UPRR Meeting

Community Development Director Ebbs and Code Enforcement Manager Michael and I met with representatives of Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) to discuss challenges we've had getting them to keep their property that runs through the center of town clear of homeless encampments, trash, rubbish and illegal dumping. UPRR has agreed to pursue regular patrolling and clean up of their property. This would be an arrangement similar to what Mr. Michael has been able to work out with BNSF Railroad and Chevron who both have similar properties and issues. I sent a letter to their Chairman of the Board, President and CEO summarizing the meeting and our expectation UPRR will do a much better job maintaining their property through Antioch.



Contra Costa Economic Partnership Meeting

lattended a Contra Costa Economic Partnership Meeting where the proposed CCTA sales tax measure slated for the March 2020 ballot for a transportation project was presented and discussed. This measure would be the next version of Measure X which failed to gain the required 2/3 voter approval in 2016. The final decision on whether to place this measure on the ballot will be made in late August.

Voters from East County who were polled on the measure indicated local return to source funds for roadway improvements and shorter commute times were priorities. The 1/2 cent tax would be in addition to the 1/2 cent Measure J sales tax which was approved in 2008 and continues through 2034.

Building

The Building Inspection Services Division is working very hard these days and recently issued 225 permits in 12 days! These permits range from new single-



family homes to commercial tenant improvements to kitchen remodels and everything in between. As this Division works hard to meet these demands, we ask that permit holders do their part by honoring their inspection times and having everything ready for the inspection. Ask your inspector what you can do to ensure that each inspection is as productive as possible.

Code Enforcement

As mindful stewards of the City's resources, the Code Enforcement Division is always looking for ways to capitalize on rebate and redemption programs to offset the cost of their work. Currently, the Division participates along with the Antioch Police Department in the Abandoned Vehicle Abatement Program (AVAP), which recently resulted in a refund of \$45,363 from Contra Costa County and the State of California. In addition, the Division participates in a mattress redemption program, which allows for a refund of \$15 per mattress. For information on recycling your mattress, please go to



Landscape Improvement

Contracted crews are continuing with the new plantings and irrigation in the medians. This week crews finished plantings and irrigation in the median on Lone Tree Way at W Tregallas Road and Worrell Road; we will complete the concrete in the future. Work continues on the L Street medians with crews making their way southward. We also have annual landscape maintenance through contracted crews working on landscaping in medians and rights of way (sides of major roads) in the following areas:

- Laurel Road Rights of Way
- Country Hills Drive Rights of Way
- Wild Horse Road Rights of Way
- · Frederickson Lane Rights of Way
- Hillcrest Avenue Medians

Capital Improvements

Public Works Capital Improvements Division is performing a multi-step project on the roads on 67 streets, including the area boarded by W 10th Street to W 14th Street and G Street to L Street. This work includes placing a leveling course of asphalt concrete in the driving areas of the road. The



area adjacent to the curb will not be filled with asphalt at this time.

These areas are less traveled and do not require asphalt, which is very costly. The entire road will be covered with a micro-surfacing treatment within the next year to cover the street with a smooth, material edge to edge. This phased construction allows us to maximize the areas that are most in need of new asphalt. In addition to the road rehabilitation, curb ramps will be installed in at many of the intersections.



"NO PARKING" signs will be posted 24 hours in advance of the beginning of work to allow for alternative parking arrangements when off-street parking is necessary. Staff and our contractors will always make every effort to accommodate special circumstances.

Food Truck Thursdays


