COME SPLASH WITH US! The Antioch Water Park has plenty of summer left for kids and families, including Toddler Tuesdays! This week, Water Park staff held a mid-season "All Lifeguard In-Service" training. This training gave everyone the opportunity to check in with each other and train as one big work family team.



This week, 18 participants began a 3-week course in **Acrylic Painting for 6-12 year olds** taught by veteran artist and instructor Nancy Roberts. Participants are taught color mixing, brushwork and design with an emphasis on creative expression and personal style. Students created beautiful original paintings using artist-grade acrylic paint. Art classes for kids are especially important now that so many schools have reduced art offerings in their curriculum.

On Monday, the Antioch Council of Teens held their summer meeting to say good-bye to graduates and begin planning next year's activities. ACT will begin by volunteering at "Stand Down on the Delta" next month. Meetings are the first Monday of the month. Encourage teens to participate.



On Tuesday, more than 70 school-age children participated in "Adventures in Fun and Fitness," the drop-in mobile recreation camp. Adventures in Fun and Fitness invites all Antioch kids to join. On Tuesday, over 30 seniors participated in the new Tai Chi program, which is a partnership with *Flowing Motion*. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Code Enforcement. MEASURE C ABATEMENT TEAM UPDATE -- The Code Enforcement Abatement Team, which is supported by Measure C funds, consists of two full-time employees who are responsible for responding to requests and proactively patrolling the City to abate conditions that create safety hazards and contribute to blight such as:

- Illegally dumped junk/rubbish on sidewalks, streets, parks, and other public places
- Abandoned shopping carts
- Graffiti

During fiscal year 16-17, the Abatement Team abated 4,236 yards of debris from city property (a pickup truck bed holds approximately 3 yards!), removed 2,078 shopping carts, and cleaned up graffiti at 190 locations.

The Abatement Team also assists Code Enforcement officers with homeless encampment abatement activities including junk/rubbish removal, shopping cart abatement and collection and storage of valuables.

Building Division. Building Permits were issued for the Autozone at 4036 Lone Tree Way. The Autozone will remodel and occupy the building most recently containing Delta Fresh Foods. In addition, a Building Permit application was received for the new Best Buy electronics store at 5839 Lone Tree Way in the old Sports Authority building. As always, it is great news to see these vacant spaces with new tenants!

Planning Division. Next Wednesday, July 19, 2017, the Planning Commission will consider amendments to the Land Use Element of the General Plan affecting the Sand Creek Focus Area in the far southern part of Antioch. The Planning Commission will be asked to make a recommendation to the City Council, which will make a final decision at a future date. More information is available at: www.antiochplanning.com.

PUBLIC WORKS

Capital Improvements Division. A-S Pipelines, Inc. is completing the final facility repairs associated with the Downtown Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation project. The next step is the installation of the cured-in-place pipe-liner within many of the existing sewer mains within the downtown area. This is expected to commence in the next couple of weeks. Interruptions to individual sewer connections may be necessary when this rehabilitation is performed adjacent to a property. The contractor will notify residents and businesses prior to any planned interruptions. Traffic patterns and street parking will be affected during this work. For the safety our residents and the workers, please adhere to all construction signage.

On July 11th, bids for the 2017-2018 Curb, Gutter and Sidewalk Repair program were publicly opened. The apparent low bid was received by Anchor Concrete in the amount of \$258,900.00. The project bids are being reviewed by Staff with the award of

the construction contract scheduled to be considered at the July 25th City Council meeting.

The City is currently soliciting bids for the Community Development Block Grant Downtown Roadway Pavement Rehabilitation, Phase 7 project. POLICE DEPARTMENT

This week the Antioch Police Department is excited to announce that we have had a "Shift Change" and transitioned from 12-hour work shifts to 10-hour work shifts for patrol officers. We are only able to make this transition due to increased staffing levels. This change will have a positive effect on the officers' quality of life, as they will have more family time, it will ease fatigue and they will see an increase in training. In addition, this change will eliminate an estimated \$400,000.00 in overtime annually! This will be accomplished by eliminating a 4-hour mandatory overtime shift per officer each week, and incorporating mandatory training into the officers regular work week, instead of attending on overtime. All officers will now work on Wednesdays, which allows us to train in house more often and more efficiently. We are hoping this change will benefit the officers as well as the City.

Meet your Beat! Anita Soares started her career with the Antioch Police Department in January 2005. Since starting her dispatching career, Anita has become a dispatch trainer and tactical dispatcher. Anita enjoys spending time with her family, two dogs, and camping.

Being a public safety dispatcher is an extremely difficult, but rewarding job. The Antioch Police Department would like to

Animal Services. In the wake of July 4th, Antioch Animal Services has been inundated with quite a few new faces that must have gotten spooked by all the random fireworks throughout the city. We have offered a free adoption event, reduced fees for a week, and waived impound fees in the days after the 4th, all in an effort to reduce our shelter population. Now, this Saturday on July 15th, VIP will be at the shelter offering low cost Rabies vaccines and microchips.
