The Antioch Animal Shelter, located at 300 L Street, is open from 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday and from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. on Friday.

Kids and families splashed their way across the pool last Friday during the Box Boat Derby at the Water Park! Nearly two dozen boats were




#### **Planning**

Due to construction at City Hall, the Planning Commission meeting of July 17, 2019, will be held at the **Antioch Community Center located at 4703 Lone Tree Way** adjacent to the Antioch Water Park. The Antioch Planning Commission will



consider an application for a Use Permit, Variance, and Design Review for the demolition and reconstruction of the Jack in the Box restaurant located at 2505 A Street. In addition, the Planning Commission will consider a request to change the name of Angelina Rose Place to Tre Vista Place. The meeting begins at 6:30 and a complete agenda is available here.





#### **Code Enforcement**

The Code Enforcement Division of the Community Development Department enforces the City's municipal codes throughout Antioch. When a violation is reported or observed, a Code Enforcement Officer makes contact with the alleged offender and educates them about the violation. This contact is followed by a specific timeline to correct the violation. If the violation is not corrected within the specified timeline, a citation may be issued. If a violation occurs repeatedly on a property, the offending property owner may be subject to repeat citations without advanced warning. 

Our sewer cleaning crew is currently working on W 10th Street jet rodding (cleaning) the sewer main lines. This is an



essential aspect of what we do here in Collections for the City of Antioch. These procedures reduce the inconveniences and environmental effects of a sanitary sewer spill to members of our community. This will also reduce FOG (Fats, Oils, and Grease) related issues in the City's sewer system.

If you see our cleaning truck parked in the middle of the street, know that we are working diligently to keep sewer flowing beneath your feet. Also, if you experience a sewer problem, remember to call us first to see if we can help you.

What's Happening in Antioch!



Black Diamond Mines Closed Until September 10 for Installation of New Coal Mining Exhibit

Oakland, CA – The Hazel-Atlas Mine and Greathouse Visitor Center will be closed until September 10 while a new exhibit is installed. No mine tours will be available during the construction period. Sidney Flat Visitor Center, located at park headquarters, will be open on weekends during the summer from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The new Black Diamond Coal Mine exhibit, built into the existing Hazel-Atlas silica sand mine, will be an immersive experience taking visitors into a recreated 1870s coal mine, part of California's largest coal mining operation. All of the original coal mines at the preserve have been closed to the public and permanently sealed for public safety. Visitors to the new exhibit will experience the sights and sounds of a working coal mine from nearly 150 years ago when immigrant miners worked deep in the earth to supply California with the energy needed to power and transform the state's economy from rural to industrial. The new exhibit is scheduled to open to the public in the spring.
