held every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month in the Council Chambers beginning at 7:00 p.m. The first Council Meeting in July is canceled due to Summer Break.

The next regularly scheduled Council Meeting will be on July 24, 2018 beginning at 7:00 p.m. City Council Agendas, including Staff Reports, are posted onto our City's Website 72 hours before each Council Meeting. 
